MEMPHIS CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

RULES OF ORDER

1. The procedure of the Annual Conference shall be governed by the Rules of Order of the preceding General Conference insofar as they apply; otherwise *Robert's Rules of Order, Revised*, shall apply except

a. that those present and voting shall be a quorum for the Annual Conference and its subordinate bodies,

b. where the Book of Discipline provides otherwise and

c. when the final report of CF/A is before the Conference, up to twenty minutes of debate and Christian Conferencing shall be provided before the call of the previous question may be entertained by the chair.

d. the agenda for an Annual Conference may include a consent calendar which may contain the reports of designated conference agencies and any business matter of the conference. A majority vote of the conference delegates present may remove one or more items from the consent agenda for separate consideration by the Annual Conference.

e. through the bishop's leadership and in consultation with the extended cabinet, the sessions and agenda of the annual conference shall reflect the spirit and nature of Wesleyan conferencing and shall reflect alignment with the stated mission of the Memphis Conference. (Mission Statement adopted June 2014). ¶605.2

2. There shall be a Committee on Rules, composed of three lay persons and three clergy persons, to be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations, provided that, in addition, the Conference Chancellor shall serve as Chairperson and the Conference Secretary shall serve as an ex-officio member without vote.

The Committee on Rules shall:

a. receive proposals for new Standing Rules and/or modifications of present rules.

b. propose new Standing Rules and/or modifications in present rules.

c. provide interpretation to the Annual Conference at points where Annual Conference action may be in variance with Standing Rules.

3. The Standing Rules may, by a two-thirds vote, be amended on the next day after an amendment has been presented in writing. The rule fixing the number of districts may be amended by a majority vote, provided that no change in the number of districts may be made later than the morning of the second day of the Annual Conference session.

Organization and Procedure

4. There shall be four districts in the Memphis Conference.

5. The bishop, or the bishop's designee, in consultation with the extended cabinet, will lead a mission strategy team (or operational team) to direct the mission and align the resources of the conference with the mission. The mission strategy team will promote effective strategies with and among districts and

congregations to accomplish the mission. The mission strategy team will monitor and report progress toward accomplishing the mission.

6. The Memphis Annual Conference shall have a conference personnel committee chaired by the bishop, or the bishop's designee, that will be responsible for all conference personnel policies and procedures, unless the UM Book of Disciplines specifies otherwise. Membership of the committee, not including the chair, shall consist of equal number of clergy and laity members. The personnel committee shall be responsible to staff the conference to purse the mission. The personnel committee shall be responsible for conference job descriptions, employment, and supervision.

7. The secretary of the Annual Conference shall be responsible for editing and publishing the Conference Journal and is authorized to contract for its printing, subject to the approval of the Council on Finance and Administration, and to draw upon the Conference Treasurer for this expense.

8. Conference Membership:

a. Lay Members and Reserve Lay Members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually by the Charge Conference. Two additional lay members, one young person between the ages of twelve and seventeen and one young person between the ages of eighteen and thirty years of age, as required by The Discipline, shall be elected by each District Council on Ministries.

b. The membership, clergy and lay, shall be those persons who meet the qualifications for membership of the Annual Conference as set forth in Paragraph 602 of The Book of Discipline, 2012.

c. A charge shall elect an additional lay member for each 500 members or fraction thereof above 1000, provided that a charge shall elect a number of lay members that at least equals the number of clergy members appointed to that charge. The Conference Secretary will determine the churches which qualify under these provisions and notify the District Superintendent in time for election by the Fall Charge Conference.

d. When additional lay members are needed to make an equal balance between lay and clergy membership, the cabinet will assign to each district the number of additional lay members subject to election by the Charge Conference of the church in which that lay person holds membership.

9. Required Reports:

a. The Council on Finance and Administration shall furnish to the Conference Treasurer's office, as early in the year as possible, an official copy of the Conference apportionments for all the churches in the Conference.

b. Each District Superintendent shall furnish to the Council on Finance and Administration, as early in the year as possible, an official copy of the church apportionments for those funds which are apportioned within the district bounds but not Conference-wide. (These funds shall be apportioned by the District Stewards [*Discipline*, Paragraph 615.3] or in whatever manner each district shall determine.)

c. By January 1 of each year, each District Superintendent shall furnish the Conference Statistician an official itemized copy of the pastors' minimum compensation package for that year as set by the Charge Conferences. The total will be delineated by: base salary, travel and professional expenses, utilities and household allowance. An asterisk will indicate that the charge pays the group health insurance premium. A (p) will indicate a parsonage is provided, (h) will indicate a housing allowance and the amount will be noted, and (-) will indicate that no parsonage or housing allowance is provided.

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the custodian of records. The Conference Secretary shall keep a service record of all clergy members and diaconal ministers and shall publish this report in the *Journal*.

11. The Conference shall select from among its members a Conference Historian who shall record a detailed personal history of each clergy member in a suitable book for future reference.

12. Nominations and Resolutions:

a. Nominations:

1) The conference nominating committee, chaired by the bishop or the bishop's designee, shall discover, enlist, and nominate leaders to populate the organizational structure of the conference to advance the conference's stated mission to discover, equip, connect, and send lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world one neighborhood at a time. The conference nominating committee will nominate to the annual conference this body of quadrennial leaders. The conference nominating committee will nominate on an annual basis to fill vacancies or to expand the work of committees, boards, and councils. **§**608.3

2) The Committee shall nominate from time to time the members of the boards, commissions and standing committees of the Annual Conference, unless such nomination is otherwise provided for in the *Discipline*, and shall make such other nominations from time to time that may be required by the Annual Conference. Each Conference board, commission, committee, etc., shall keep a record of attendance at its meetings. This record of attendance will be filed with the Conference Program Ministry Team office and be available to assist this committee to correctly make its nominations.

3) Vacancies in officers and elected members of the Connectional Ministry Team (CMT) may be filled until the next Annual Conference by the Connectional Ministry Team, upon nomination of the CMT Committee on Personnel. Vacancies occurring in other positions, for which the Committee on Nominations would ordinarily make a nomination, may be filled at the direction of the Chairperson of the Committee on Nominations until the next session of the Annual Conference. The Chairperson may exercise the prerogative to poll the Committee on Nominations by means other than a called meeting of the Committee.

4) The Conference Secretary shall nominate persons to serve on the Committee on the Journal Minutes and the Bishop shall nominate the members of the Committee on Courtesy. The members of these committees shall be elected during the organizational session of the Annual Conference.

5) Nominations of trustees for Methodist LeBonheur Healthcare Systems, Inc., and Reelfoot Rural Ministries, Inc., UM Neighborhood Centers, Wesley Foundations, Hannah's Hope and West KY Family Services shall come through the Conference Work Areas/Boards to which they are related and to the Conference Committee on Nominations for presentation to the Annual Conference.

b. Resolutions:

1) There shall be a Conference Committee on Resolutions composed of eight members, four lay persons and four clergy whose responsibility will be to receive, to study and to present such petitions and resolutions to the Annual Conference. This committee is to be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and is to be elected quadrennially.

2) All resolutions shall be submitted to the Committee on Resolutions at least thirty (30) days prior to the first day of the Annual Conference session. The Chair shall present to the Annual Conference, in their original form, all resolutions so submitted. In addition, the Committee may present to the Annual Conference for consideration a revised version of any such resolution.

13. The District Superintendents shall constitute the Committee on Memoirs. A memorial service for deceased members of the Annual Conference and their spouses shall be held during each regular session of the Annual Conference.

14. Moving date for pastors will be set by the Bishop and Cabinet on or before April 1st.

The Ministry

15. Pastors' Report:

a. The pastor of the local church shall complete, each January, the Local Church Report to the Annual Conference for the preceding year. The report will be submitted according to the instructions of the Conference Statistician.

b. The pastor will see that a copy of the annual Local Church Report to the Annual Conference is retained by the local church and saved as a permanent record.

16. Pastors, other than student pastors, who receive salary support from the Conference Commission on Equitable Compensation, are required to reside within the bounds of the charge to which they are appointed and render full time service unless the exception is unanimously approved by the cabinet.

Financial

17. No resolution, report, motion or enabling act which involves a monetary obligation on the Conference shall be passed until it has been submitted to the Council on Finance and Administration and its recommendation has been reported to the Annual Conference. In the first business session of the Annual Conference, the report of CFA shall be presented for information only. As Conference agencies make reports and budgetary requests, the concurrence or non-concurrence of CFA must be stated. If the Conference approves an agency budget request which is at variance with CFA's recommendation, that action shall constitute an automatic amendment to CFA's report. When CFA's report is the "order of the day" for approval as a whole, any previous Conference action amending that report shall be sustained without need for further amendment of the report, though amendment to CFA's report may be permitted.

18. The Conference Treasurer will close the books on such date as the Council on Finance and Administration shall designate but not later than January 5. At the closing of the books, all unobligated funds shall be transferred to the Conference Reserve Fund.

19. Pension responsibility for a probationary or full member who is serving in an appointment beyond the local church, other than one attending school, shall be allocated to the board, institution, or agency which he or she is serving.

20. The Council on Finance and Administration will provide in the Conference budget an amount for conducting Annual Conference.

21. Unless the bishop and cabinet, in consultation with the new church development team, determine that exceptional circumstances exist:

After the payment of any current year apportionments the proceeds from any local church property sales resulting in closure or abandonment and the proceeds from the sale of district or annual conference real property shall be designated as follows:

a. 75% for planting new communities of faith in the Memphis Conference, allocated at the discretion of the new church development team, and

b. 25% for planting new communities of faith or the revitalization of existing churches in the district.

This statement shall be included in resolutions for closures of congregations, unless otherwise restricted by property deeds.

Boards and Commissions

21. All Quadrennial Conference agencies shall meet within 10 days of the Annual Conference at which they are elected to organize and report their officers to the Conference Secretary.

22. The tenure of all elected officers of the Conference and all members of its boards, commissions and committees, except the Conference Historian and members of the Commission on Archives and History, shall be limited to two consecutive quadrenniums, unless otherwise provided in The Discipline. This shall not apply to the Conference Lay Leader's previous service on the Board of Laity.

23. Conference reports and motions:

a. All Conference agencies making reports to be voted upon by the Annual Conference shall complete their reports in time to have them in the Conference Connectional Ministries office in time for distribution to the Conference members. Any such item of business not so submitted must be in the hands of the members of the Conference at least twenty-four hours before consideration or receive a three-quarters vote of the house before consideration.

b. All reports, petitions, motions and resolutions presented to the Annual Conference shall be in the hands of the Conference Secretary in triplicate on forms provided by the secretary.

c. Any motion made from the floor of the Conference for the purpose of initiating or altering a matter for consideration (initial motion, amendment or substitute) which affects the Conference churches must be provided to the chair in writing. Such motion will be read from the chair, and the written version shall be considered the official version for the purposes of voting and for the recorded minutes.

Randy Cooper shared the East Congo Initiative. We are asked to support the construction of a Women's Center right next door to the Bishop's residence in the East Congo. In support of this endeavor, a Nashville Area mission team will go to the East Congo in July of 2017.

Randy and Mitzi Mathenia led the Conference in song.

Laurel White led the Conference in prayer.

Jonathan Jeffords and Autura Easton-Williams presented the report of the Board of Ordained Ministry and recognized the 60th anniversary of the ordination of women. Dr. Jeffords highlighted the effort over the last four years to align our work with the Tennessee Annual Conference. He commended Don Thrasher for his leadership in Residence in Ministry. Joey Reed and Nathan Reed were commended for their efforts in developing a secure website to facilitate the sharing of candidates' work with the Board. Rev. Easton-Williams pointed out that many faithful women over the years lived out their call to ministry in the face of numerous challenges. We are praying and working for that day when these challenges will be no more. We also celebrated the 20th anniversary of the ministry of Deacons in full membership.

The following have been elected into provisional membership in the Memphis Annual Conference.

Bishop McAlilly asked the historic questions of those to be ordained and they were answered satisfactorily.

Dr. Jeffords shared the answer to Question 17 that by God's grace, all clergy are fit and blameless at this time.

Delores Smith presented an update on the Conference United Methodist Women. Mrs. Smith lifted up the establishment of a Legacy Endowment for the UMW.

Charles Gilliland presented an update on the Conference United Methodist Men.

Ray Chandler, chair of the Clergy Wellness Commission, presented the report of the Commission. There is information at the Clergy Wellness table for One Exchange and Health Flex. In order to qualify for the retiree subsidy, a pastor must have served for at least 20 years. The report was adopted in full.

Bethany Huffman, Chair of the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, presented the CFA report. 80.42% of apportionments was collected in 2015 with 310 churches paying 100% of their apportionments. Mrs. Huffman highlighted that in the last four years we have adopted Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). There has been a 13.2% decrease in the Conference budget since 2012. \$8,134,256 is the proposed budget for 2017.

Sky McCracken and David Reed presented a report on the 2016 General Conference in Portland, Oregon. A video was shown presenting the highlights of General Conference. The entire delegation which served in Portland was recognized. Bishop McAlilly offered a few thoughts on the Bishop's Commission which was authorized by the General Conference. The plan, at this point, is the Council of Bishops at their November meeting will appoint this Commission. We still operate under the 2012 Book of Discipline in matters of human sexuality.

Johnny Jeffords moved, and it was seconded, that "the 2016 Session of the Memphis Annual Conference nominate Rev. Sky McCracken as an Episcopal candidate for the 2016 Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference." MOTION CARRIED.

Sky McCracken presented the Cabinet resolutions regarding charge line changes. RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED.

Tim Carpenter presented the resolution calling for the dissolution of the Holy Community Church. RESOLUTION ADOPTED.

CONFERENCE BOARD OF ORDAINED MINISTRY

The Lord is with you. And also with you.

Bishop McAlilly, sisters and brothers of the Conference and guests, good afternoon.

On behalf of the Board of Ordained Ministry, I'm honored to stand with my partner in ministry and Vice-Chair of the Board, Rev'd Autura Eason-Williams, as we offer our report to the annual conference. This quadrennium draws to a close, and I bring before you several highlights speaking to where we are and where our work needs still to go:

1. Four years ago, at our bishop's leading, we began intentional partnering with our Tennessee Conference counterparts to align our work. I thank my friend, Rev'd Bryan Brooks, Chair of the Tennessee Conference Board of Ordained Ministry, for his collegiality and effort to facilitate alignment that functions faithfully for our mutual Kingdom work. The result has been a deepening appreciation for each other, efficiency in our processes, and a more uniform baseline of preparation of local pastors, deacons and elders allowing the Area cabinet better understanding of the readiness of those they are charged to deploy across both conferences. While there are several examples I could lift up, the Area Residency in Ministry is chief among the fruit our work has born to date. We owe a special thanks to Rev'd Dr. Don Thrasher, who as chief architect of our RIM this quadrennium concludes his work at the close of this session of annual conference. His heart, passion and care have made this new venture meaningful and projects us forward to a new era of leadership under the direction of Rev'd Renée Dillard.

To be sure, this work of alignment continues, and in the new quadrennium we will focus on uniform standards for dCOMS as well as the ways we work with and prepare those who serve as local pastors.

2. Thanks to the development of a secured website, our board members no longer carry reams of paper and DVDs that may or may not work as they examine the material of the candidates. All written and video work resides on this site for examination. Thanks to Rev'd Joey Reed and Nathan Reed for their continued maintenance and coaching of our members for how best to utilize this tool.

3. Our Evaluation Conference at Lakeshore has evolved to what we believe is a more welcoming atmosphere in a context that is by its nature very stressful. We adopted Tennessee's interview format of a team called a POD, some 12 or so, to meet with the candidate for the totality of their interview across the entire spectrum of topics being examined. This provides more personal contact with the candidate from more people. We also encourage candidates to bring an advocate with them to sit in the interview alongside. While they have no voice in the interview process, their presence and counsel outside the interview itself offers encouragement to the candidate. We are pleased with these changes to our process.

4. And finally, we launched in earnest the Nashville Area Office of Ministerial Concerns. Once all transitions are complete, all questions of process and examination of local pastors and candidates will flow through the OMC. We are grateful to Rev'd Tommy Ward and Meredith Day for their good spirit and adaptive capacity to coach us in best practices during the transition. Our conference has labored so long with this work in a particular way, our learning curve in how best to hand it to a

central office is a challenge. Efforts to facilitate the transition of material and candidates will hasten in coming weeks.

I now hand off to Autura for her section of our report which contains the observance of a milestone in our life together as The United Methodist Church.

This year marks 60 years of ordination in full connection for women. Many courageous women lived out their call to ministry through faithful service to the Methodist Church in spite of discrimination. We all stand on the shoulders of their love of God and neighbor as we continue to move the church toward equity in appointment, such that there will not be a church in the denomination that says, "We don't want a woman", but rather every church shall say "We are ready for the one God is calling, regardless of gender, race or disability."

I now invite every woman who has been ordained in the last 60 years to stand or if you can't stand wave your hand. We thank you for your faithful and courageous service.

Let us pray. Gracious and loving God thank you for using women who have yet heard your call to ordained ministry and followed it when it wasn't popular, or cute, or deemed meet and right so to do! We thank you for the cloud of witnesses who paved the way for this milestone as they served as licensed preachers under John Wesley, as early as 1870. Use all of us as pioneers, lay and clergy, who form a United Methodist Church that more fully bears witness to the Kingdom of God. Amen.

This year also represents a milestone in the Church in that it is the 20th anniversary of the United Methodist Deacon in full membership. The General Board of Higher Education and Ministry has prepared a brief video to celebrate this moment.

The Deacons of our Conference lead us in numerous ways. We are blessed by their presence, leadership, and spirit, and are continually challenged by their call to bridge the Church with the world. Would all of our Deacons, those in the process of being a Deacon, and those discerning a call to be one please stand.

Let us pray: O God, we give you thanks for the Deacons in our midst. We thank you for the witness they make, for the call to ministry of word, service, compassion, and justice they live out. We thank you God for Deacons who exemplify Christian discipleship, the nurturing of others in their relationship to God, and they ways they lead the church to respond to the needs of the most needy, neglected, and marginalized of the world. Keep us ever mindful of the diagonal stole they wear through which we see the servant towel of Jesus as he washed his disciples' feet. Bless them. Bless those ministered to by them. Bless the fruit of their work, and in all things may it be honor and glory of your name. In Christ and through Christ we pray. Amen.

BOARD OF PENSIONS

Rev. Dr. Scott Alford, Chairperson

Part A

The Board of Pensions continues its ministry of serving the clergy and clergy families of the Memphis Conference, and we are grateful for the chance to share together in this work. That appreciation extends to the opportunity to work alongside Larry Davis, our Conference Treasurer, and Clare Wilson, our Assistant Treasurer. The staff of the Tennessee Conference has also proven to be helpful to our work, especially in terms of some of the day to day operations.

Last year, it was reported that the Board of Pensions appointed a task force to examine the reserve accounts held at the General Board of Pension and Health Benefits (GBPHB) and the Nashville Area Foundation. That task force completed its work and determined that these accounts, as reported in previous annual conference reports, may only be used for pension purposes. Additionally, the task force suggested to the Board that an investment sub-committee be named. That committee has begun its work of establishing policies to monitor and evaluate the performance of our accounts and to discern adequate reserve levels in order to be faithful stewards of the resources with which we've been entrusted.

We are pleased that the funding status for all pension plans are funded in full and believe that both the General Board and the Foundation are working to maintain positive returns for us. That said, we want to remind all churches of the importance of paying their proportional apportionment payments in order to help secure the future health of the pension programs.

Understanding the need for everyone to begin planning for their retirement early, we decided to scholarship clergy, ages 25-39, to the Rev It Up event sponsored by the GBPHB in November. In that same light, we encourage all clergy to anticipate retirement and to continue saving for it. The GBPHB has instituted a Roth IRA option this year as another way to save. Eligible clergy will find that option on the United Methodist Personal Investment Plan contribution election form. Incidentally, if there are eligible clergy not enrolled in UMPIP, we wish to remind them that the General Board will make a 1% matching contribution into your Clergy Retirement Security Plan if they make at least a 1% contribution into their UMPIP account.

Part B

Allowances to Retirees

With regard to allowances for the benefit of retired ministers, the Conference Board of Pensions recommends the following:

That ministers retired prior to opening session of a regular annual conference shall receive an allowance at the rate of up to \$75.00 per day effective June 3, 2012 for each day in attendance at the conference. Reimbursement shall be authorized by the Board of Pensions upon receipt of a voucher showing the actual expense incurred. This benefit shall be available also to surviving spouses, subject to the same conditions.

That upon retirement, full-time active ministers in regular appointment will receive a one-time retirement stipend in the amount of \$1,500 effective January 1, 2011.

That upon retirement, part-time active ministers in regular appointment will receive a one-time retirement stipend proportional to their appointment percentage at retirement in the amount of \$1,125 (75%), \$750 (50%), and \$375 (25%) effective July 1, 2014.

Those full-time, active members in regular appointment may receive the retirement one-time stipend at the time of taking disability leave in lieu of receiving it at the time of retirement.

Part C Incapacity Leave

In accordance with ¶357.1 of <u>The Book of Discipline</u>, 2012, the Conference Board of Pensions recommends the following conference members to be approved for disability benefits: Harold Q. Evans, Sr. John Jeffery Irwin Patricia King

Esther Gant (Medical Leave effective 03/01/2010, Ineligible for CPP benefits)* Joe Beal

*Only pastors granted Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP) incapacity leave by the General Board of Pension and Health Benefits qualify for Conference Board of Pension Incapacity Leave Benefits in the Memphis Conference.

Part D

Resolutions Relating to Rental/Housing Allowances for Retired, Disabled, or Former Clergypersons of The Memphis Conference

(Revision effective January 1, 2014)

The Memphis Conference (the "Conference") adopts the following resolutions relating to rental/housing allowances for active, retired, terminated, or disabled clergypersons of the Conference: WHEREAS, the religious denomination known as The United Methodist Church (the "Church"), of which this Conference is a part, has in the past functioned and continues to function through ministers of the gospel (within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code section 107) who were or are duly ordained, commissioned, or licensed ministers of the Church ("Clergypersons");

WHEREAS, the practice of the Church and of this Conference was and is to provide active Clergypersons with a parsonage or a rental/housing allowance as part of their gross compensation;

WHEREAS, pensions or other amounts paid to active, retired, terminated, and disabled Clergypersons are considered to be deferred compensation and are paid to active, retired, terminated, and disabled Clergypersons in consideration of previous active service; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized the Conference (or its predecessors) as an appropriate organization to designate a rental/housing allowance for Clergypersons who are or were members of this Conference and are eligible to receive such deferred compensation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT an amount equal to 100% of the pension, severance, or disability payments received from plans authorized under The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church (the "Discipline"), which includes all such payments from the General Board of Pension and Health Benefits ("GBOPHB"), during the period January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, by each active, retired, terminated, or disabled Clergyperson who is or was a member of the Conference, or its predecessors, be and hereby is designated as a rental/housing allowance for each such Clergyperson; and

THAT the pension, severance, or disability payments to which this rental/housing allowance designation applies will be any pension, severance, or disability payments from plans, annuities, or funds authorized under the Discipline, including such payments from the GBOPHB and from a commercial annuity company that provides an annuity arising from benefits accrued under a GBOPHB plan, annuity, or fund authorized under the Discipline, that result from any service a Clergyperson rendered to this Conference or that an active, a retired, a terminated, or a disabled Clergyperson of this Conference rendered to any local church, annual conference of the Church, general agency of the Church, other institution of the Church, former denomination that is now a part of the Church, or any other employer that employed the Clergyperson to perform services related to the ministry of the Church, or its predecessors, and that elected to make contributions to, or accrue a benefit under, such a plan, annuity, or fund for such an active, a retired, a terminated, or a disabled Clergyperson's pension, severance, or disability plan benefit as part of his or her gross compensation.

NOTE: The rental/housing allowance that may be excluded from a Clergyperson's gross income in any year for federal (and, in most cases, state) income tax purposes is limited under Internal Revenue Code section 107(2), and regulations thereunder, to the least of: (a) the amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the Clergyperson's employer or other appropriate body of the Church (such as this Conference in the foregoing resolutions) for such year; (b) the amount actually expended by the Clergyperson to rent or provide a home in such year; or (c) the fair rental value of the home, including furnishings and appurtenances (such as a garage), plus the cost of utilities in such year. Each

clergyperson or former clergyperson is urged to consult with his or her own tax advisor to determine what deferred compensation is eligible to be claimed as a housing allowance exclusion.

Part E Current Program/Budget Projection/Funding Request

The Memphis Conference Board of Pensions 2017 budget request will be included in the Conference Finance and Administration Report.

Part F Memphis Annual Conference Funding Plan for Supplement One to the Ministerial Pension Plan

The 2017 Past Service Rate (PSR) is \$599, which represents a 2% cost of living adjustment. The General Board of Pension and Health Benefits' actuarial valuation of the plan for the Memphis Conference shows more assets than benefit obligations. The estimated funding for our Pre-82 plan, as of January 1, 2015, is as follows...

Plan Assets \$24,897,420 Plan Liability (\$16,699,749) Funding Surplus \$8,197,671

The above valuation shows assets equal to 149% of the actuarially projected plan liability. We anticipate no additional deposits into this account in the near future. The General Board of Pension and Health Benefits adjusted their mortality tables, which will reduce the funding status some. However, the plan will still show assets in excess of the liability projections.

Part G

Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP) Participation for Deacons

Effective January 1, 2007 most deacons were enrolled in the same plan as their other clergy colleagues. Under CRSP, the annual conference becomes the plan sponsor for deacons appointed to a local church, charge, conference or entity for which the conference is responsible (EM1). The conference treasurer's office will be responsible for submitting the pension plan contributions for these deacons to the General Board of Pensions.

Effective January 1, 2016, the local church, charge, conference or entity for which the conference is responsible (EM1) will no longer be responsible for submitting these contributions to the conference treasurer's office on a monthly basis.

Deacons and other clergy in most extension ministries, however, will need their employers to sponsor another plan in order to receive pension benefits.

Part H

The Clergy Retirement Security Plan (CRSP) is for full time clergy under Episcopal appointment within the bounds of The Memphis Conference. The United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) is for all clergy, including those serving less than full time, under Episcopal appointment within the bounds of The Memphis Conference.

Effective January 1, 2014, the Memphis Conference has elected to cover only clergy serving full time under the Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP). The Memphis Conference will contribute to the United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) on behalf of clergy who are no longer covered under CRSP to lessen the impact on their retirement savings.

Clergy who are serving three-quarter, half-time or one-quarter time will receive a contribution in the amount of 12% of cabinet total plan compensation to their UMPIP accounts.

CLERGY WELLNESS COMMISSION

L. Ray Chandler, Jr., Chairperson

The mission and ministry of our Clergy Wellness Commission has been to provide the best possible health care to all of our participants while being faithful stewards of the finances it takes to fund the program. We have been funded through two sources: the premium billing receipts where the churches are billed for 100% of the premium and are expected pay 80% of those premiums from church budget and collect the 20% balance by withholding from the clergy salary on a pretax basis. The second source of income is the approved CWC budget paid through apportionments which CFA and the Annual Conference approves. We also have limited reserve funds to help with higher than projected claims, unfunded apportionment receipts, and to offset premium increases to help the local churches and clergy.

Thanks to our conference staff of Larry, Clare and Helen; our consultant Jim Horobetz; Cigna; Methodist Healthcare; and the commission we have work constantly to keep our program thriving, competitive, and faithful. This has not been a business for us. It has been a ministry of doing all we can to get you well, keep you well, and to take care of you when you are not well.

Retiree Health Insurance Subsidy

With that said, this year the Clergy Wellness Commission was presented with a number of challenges to be able to provide the best possible health care at the best possible price for the health of our participants, the local churches and our Memphis Conference. Throughout the connection, conferences have had to address the continued funding challenges of retiree health insurance. Our conference currently has an unfunded post-retirement health insurance liability of \$27,793,354 which is the cost of providing medical coverage subsidy for all of our current and future retirees for life. In order to keep the promises made to our retirees and to maintain sustainable budgets into the future of our conference we had to formulate a plan to reduce the current liability and begin saving to provide for future funding of the retiree health subsidy.

The commission voted to propose that beginning January 1, 2017 we give the retirees (and spouses on their plan) a defined contribution of \$250 per month (\$3000 annually) through a Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) and allow them to participate in Medicare Supplement program called One Exchange. The One Exchange Program is available through The United Methodist General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits, though it is operated by Towers-Watson.

Retirees/Spouses may use their HRA accounts to pay premiums or help with deductibles or copays. In order to qualify for the retiree subsidy must have served a **<u>minimum of 20 years</u>** at a local church in the Memphis Conference.

If you are a present retiree or you are becoming a retiree at this 2016 Annual Conference and if you and/or your spouse are under 65 years of age, you will remain under the active plan and receive \$350 per month (\$4200 annually) instead of the \$250 per month to apply to the cost of the active plan until you and/or your spouse reach 65 at which time the subsidy will be reduced to the standard subsidy of \$250 per month. All retirees/spouses retiring at the 2017 Annual Conference and later will receive \$250 per month (\$3000 annually) regardless of age. We are making a oneyear exception since this is a transition year. With this change regarding our retirees we feel that this will significantly cut down both the conference's unfunded liability as well as significantly cut the conference budget.

The Clergy Wellness Commission recognizes the increasing funding challenge that the Memphis Conference is facing and as a result of that challenge, we recommend that the Retiree Subsidy program

be terminated for future retirees. In order to allow future retirees to adequate time to plan for retiree medical expenses the CWC has set the cut-off age at 60. Everyone who is 60 or older as of 7/1/16 with 20 years of service as defined above would remain eligible for the retiree medical subsidy. The current mandatory retirement age is set at 72 by the GBOPHB (this would give clergy who are 60 or over up to 12 years to retire with subsidy and would allow others to plan accordingly).

The rationale behind the request as we have often discussed is the post-retirement medical liability. The GBOPHB is requiring the conference to begin to report how they are going to fund those anticipated benefits so it is imperative that we take steps to lower the liability as much as possible without impacting current retirees.

Active Health Insurance

When the commission voted to propose the exchange program for the retirees the attention immediately shifted to the status of the actives and those actives that have spouses'/family members on our present plan. This is where a serious dilemma began to take shape. With the retirees and all their dependents removed from our self-insured program the burden of funding the plan now rested among the remaining participants. The change was going to result in at least a 36% increase. Other conferences have reacted to the large increases in insurance premiums by moving from their self-insured programs to fully insured plans or for several, they decided to opt out of offering insurance at all in favor of sending their participants to the open market (with a defined contribution). We felt that we needed to explore several options to compare to our present self-insured plan. We explored several options ranging from sending the actives to the open market, joining with the Tennessee Conference Health Plan, United Healthcare plan through the General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits-Health Flex, and remaining with our present self-insured plan through Cigna. Our first concern was what the change would do to our tremendous discount with Methodist Healthcare hospital facilities.

Thanks to Gary Shorb, Michael Ugwueke, and Harry Durbin we were able to secure the generous discount we have been receiving regardless of whatever plan we decided to adopt. With that huge concern addressed we spent countless hours breaking down each plan piece by piece keeping in mind your physical and financial health, the financial health of our local churches, and the financial health of our conference.

We are proposing to the 2016 Memphis Annual Conference session that we end our self-insured program with Cigna and move to The General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits' (GBOPHB) Health Flex Plan with United Healthcare beginning January 1, 2017. Though there are a number of plans offered under Health Flex/United Healthcare for this first year we are offering a choice of two plans for the active clergy to choose from. One plan is the B1000 Gold plan which is a PPO plan similar to our current offering and the other is a High Deductible Plan (HDHP) H1500, the main difference is the choice between having lower premiums and high deductibles or paying a little more premium for lower upfront cost. The HDHP allows the participant an opportunity to set up a Health Savings Account which can provide significant tax and retirement benefits.

Dental and vision coverage will also transition to Health Flex, these coverages will be optional and Conference staff/DS will no longer receive free dental insurance but will be billed same as other clergy. With the change in insurance offerings, the optional UNUM life insurance which covered only those on the current health insurance will be discontinued.

Health Flex (GBOPHB plan) does require a mandatory participation for all clergy appointed 100% to local churches and conference entities (DS, campus ministries, new church, etc.). Part-time clergy (3/4 and below) are no longer eligible for conference health insurance. Mandatory requirement simply means that all appointed clergy will be included and their church will receive a premium bill unless the clergy chooses to opt out of the coverage. The individual clergy can opt-out for one of the following

reasons:

- a. Coverage from a previous employer
- b. Covered by spouse's plan
- c. Covered under Tricare
- d. Covered by Medicaid

e. Insurance is deemed unaffordable under ACA rules (if the annual cost of the single rate (\$167 per month) exceeds 9.5% of the AGI the coverage is deemed unaffordable). Our insurance is affordable for those making minimum compor more.

The costs of the premiums will be billed to the local church. Churches are billed for 100% of the premium and are expected pay 80% of those premiums from church budget and collect the 20% balance by withholding from the clergy salary on a pretax basis. The commission also approved setting a due date for payments and a 2% late fee, insurance will be canceled after 90 days of nonpayment. (Obviously there would be much discussion before we cancelled a clergy's insurance because of church nonpayment)

Clergy Wellness Commission will continue to pay 100% of premiums for those who are on CPP approved disability.

The Memphis Conference Clergy Wellness Commission feels secure that we have followed our mission and ministry goal. We know that this is a monumental change for all of us but we make a promise to you that we will do all we can to help you during this time of transition. The General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits is committed in making this transition as easy as possible for everyone. On behalf of all of us who have ever been a part of our self-insured program it has been our joy to have served God, the Memphis Conference, and you all these many years. Though we are anxious about the change as you are we are excited about the next chapter in taking care of you and your health.

New Church & Missional Church Support

Under current rules new churches and missional churches medical insurance premiums are paid at the following level:

The Clergy Wellness Commission recommends the following premium schedule for new church and missional churches. The rationale is that new church pastor's salaries are generally on par with other pastors and should be treated same as other pastors:

EQUITABLE COMPENSATION COMMISSION

Dr. Deborah B. Smith, Chair

The purpose of the Equitable Compensation Commission is to support full-time clergy serving as pastors in the charges of the annual conference by: (a) recommending conference standards for pastoral support; (b) administering funds to be used in base compensation supplementation, and (c) providing counsel and advisory material on pastoral support to district superintendents and committees on pastor-parish relations; and (d) submitting an arrearage policy to be adopted by the annual conference. This purpose is consistent with the provisions of ¶625 of <u>The Book of Discipline, 2012</u>.

Given these primary foci of the Equitable Compensation Commission, the use of apportioned dollars assist the Equitable Compensation Commission in achieving its purpose by having funds available to address and support issues of equitable compensation as related to full- time clergy serving as pastors in the Memphis Conference. Funds are disbursed to each pastor to provide sufficient compensation, in addition to supplemental aid/income, to insure that the minimum base salary be met for all eligible clergy. In short, the apportioned dollars assist the Commission in addressing issues of equity and fairness without penalty to the pastor or pastora charge. These actions directly link the basic concepts of the mission statement, "...to discover, equip, connect and send lay and clergy leaders...." to the approved and adopted practices of the Equitable Compensation Commission. Specifically, clergy are financially equipped to eliminate any related pressure that might distract from the primary focus of offering Christ to a hurting world.

An integral part of this process **encourages and supports young people** and their dreams and visions of being in service for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ **as they strive to engage the mission field** that surrounds their respective charges and neighboring community. This kind of engagement, which will be undergirded through continuous prayer and discernment, will serve as the catalyst for **transforming lay and clergy leaders**. With all these elements being a critical part of what we believe, clergy who are supported through equitable compensation would serve as living proof of what God's grace looks like when there is respect for each individual's dignity and self-worth. The **outcome could very well be fruitful and faithful churches**. And, with this, we will be the recipients of pastoral, missional, and congregational excellence.

- 1) Types of Equitable Compensation Support
- a) Minimum Compensation Support
- The Commission annually proposes to the Annual Conference a schedule of minimum compensation for ministers in the various categories of Conference relationship. In approving this schedule, the Conference guarantees each of its itinerant ministers a certain minimum compensation. Unless a minister voluntarily waives this right, s/he is entitled to an appointment where the compensation, including increments, will be at least the minimum of his/her category.
- b) Minimum Compensation Levels for 2017 (using the minimum compensation requirements for Comprehensive Protection Program as defined by the GBOPHB standards)
 \$42,422 Full Conference Members and Probationary members with seminary degree
 \$41,137 Associate Members
 \$40,066 Full-time Local Pastors

c) Years of Service Program In order to provide further incentives for pastors receiving Equitable Compensation support, the Commission will provide an increment for past years of full-time service within The United Methodist Church. (Years of service shall be the same as pension service credit. See pastoral records for approved years of service.) Beginning after 5 years of service, the pastor will receive \$100 for each year of service; those having served 5 years will receive \$500; 6 years \$600; 7 years \$700; and so on.

- 2) Eligibility for Equitable Compensation Program
- a) Only those appointed to a pastoral charge within the Memphis Annual Conference and meeting the requirements of *The Discipline* shall be eligible for compensation support.

- b) A claimant must complete in full and submit proper application forms as required by the Commission.
- c) A claimant must live within the bounds of the pastoral charge to which he/she is appointed if no parsonage is provided, or in the parsonage (if provided). Clergy couples shall be an exception.
- d) If a housing allowance is given in lieu of a parsonage, it should not be regarded as income. Twenty- five percent of the basic Equitable Minimum for each charge without a parsonage will be allowed for housing.
- e)
- 3) How Applications are Submitted:
- a) All applications shall be submitted on forms provided by the Commission, signed by the applicant and the District Superintendent.
- b) Signed applications should be submitted to the chairperson of the Equitable Compensation Commission on or before the fifteenth day of December of each year or the fifteenth day of May for the conference year.
- c) Applications shall not be taken at any other time unless approved by the Bishop, Cabinet, and the Chairperson of the Commission.
- d) District Superintendents shall furnish the Commission with requested data for determining eligibility for equitable compensation support.
- 4) Payment to Claimants
- Each month, the Treasurer of the Memphis Annual Conference shall make payments to the Charge/Church Treasurer, upon request from the Commission on Equitable Compensation.

5) Financial Reports

At each session of the Annual Conference, financial statements shall be filed as follows:

- a) Basic Compensation Program payments (including bonuses) made to the various charges of the Conference.
- b) Supplemental Compensation Aid payments made to the various charges.
- c) Grants from the Emergency Fund (to be shown by districts).
- d) Administrative expenses of the Commission on Equitable Compensation.
- 6) Recommendations to the Memphis Annual Conference
 - Charges receiving support from the Equitable Compensation Commission are encouraged to take steps regularly toward becoming self-supporting and toward the increasing of the total level of support of their ministers. The following actions should encourage these steps:
- a) The District Superintendent will annually review each application for equitable compensation with the appropriate Charge Conference.
- b) If after four consecutive years of receiving equitable compensation support, the church or charge shows little or no interest in becoming self-supporting, it is recommended that the Cabinet look at the possibility of filling that appointment with a less than full-time person.
- c) Exceptions to the phasing-out of support must be approved after careful annual review by the Bishop and Cabinet, and must involve clear missional reasons for maintaining the United Methodist witness in the parish of such a charge.
- d) The Commission encourages each church or charge in setting their minister's compensation to consider an annual cost of living increase, in addition to any appropriate merit increase.
- e) It is expected that any church or charge that receives equitable compensation support shall pay their Connectional Ministerial Support apportionment in full.
- f) The Commission encourages the Bishop and District Superintendents to be creative in the appointive process; however, it is recommended that no church or charge be allowed to become a station appointment unless that church or charge has the potential to become self-supporting within four years during which time Equitable Compensation will be decreased by one-fourth each year.

7) Emergency Fund.

This is administered by the Chairperson of the Commission, upon recommendation of the Bishop and the Cabinet, for the purpose of meeting emergency needs arising among the pastoral members of the Conference. The Secretary of the Cabinet is to notify the Chairperson of the Commission by letter to requisition funds.

8) Funding Program

Based on the projected program for **2017**, we request funding from the Annual Conference in the amount of **\$100,000**, reflecting no increase or decrease from the previous year.

COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION <u>POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS</u> <u>FOR Fiscal Year 2017</u>

- I. The Council on Finance and Administration concurs with the Connectional Ministries Team regarding conference and general church special day observances. We also concur with the special day designated offerings.
- II. We recommend that only under emergency conditions, as determined by the CFA in consultation with the bishop and the cabinet, shall funds be borrowed from an outside lender for current expenses. The maximum such borrowing shall be \$250,000 (two hundred fifty thousand dollars).
- III. The CFA recommends that it be authorized to act on requests for funds in those situations in which budgeted funds, as approved by the conference, are inadequate to meet emerging missional needs or unforeseen circumstances. Those requests which are approved shall be funded from the Conference Reserve Fund, and the amounts of the funding shall be reported to the conference (2012 Discipline p.612.7). Such inter-fund borrowing shall be reported to CFA monthly.
- IV. We advise all agencies that the conference treasurer will be instructed to issue funds only up to the amount of the projected income for each fund for the year, except for Group Insurance, which is designated as a priority item and is to be paid in full. Salary items shall be paid at full budgeted amounts, but the amounts remaining in the budgets after salaries are funded will be expended only up to the projected percentage of apportioned amounts that will be collected. Each group is responsible for proper allocation of its funds for the year, and no funds will be issued when the projected income ceiling has been reached, without prior approval of the Council on Finance and Administration.
- V. We recommend approval of the Reserve Fund report of the Council on Finance and Administration. We further recommend acceptance of the audit report from the conference's certified public accountant for 2015, and that the audit for 2016 be submitted no later than May 31, 2017.
- VI. We recommend that all conference-authorized travel be reimbursed as follows:

VIII. All who are requesting funds of the conference for 2017 are asked to have their requests, in writing, to the conference treasurer by March 1, 2016. We request full disclosure of the expenditures of the groups for 2015, and budget projections for the expenditures for 2017 funds.

IX. We request that each district, through its district superintendent, submit to the CFA by its fall meeting, a copy of the budgets for those funds that are apportioned and administered within the bounds of the district. An audit of the funds handled during the year 2015 is requested by the fall 2016 meeting of the CFA. We recommend following, as far as applicable: the outline of the General Council on Finance & Administration's Local Church Audit Form or, if performed by a certified public accountant, to the Standards of Review of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

- X. We would remind all conference entities of the provision in the 2012 Discipline, paragraph 614.5.a, which disallows special conference-wide funds appeals without prior approval of the Annual Conference upon CFA's recommendation.
- XI. All items added to the conference budget at the annual conference session will become a part of the year's budget under consideration, and will not be taken from the Conference Reserve Fund.
- XII. The Director of the Conference Connectional Ministries Team and/or the Annual Conference Treasurer or their assigns shall serve as an ex-officio member of all special study committees authorized by the annual conference session.
- XIII. The Conference Treasurer shall execute the policies established by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, and in consultation with the Conference Investment Coordinating Committee, with regard to the investment of funds and the regulation of cash flow.
 - a. All funds shall be invested following the Guidelines of the General Council on Finance and Administration wherever they may be relevant or applicable.
 - b. The objectives for the investment of conference funds shall include:(1) The preservation of the principal value of the investment
 - (2) The investment should provide a reasonable rate of return
 - (3) The investment should be invested, so far as is practical, with those agencies whose management policies are consistent with the Social Creed of the United Methodist Church.
 - c. The Treasurer shall report annually to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration the location and amounts of invested funds, and the earnings gained.
 - XIV. Moving expenses for those hired or appointed as district superintendents, CMT staff members, campus ministers, or CFA staff members will be paid by the conference. These payments will not include amounts for storage, packing materials or labor to pack.
 - a. Local churches may not reimburse a minister's professional expenses more than two months ahead of the prorated budget amount at any given time.
 - b. Expenses from January 1 to June 30 in any given year may not exceed 1/2 of the total annual budget amount for reimbursable expenses.

BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS

I. a. We recommend an apportionment not to exceed \$1,406,414 for the Clergy Wellness Commission for 2017. We recommend that these funds be established as a priority item, and the conference treasurer be authorized to borrow whatever funds are necessary to pay the premiums during 2017.

II. We recommend that the 2017 salary of each district superintendent, the program ministries director, and the conference treasurer be \$76,000. We recommend that travel expenses for these positions be reported monthly by voucher for reimbursement. The Superintendent's housing allowance shall be \$20,000 plus \$10,000 for utility and household allowance.

III. We recommend that the budget as presented in the "CFA Recommendation" column on the budget summary page of this document be approved, and that the fiscal year be designated as 1/1/2017 through 12/31/2017.

APPORTIONMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

- I. We recommend that there be 20 apportioned funds, corresponding to the Arabic numbers appearing on the Budget Summary page.
- II. We recommend that all designated budget items be apportioned to the local churches at 101% of the approved amounts using a percentage computed from the 2014 statistics as follows: Grand Total expenditures for all purposes (column 60), less payments on indebtedness (column 58), buildings and improvements (column 59), and all amounts paid toward apportioned funds (column 35b). For those churches that paid their apportionments in full during 2014, an additional reduction for advance special gifts (columns 37, 38 and 39), and United Methodist charitable causes (column 43) will be made.
- III. We remind all pastors that the 2012 Discipline (par. 340.2(c)(2)(f) requires that all finances of the local church are to be reported to the conference.

OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

- I. We recommend that Bishop McAlilly create a task force that brings together representatives from pension, insurance, apportionments and related reserves for the purpose of examining the total financial picture, obligation and best practices in these critical areas.
- II. We recommend that William L. Davis, Jr. (Larry) be named the Treasurer for the Memphis Conference of the United Methodist Church.

In recent months we have sought to improve our outreach to women in need of our services and through this process have redesigned our website to make it more user friendly for those using tablets and mobile phones as they search for pregnancy counseling and adoption services. During the past year we have been called to "stand in the gap" with some of the tiniest babies, to see that they receive proper and necessary medical care and match them with a forever family who can meet all of their needs. Our staff spent months in the NICU, caring for and advocating for tiny babies who had no other voice. When we sought the "right" family for a set of triplets, God brought forth an unlikely, yet perfect mommy and daddy as well as older brother and sisters and fabulous grandparents who have embraced them, fallen in love with them and worked tirelessly to help them grow and make progress toward developmental milestones. We've watched a 26-week preemie, who weighed less than 2 pounds at birth and spent weeks dependent on a ventilator, grow to a 25 pound, 16 month old who is thriving and delighting his forever family. God's healing touch was upon each of these babies and time and again we were amazed to see the power of God working beyond human limits in the lives of these precious little boys.

We are so thankful for the individuals, UMW Circles, Sunday school classes, and congregations who support the ministry of Hannah's Hope. It is only with this support that we are able to work with our crisis pregnancy clients, meeting them in their moment of greatest need and be with them on their journey, sharing the love of Christ with each one of them.

HINTON RURAL LIFE CENTER

Dr. Jacqueline Gottlieb, President/CEO

Inspired by Jesus Christ, Hinton Rural Life Center's purpose is to engage individuals, congregations, and communities in transformation through retreat ministry and mission outreach. Located on Lake Chatuge in the mountains of southwestern North Carolina, Hinton Center is a sacred place. For over 55 years, as a mission agency of the Southeastern Jurisdiction, Hinton has provided opportunities for intentional faith development while sharing love for Christ with others through fellowship and service. Each year, we host individuals and groups for spiritual retreats, group gathering, and service opportunities, and we partner with small and rural congregations and other organizations to serve as a catalyst within the community, encouraging creative missional outreach and sparking new life.

Together in 2015, we were able to: Accommodate over 21,000 overnight stays with a capacity of 200 at any one time, which is a 25.4% increase from 2014—Host 1368 volunteers who worked on campus, in our garden, and in our community to help those in need—Partner in mission outreach with 68 different churches—Distribute over 100 loads of firewood to families, who could not otherwise afford to heat their home—Repair 52 homes, making them warmer, drier, and safer—Harvest fresh vegetables from our garden for guests and donate excess vegetables to Clay County Food Pantry, Matt's Ministry, UMAR, and other community meal programs— Lead 11 small and rural church consultations—Serve as a placement site for one Duke Divinity School ministerial intern—Engage in 81 worship services with mission volunteers to reflect upon their service in this rural, Appalachian community—Provide hospitality to an international group, who is fostering Christianity in the Middle East—Increase Hinton's presence throughout the Southeastern Jurisdiction with increased web presence moving from 6,000 website hits in 2010, 60,909 website hits in 2014, and 83,769 hits in 2015—Increase connections through social media from 358 Facebook friends in 2012 to 1,494 in 2015—Host a Veteran's Weekend, honoring Veterans and their spouses—Raise \$600,000 to support and further develop our ministries.

In 2016, we will continue to collaborate with local churches and other organizations in a tri-county consortium addressing issues of poverty in our area. We will expand our current mission outreach, engaging college students in service learning opportunities, and will continue to strengthen our financial position so that we can nurture others through retreat opportunities and missional outreach.

REELFOOT RURAL MINISTRIES, Inc.

Rev. Robert Craig, Executive Director

The RRM mission statement defines how this ministry seeks to live out the command of Jesus Christ to, "Love our neighbor." The mission statement is: "In Christian love, we seek to provide personal encouragement, material assistance, helpful training and spiritual guidance to children, the elderly, and low-income families in rural Northwest Tennessee and Southwest Kentucky, in a matter that enhances self-esteem and encourages selfsupport."

The work of Reelfoot Rural Ministries is succinctly defined in this brief statement; *"Restoring Hope, One Relationship at a Time."* This is how the staff and volunteers at RRM seek to offer Christ to a hurting world. While our "neighborhood" focus area is Northwest Tennessee (MS River District) and Southwest Kentucky (specifically Fulton County), our primary focus is to love our neighbor one relationship at a time.

In the past year Reelfoot Rural Ministries has expanded services that are offered and broadened the criteria for assistance. RRM began offering limited financial assistance for clients in extreme distress. Additionally, a ministry relationship with Lake County Schools was established. Minimum income qualifications have been increased for clients of all RRM services to include more families that fall in the category of "the working poor." Finally, RRM and the Mississippi River District are seeking opportunities to partner in offering ministry services in a broader service area to include the new territorial lines of the MS River District.

RRM performs ministry in all four of the Memphis Conference's areas of focus.

Investing in Young People and Engaging in the Mission Field: We seek to engage our mission field daily through the 14 ministries in which we are involved. These ministries include: Tenne Butler Day Care, School Supplies, Christmas Toy Store, Lake County Imagination Library Sponsorship, Senior Center for meals and activities, Food Distribution Center, Emergency Services, Dental and Oral Hygiene Clinic, Vision Clinic, Special Needs Home, Work Camp Ministry/Home repairs, Lake County Backpack Buddies, Emergency Financial assistance, and the RRM Thrift Store.

We offer loving Christian care and education to over two dozen children on a daily basis through the Tenne Butler Day Care Center in Tiptonville, Tennessee. This ministry provides love, education, encouragement, and three meals per day for children. The parents are assured that the children receive quality care by the threestar rating provided by the state of Tennessee, but the children's personal growth and health are even better evidence of the quality of care. The families we serve are from several stages of life, including single parents in school or just starting employment, two parent households, and grandparents raising grandchildren. All walks of life can receive childcare, but preference is given to the working poor in the service area.

The Food Bank, School Supplies, Backpack Buddies, and the annual Toy Store ministries have children specifically in mind. We seek to aid all households that qualify through the Food Bank program, but try to supplement the food boxes with child specific nutritional items as we have them available. The Backpack Buddies ministry is a new program with a specific focus on young people. At risk students in the Lake County School System receive meals, snacks, and drinks every weekend and during school breaks. Additionally, students from Lake County High School receive dental and personal hygiene items as needed. The School Supplies and Toy Store ministries aid families with children of all ages during these times of need.

Creatingandtransforminglayandclergyleadersalongwithgrowingfruitfulandfaithfulchurchesareboth areas of focus that are enhanced through the multiple volunteer opportunities at Reelfoot Rural Ministries. When individuals and groups come to RRM to volunteer, whether for a few hours, for a few days, or for a weeklong work camp, they are changed by the work of the Holy Spirit. This experience allows the individual, groups, or churches to grow more closely in relationship with God, one another, and with the people they are serving. This causes transformation that strengthens personal relationships with Christ, thereby strengthening the local church in relationship with one another for ministry opportunities in that church's own neighborhood.

United Methodist Neighborhood Centers

The United Methodist Neighborhood Centers has strongly emerged from severe crisis in 2014 and 2015 to continue our mission. Our heritage goes all the way back to the Wesley House in 1907, with the needs of young children always being our number one priority. Today, under the superb leadership of Program Director Iletha Washington, our Miriam Child Development Center serves up to 85 children with another 20 Pre-Kindergarten youngsters in a Shelby County Schools Classroom.

Our primary site at 3000 Walnut Grove Road also houses one of the largest emergency food pantries in the city, helping over 20,000 persons per year. We also provide community meeting space and have a new Youth Program caked the Junior Leadership Team. We will have Summer jobs for Youth, and these young people will also work with one of our artistic community partners to create a mural.

At the Smith Center, in North Memphis, a great Recovery Ministry called Jacob's Well is led by Rev. Jamey Lee. Rev. Jerome Scales, Jr. and a team are also making plans for a fresh initiative in the community.

We have many people in the community to thank, especially our generous donors of the "UMNC Rebirth" initiative, our Superintendents Dr. Cynthia Davis and Tim Carpenter, Ms. Donna Spencer, who has served as our Financial Officer, our dedicated Board of Directors, and the Key Women! We would also like to thank the Memphis Conference in helping us to be a real beacon of hope among "the least, last, and lost".

The challenges at Murray State and UT Martin have brought together the full Board for the Division to begin the conversations about the mission, future, and direction of the Wesley Foundations. As we move forward in our conversations, you will be hearing more from the Division.

Other positive happenings are occurring at University of Memphis where we are experiencing a new opportunity for ministry and at Bethel University, under the leadership of Rev. Jason Jones and McKenzie United Methodist Church, where they are requesting Conference recognition as a Wesley Ministry. University of Memphis/Lambuth continues to grow under the leadership of Rev. Steven Fonville and the Board of Directors.

Please be in prayer for the discernment of the Division Board and each Wesley Ministry as we move further in the 21st century.

WESTERN KENTUCKY UNITED METHODIST FAMILY SERVICES

The purpose of Western Kentucky United Methodist Family Services (WKUMFS) is to offer services for the care and maintenance, support and education of children, youth and their families needing its services and care, and do all things which may be necessary, proper or pertinent in the operation and conduct of such an institution and agency. The mission of the agency is to provide Christian ministry through prevention, support, education, and rehabilitation for children and families.

The WKUMFS Board of Trustees, made up of both laity and clergy, strives to accomplish the **mission** of the agency by **discovering** those foster children in need and **equipping** foster parents with funds for professional services and extra necessities in order to help the foster children feel loved, accepted, and not any different from other children. NEW CHURCH DEVELOPMENT

The ministry area of New Church Development has fulfilled the mission of the Memphis Conference by discovering, equipping, connecting and sending leaders into communities to offer the love of Jesus Christ to those currently not connected to one of our existing congregations.

We have embodied the values by reaching out to people of different ages, ethnicity and economic levels. Excellence has been our goal and our planters have been faithful in their continued efforts to seek out to those who are hurting.

Our church plants encompass a wide variety of types of faith communities, each in a different context. We have connected each of the planters with coaches that assist them in creating action plans and reviewing the fruitfulness of those plans. When we have struggled to reach our goals, we have tried to have honest conversations about the viability of each plant. In each instance, we have learned new things that we can build on to help future plants be successful.

The planters in the Memphis Conference are a wonderful reflection of the Kingdom as we have women and men ranging in age from 29 to 60 who are Hispanic, Caucasian, Korean, and African American. Included in the group are both ordained clergy and local pastors. We are thankful for support of several local congregations that have partnered with each of these planters in a number of different ways.

There are currently five ministries under the New Church Development umbrella with the potential to add three more by July of 2017. We look forward the new relationships that will be formed with each and every new person that God places in our midst as we extend new ministries across the conference. It has been an honor and privilege to work with this dedicated group of men and women who are passionate about sharing their faith with others and to help people discover a love for Jesus Christ.

COMMUNICATIONS ACTION TEAM

The Communications Action Team used this past year to evaluate and discern our goals as they apply to the Four areas of focus and the key questions to consider. As a team we are comprised of a variety of people throughout the conference that represent several demographics. We determined through our discussions that the Memphis Conference website is the hub of all conference communications and that we should invest in keeping it current, relevant and easy to use. We will continue to monitor and revise its content and ease of use as well as add new features. The weekly eNews is delivered (free) by email each week on Wednesdays. It is the most consistent and reliable vehicle of communications for the Memphis Conference. The eNews is a list of headlines for news, events, and resources that links back to the Memphis Conference website. We continue to search for ways to reach more subscribers and are consistently adding people as the links are shared with others.

While social media is in constant change, the Memphis Conference has a presence on Facebook and Twitter and this year we added Instagram. We have considered other media but have decided that it is better to concentrate on doing these three platforms well, rather than spread out to thin. For those who do not have computer access we have a quarterly printable newspaper, <u>Circuit Writer</u>, that is emailed to all churches. In 2015 we took on a new focus for this paper so that it contains stories about mission, ministry, and transformation. Each church that receives this publication through email is responsible for printing and distributing it however they choose to those who require or prefer a printed paper. Our focus on stories about mission and ministry are consistently picked-up by the United Methodist News Service which is broadcast throughout the world. These stories will typically point back to the original story on the Memphis Conference website.

In September of 2015, Carla Taylor and Lane Gardener Camp, Memphis Conference Director of Communications, attended the Southeast Jurisdictional Communicators Conference in Lake Junaluska where they had opportunities to network and learn about faith-based communications in our area. By interacting with communicators from other local conferences and churches they were able to exchange ideas and strategies for improving our own conference communications. Taylor and Camp together presented a workshop titled, "Don't Do This! Keeping our Sanity as Church Communicators."

The Communications Team continues to monitor and update the software and hardware that is used in the Memphis Conference. A training session was held in August for District and Conference staff that covered all of the technological databases and software used in the Conference. The Memphis Conference continues to work with eleven other conferences to develop Brick River, a database that is available to all Memphis Conference organizations, boards and agencies as well as staff for sharing data, bulk email lists and other information. Bill Lawson has been retained as a consultant for the Conference Technical Communications after his retirement this past year. One of the goals of the Technical Team is for the Conference to transition to Brick River for all database services and bulk email services to replace Constant Contact for news, notices and analytics.

In answering the key questions for our team we want to emphasize the fact that the Communication Action Team's focus is to proclaim the mission of the church to all! While we are a small team it is the responsibility of all United Methodist to share the mission of the church and we hope that we are giving you to tools to do so.

MEMPHIS CONFERNCE DISASTER RESPONSE

The mission of United Methodist Disaster Response is to offer a caring Christian presence to communities that have experience a disaster.

Disaster Response Ministry in the Memphis Conference is vital for a number of reasons. Obviously, it is an important ministry in times of relief and recovery for people affected by disaster. This ministry is also important for the health of the local church. When a church is spiritually and physically prepared to respond to the surrounding community, that church grows stronger and is more effective in sharing the love of Christ to its community.

Several plans are in place to strengthen the Memphis Conference Disaster Response ministry in the coming year. To be effective in response to disasters, there must be a focus on preparation, and that means training. Training for Early Response Team members will take place in each district at least once throughout the year. Plans are also in place to introduce opportunities for local churches and districts to be more involved in disaster awareness and preparedness. Structure is also a part of the plan implementation for the coming year. The disaster response committee's goal is to identify community/county coordinators as well as district coordinators for more immediate response and information gathering in the event of a local disaster.

The ministry of disaster response crosses into all four-focus areas of ministry in the Memphis Conference:

Investing in Young People: Disaster Response offers opportunities for people of all ages to share in this ministry of hope. All ages can be involved in preparation by assembling needed supplies. Additionally, older youth can work alongside adults in cleanup and repair efforts for neighbors affected by disaster. These ministry opportunities help connect young people into the life and mission of the church.

Engaging in the Mission Field: Local congregations and the conference should be present when the community around them has been impacted by disaster. This connects the church with her neighbors, expresses the concern of the church for her community, and illustrates the love of Christ for the world.

Creating and transforming lay and clergy leaders: The submission of one's self in loving service to others causes spiritual maturation. Disaster Response and preparation involves submitting one's time and talents in service to others. This personal submission and the presence of the Holy Spirit can cause growth and transformation in both lay and clergy.

Growing fruitful and faithful churches: When congregations are prepared and trained to respond to the needs of their community, growth takes place. Spiritual growth in the life of the church and an increase in individual commitments to the ministries of the church happen when the community realizes the love of Christ lived out through the local church.

Intentional Discipleship Action Team

The Intentional Discipleship Action Team is completing its eighth year. During those years, it has been actively seeking effective ways to offer resources to the local church to aid in making disciples of Jesus Christ. In the first four years the team worked hard to define a disciple, to help the local church evaluate its effectiveness, and created conversations about faith sharing through workshops and encouraging development of personal God stories. We sponsored worship workshops, sponsored a middle school event, purchased books, and tool kits for every church in the Memphis Conference.

In recent years, we have shifted our focus from resourcing the local church to resourcing leadership development to support the mission and vision of the Memphis Conference. The Generative Leadership Academy has been supported and endorsed by the IDAT, and budget money has helped resource this leadership development focus, with a second GLA project to begin in 2017.

The IDAT membership has been rich through these years. These team members who represent a wide array of focus areas including age level ministries, spiritual formation, men, women and campers, have met faithfully several times a year to prayerfully consider God's direction for the Memphis Conference in the area of discipleship. The impact of this team is hard to measure, but it is safe to say that today we see a concern for making disciples across the conference, and throughout the General Church. It is a joy to be part of revival!

This is my final year serving as the team leader. I have been blessed to work with these team members and the Connectional Ministry Office. I am confident that we leave this team in excellent hands, and eagerly anticipate the continuing intentional work on discipleship for the Memphis Conference. Greater things are yet to come!

MEMPHIS CONFERENCE ARCHIVES 2016

<u>The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church 2012</u> states that the Annual Conference Commission on Archives and History's duties are "to collect, preserve, and make accessible the historically significant records of the annual conference and its agencies ...to maintain a fire-safe historical and archival depository and to see that all items that obviously will have value for future history are properly preserved therein." [P641.1]

In the past year the Conference Archives has added thirteen new Closed Church boxes and twelve old boxes have been sorted, labeled and contents notes added. There have been 71 research questions completed (24 phone, 36 email,11 visits.)

There are several on-line resources now available for researchers. The <u>Memphis Conference</u> <u>Journals</u> can be searched from the Conference website (<u>www.memphis-umc.org</u>) by clicking on <u>Memphis Conference Journals</u> in the upper left corner. If you are looking for an obituary of a minister or wife, check the volume of Memoirs at the top to get the year the obit appears. <u>The Nashville</u> <u>Christian Advocate Abstracts</u> of Memphis Conference related articles are reached by putting that title in your search line. These Abstracts contain all of the genealogical information from the original article, but if you want a reprint, it is available from the Tennessee Conference Archives (Ph:615-263-0518.) Our Archives has a page on the Memphis Conference web site which contains our brochure listing the major collections of materials available to researchers.

We have a large file of digital photographs and now utilize Adobe Photoshop software to improve their quality. We have collected pictures of all of the bishops who have presided over the Memphis Conference except for Bishop McCoy who presided in 1911.

The handwritten preacher autobiographies from the 1906 questionnaire have been transcribed into Word documents. We have computer files for all which include the original handwritten document, the transcription, picture, obituary, wife and her obituary if available and any other written material on the preacher. There are additional computer files for 288 preachers with pictures and obituaries. Many wives and their obits have been added as they are found. These are available to anyone by email.

Another interesting collection we have developed contains autobiographical materials, diaries, books and other personal materials of Memphis Conference ministers. We have James

W. Blackwell's large autobiography, diaries of Samuel Peeples, James Perry, Thomas Jefferson Lowry and Joseph T. C. Collins and assorted personal writings of William Adams, R.V. Taylor, J. M. Kendall and William O'Donnell. There is also a shelf for the living authors among our colleagues.

The Archives is open Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9:30am to 12:30pm. Calling ahead to schedule a visit is advised. Other times can be arranged by appointment. There is no charge for research or copies to churches or ministers. Volunteers are always needed and many tasks are available.

Memphis Conference United Methodist Men

A summary of some of the ministries of Memphis Conference United Methodist Men:

The effort of our conference men's leadership over 2015 has been to continue to refocus thinking about men's participation moving from Men's **Clubs** to a broader more flexible Men's **Ministries** perspective. Over the years the club model has given familiar structure and organizational form to support a variety of activities. More recently, however, we have seen the "club" model fall out of favor across the board.

Business, civic, professional and recreational groups have seen major membership declines. Our church groups are no different and require a new approach.

Everyone knows that there are some gifted leaders, and if you are fortunate to have one who will commit to men's ministries he can breathe life into an existing group. But no one seems to have specific step by step plans that assure building successful men's programming. Certainly no fool proof plan for going back to the good old days exists. But, we can identify some steps that seem to lead to healthier men's ministries.

First is a leader who is willing to devote some time and energy to working with the men of his church to rethink what men's ministry should be about in order to serve the needs of men and that congregation. Men's ministry came into being in an effort to approach matters of faith in ways that recognized the approach that men take to life. That leader must be willing to think in terms of what his men need going forward and not what has been.

Secondly, the most highly successful men's programs operate with the active support of the clergy. Whether it is at the local church, district or conference level, leaders of the most successful programs report that clergy not only support their ministries but are vocal in that support. Without question some leaders enjoy hands on participation from clergy and that is terrific when it is possible. But, when clergy is willing to make it clear that men's ministry is of value, is good for his/her area of responsibility and he/she appreciates men's involvement, men's involvement increases.

Thirdly, all successful groups have some sort of project that goes beyond themselves. It is well documented that men like to do something and not just think about it. Present a group of engaged men a problem and they will immediately think of ways to fix it. Admittedly, talk is cheap. But, if you have chosen capable leadership and have clergy support, you have an excellent opportunity for follow through.

Finally, it is critical to include messages of faith in all your activities. Without recognition of the faith that is the root of the commitment, we are not much different from the civic club meeting down the street. It is important to understand we are men committed to helping other men better know Christ.

This year we have continued building ramps, providing scholarships, staffing sports teams and Sunday School classes. We have raised money for Reelfoot and Lakeshore and provided funds and food for the homeless. Some of our men are involved in hands on ministry with the homeless serving meals and providing a way for them to have some shelter for a period of time. Several churches now support "manna bags", which are lunch bags filled with an assortment of nonperishable food which can be carried in your vehicle and handed to anyone who is in need of a meal. For over twenty years men of our conference have answered the Upper Room Prayer Line and supported it financially. This year we have added additional men who reach out and say "Upper Room Prayer Line, may I pray with you?"

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Purpose of the Board of Trustees is to receive, hold in trust, buy and sell real and personal property and to invest funds, if any, as prescribed in <u>The Book of Discipline, 2012</u>, Section IV. Annual Conference Property, 2512. 1 – 8, in the name of and on behalf of the Memphis Annual Conference. Additionally, pursuant to 2517 *Responsibilities of Annual Conference Trustees Related to Health and Welfare Institutions*, the Conference Trustees have the responsibility of establishing and maintaining statements of relationship between the Conference and related health and welfare organizations within the bounds of the Conference.

The Board of Trustees has two regular meetings each year, spring and fall. The board also routinely conducts business via e-mail and phone conferences in order to minimize the impact of time and travel on the board members as well as to be effective and timely in its work.

The Board of Trustees currently supports the mission of the Memphis Conference in providing for facilities of ministry outreach at three university campuses and the conference office.

The Board of Trustees oversees and/or contributes to the maintenance of six properties on behalf of the conference and provides assistance to the districts in completing property transactions approved by prior Annual Conference resolutions. It provides guidance and information as requested in matters pertaining to the full range of former and current property issues.

The Trustees hold the following campus ministry facilities: Murray State University Wesley Foundation, University of Memphis Wesley Foundation and University of Tennessee-Martin Wesley Foundation and Director's parsonage.

Since last annual conference, Trustees' activities include paying off the mortgage on the conference office, funding repairs and improvements on the office building and the disposition of three closed, discontinued or abandoned church properties. Sincere thanks to Kevin Floyd, Memphis Conference Chancellor-Tennessee, for his counsel and legal work in these transactions.

The Trustees budget request of \$73,000 for 2017 was submitted to CF&A with another decrease of \$6,000 or 7.6% less than the 2016 budget; a total of \$23,000 less than the 2015 budget.

TN RIVER DISTRICT LAY RESOURCE LEADER

The duties of the Lay Resource Leader are to further the mission of the Memphis Conference: to discover, equip, connect, and lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world, one neighborhood at a time. This includes a multitude of avenues/strategies in order to provide vital "linkages" and alliances which further our work by means of strengthening the health of the local church and the coping skills of the pastor and lay leaders of each congregation.

This is being lived out in the134 churches of the newly formed TN River District through the four verbs.

New leadership is being discovered through the relationship building with local church members, as I attend weekly Sunday worship services, week-day Bible studies, fellowship events, and charge conferences throughout the 10 counties.

Leaders are being equipped through a variety of training opportunities, including the expansion of the Generative Leadership Academy and its quarterly sessions: The Nature of God, A Life of Piety, Acts of Mercy, and Gifted, Called and Sent. During the past year, 104 folks have been trained through the Lay Servant Ministry, both basic and advanced classes. A best practices list and a resource library located at the district office are maintained with books and DVD's available for clergy and congregational use.

Each congregation is encouraged to connect with their community through the county-wide Mission Focus Groups after studying their Mission Insite demographic report.

Now, disciples continue to be sent through a variety of avenues into their communities: School mentoring programs, feeding ministries, community Vacation Bible Schools, Hispanic enrichment classes, and sheltering ministries. They are engaging through both word and deed to share the love of Jesus.

PURCHASE DISTRICT LAY RESOURCE LEADER

As a one-year veteran Lay Resource Leader serving the newly reorganized Purchase District this past year I have been developing relationships with the clergy and laity within the district and determining where we can help each other so that we can all grow to be more fruitful and faithful disciples and churches.

The Purchase District continues to **Discover, Equip, Connect and Send** clergy and laity out to do transforming work in the mission field by providing food, shelter, healing, comfort, grace, mercy and love. It is part of my role to be available to provide the resources and make connections so that this work can happen.

Some of the ways that we create transforming leaders is through the Generative Leadership Academy and various training events. Our District Laity Team is always looking for new ways to connect laity together and offer training events relevant to specific areas and specific genre. We are working in smaller groups within our district that we call "clusters" where clergy and laity are working together by developing covenant community that recognizes needs within the community and then find ways to address those needs together. By being intentional, we are hoping to achieve our mission which "is to discover, equip, connect and send lay and clergy leaders to join Christ's transforming, disciple-making work in and for the world."

The main shift is that we continue to become outward focused. The work we do may not always show quantity on a Sunday morning but the hope is that it may begin to show that we are making "grace filled followers of Jesus Christ" that are changing the world and that quantity may begin to show up in different places of worship or at different times of worship as we begin to look at how worship may look like in the future. We are also looking at those "third places" where people gather and how can we begin to look at these at places to make disciples and transform lives outside the traditional walls of a church building. Our mission is to "go and make disciples" where ever that may take us.

MISSISSIPPI RIVER DISTRICT LAY RESOURCE LEADER

As the Lay Resource Leader for the newly-formed Mississippi River District, I serve as a liaison between the Conference and the 120 churches of the District. This year has been spent meeting with churches and laity. My focus has been to live into the mission of discovering, equipping, connecting, and sending lay and clergy leaders who will shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world, one neighborhood at a time.

We have been diligent in working the 72+U in all of the churches. Lay Servants have taught this course as well as clergy and I. We stressed in all the sessions that we wanted to shift to an external focus in our communities. Most of our churches are rural and we spent time brainstorming about needs in their specific area.

I have focused on the Lay Servant Ministries in our District. We have developed a Lay Servant Academy. We have equipped laity by using two active clergy in the District, the District Superintendent and the Lay Resource Leader as trainers for Lay Servant classes. This year, we expanded our classes to two locations in the District. Three Advanced Lay Servant Classes were offered in Brownsville and the same three were offered in Troy. This allowed for more people to be involved and there were fewer miles for them to travel. I have taught three Basic Lay Servant Classes this year. We have 21 new adult Lay Servants this year. We had the Youth Lay Servant Academy at Milan FUMC on February 6 and 7. We had 28 youth to participate in this event.

An exciting opportunity for ministry is being discussed by the Lay Servants of our District. This came directly out of the Youth Lay Servant Academy. A meeting of all Lay Servants in the District is set for May. The new project will be the subject of that meeting. Hopefully, by next year, there will be a new ministry opportunity in our District which will be led by Lay Servants, youth and adult.

We had a successful Laity Gathering on April 2 at Milan FUMC. Over 200 laity gathered to enjoy entertainment by district laity, eat a meal together, and most importantly, worship together.

In November, over 400 lay and clergy of the MS River District gathered at Dyersburg FUMC for a ministry celebration. This was the first time since we became a new district that we have worshipped together. This will be done again in the coming year.

We will continue to follow the lead of our District Superintendent, Rev. Kevin Conrad as he prayerfully and boldly steps out to change our focus to a community-engaged ministry, to continue to equip both clergy and laity leaders who will shape congregations and offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world.

UT-MARTIN WESLEY FOUNDATION

In seeking to discover, equip, connect, and send out leaders that shape congregations and offer Jesus to the world from among our college campus (as is stated in the Memphis Conference's Mission), the UT-Martin Wesley Foundation has offered itself as a refuge for any students needing a place to study, rest, hide, play, eat, and-yes- seek God.

In the vein of unrelenting and unconditional love for all people, the UTM Wesley opens its doors daily throughout the school year, from 8am to 12am on weekdays and from 10am to 12am on weekends. During that time, students—regardless of affiliation—are given free use of the computer room, the recreation rooms, the kitchen, the study rooms, the laundry, and the sanctuary. In addition, Wesley keeps snacks and drinks stocked for any that might want something, as well as foodstuffs like ramen.

In striving for missional, pastoral, and congregational excellence, UTM Wesley holds regular worship on Monday nights, with a free meal, and a late night Bible study on Thursdays. For Spring Semester of 2016, our worships have centered around the ideal of Christian perfection, while our Bible study has been going through the book <u>What Every Christian Needs To Know About the Jewishness of Jesus</u> by Rabbi Evan Moffic. Worships have also included speakers from mission organizations, while the Bible study also featured a Seder meal on the Thursday of HolyWeek.

In terms of both innovation and faithfulness to our mission, we have updated our website to give prospective visitors a more accurate look into our facility ahead of time and added a calendar that can be checked from anywhere. Additionally, one of our Resident Managers has spent the semester updating our Policy Manual that covers those two live-in positions. It had been many years since it had gone through an update, but it is now reflective of current times and procedures. The Wesley Board has reviewed the changes along the way and approved changes as they are made. Additionally, we are also working on compiling a document of the Foundation's history that can be kept and updated as we go through the years, so that we can better maintain and grow the legacy of the Wesley Foundation at UT-Martin. (As an aside, while working on the History, we also found old pictures of campus which were donated into the school's Special Collections library.)

We have also begun a monthly game night, which we now offer to students on the first Wednesday of each month, and we brought in a Christian band to play a House Show for our students.

UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER UNITED METHODIST CAMPUS MINISTRY

Rev. Jonathan C. Lewis, BCC, Chaplain and Campus Minister

At the University of Tennessee Health Science Center (UTHSC) in Memphis, the United Methodist campus ministry continues to grow and explore new opportunities. In March of 2011, Jonathan Lewis started as the campus minister there, and he continues to serve in that position. Jonathan is also a full-time chaplain with Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare (MLH) in the Faith and Health Division. Jonathan is being ordained as a Deacon in full connection in the Memphis Conference in June of 2016.

UTHSC is composed entirely of graduate schools, all of them specializing in some form of health science

– from dentistry to medicine to nursing to laboratory science and much more. Jonathan relates well to UTHSC because of his own daily immersion in the hospital and healthcare setting, where he ministers to patients, families, and medical professionals of all kinds.

The latest initiative of this campus ministry is the formation of a new student group at UTHSC. The proposed student group will be called "UT Faith and Health" and engage the entire UTHSC community – all colleges and programs, all students, faculty, and staff. UT Faith and Health plans to connect UTHSC to the Faith and Health Division of MLH, including its clinical work, its fruitful partnerships with community organizations and congregations, its local and international missions and service opportunities, and its unique educational initiatives through the Center of Excellence in Faith and Health. This idea has garnered enthusiastic support from UTHSC leadership, who is particularly interested in the capacity of such a student group to connect and unite the various colleges that make up the UTHSC community. This idea brings a new level of engagement for the Faith and Health Division and the United Methodist Church at UTHSC.

Specific initiatives for UT Faith and Health include...

• <u>Establishment of a Certificate Program</u> – Students that participate with UT Faith and Health work towards completion of a Certificate of Excellence in Faith and Health. This certificate attracts students to UTHSC, to UT Faith and Health, and to MLH, but it also enables students to explore their own sense of call and vocation in the faith community.

• <u>Connection to United Methodist Congregations and Programs</u> – Through UT Faith and Health, students, faculty, and staff connect to Chaplain Lewis and the United Methodist Church. Relationships and partnerships with United Methodist congregations and programs would be a significant part of UT Faith and Health in much the same way that Faith and Health at MLH functions. The new student group will aim to be an innovative vehicle that increases student exposure to the church and its ministers and members.

• <u>Service and Support</u> – Chaplain Lewis is a trained spiritual caregiver, and his increased exposure to UTHSC enables him to offer more support and care to the entire UTHSC community, witnessing to the love of Christ that can work through the United Methodist Church and its people, reflecting the call of the Gospel to love God and love our neighbors.

• <u>Education</u> – Chaplain Lewis continues to help design and facilitate the "Serving The Underserved" course for UTHSC students together with the Church Health Center. UT Faith and Health could help to expand and develop that educational experience, aligning itself with the Wesleyan emphases on health, education, and personal formation.

MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY WESLEY FOUNDATION

The purpose of the Wesley Foundation is to provide a place where young adults on college campuses can engage in worship, service, mission, and spiritual growth through interaction with clergy and lay people from area congregations and where they can feel welcome to relax, study, play, eat, fellowship and be refreshed in a Christian home-like setting,

During freshman fall move-in day under the direction of campus minister Rev. Leah Howe, the Wesley Foundation of Murray State University partnered with the Calloway County Cluster United Methodist churches and carried luggage, climbed stairs, and offered Christ and fellowship at Wesley during the morning work and at a noontime meal at Wesley provided for incoming students and their families.

Wesley at Murray State University has experienced transition during this academic year. Rev. Howe, in her third year with us, took early maternity leave in mid-September, delivering a fine son in mid-October.

Rather than return to the Wesley ministry in the spring semester, Rev. Howe took spiritual renewal leave, with the blessing of the district superintendent and the full support of the advisory board.

During the time when Rev. Howe was away, Rev. Tim Palmer and the church family of Coldwater United Methodist Church prayerfully examined the challenges and benefits of assuming leadership of the ministry. Several students who were invested in the Wesley ministry were regularly attending Coldwater, and Rev. Palmer and Dr. Brian Hoover, both members of the advisory board, and several other Coldwater members, took part in Tuesday evening worship. With the guidance of district superintendents, church members and board leadership felt God's offering a great mission opportunity to the church and a new approach to leadership at Wesley, and the decision was made to ask Rev. Palmer to serve as interim campus minister working with Coldwater church leaders.

Molly Young was hired as part-time administrative assistant for Wesley, assuring a regular presence during daytime hours each week, and the work of the transition of leadership continued. Working with Rev. Palmer and Mrs. Young, the board engaged a regular cleaning person to help the student building workers provide a well-appointed facility and a more inviting physical space. The worship room was painted, a student study room was outfitted in the former director's office, the former prayer room was designated for Bible study and meditation, and inventory was taken of outdated and unneeded furniture and equipment, and replacements were purchased.

Spring break week for twelve students and several Coldwater adults was spent at Henderson Settlement in Henderson, Kentucky, providing not only mission opportunity but also time to strengthen the bonds of friendship among the young adults and to continue equipping them with leadership skills in the spring semester and for their fall planning. During the school year, Wesley students regularly contribute to local charities and help organizations and give assistance when these groups need extra hands in their work.

Students regularly lead Tuesday worship, planning the services and providing music with the cooperation of Coldwater church members. Bible studies are held each week led by Rev. Palmer with students also taking leadership roles. With these opportunities for both students and church members, faith journeys are enriched, church families are strengthened, leadership skills are amplified, and relationships are broadened. With a strong connection between Wesley and a local church, students not only have opportunity to be part of a faith family but also are exposed to a wide variety of Christian men and women who have invested in the growth and development of these young adults.

THE WESLEY FOUNDATION AT MEMPHIS

The Wesley Foundation at Memphis has concluded an exciting year of activity and service. At the core of who we are is our worship life. Our community gathers weekly for a time of spirited music, heartfelt prayer and intentional discerning of the meaning of the Word of God for our lives. Our volunteer musicians – the 1 Kings 17:13 Band – leads us in singing traditional hymns and songs but with a vigorous presentation that has become the band's trademark. Our worship, while being informal, has a traditional structure that our students have embraced strongly. In addition to this calendar event, we hold a weekly service of Holy Communion for the Wesley family. We also hold special worship events such as a service of Thanksgiving, a Service of Lessons and Carols as our community disperses for its Christmas break, an Ash Wednesday service, Holy Week services and occasional other worship gatherings.

All this is to say that our beginning and ending is grounded in worship. Through a corporate experience of prayer, praise and discernment the Wesley Foundation helps our fellowship identify priorities both individually and collectively. With this bedrock, Wesley's participants are able to participate in one of our stated goals for student ministry: leader development. Studies show that many college-aged students "check-out" of their enhancement of the quality of leadership during their undergraduate years. Many leave home, go through their degree programs, and then return to their communities of origin with little or no expansion of their leadership skill-sets. The Wesley Foundation actively involves our students in a process by which they discern need in the lives of our young people. As part of our Ministry Team they design program, execute events and evaluate the effectiveness of the things we have done. In this way they hone their skills so that, by the time they finish their university careers, they are prepared to return home and "hit the ground running" in their occupations, in their communities, and most importantly, in their local congregations. We have an active Wesley Intern program through which we invite young adults to be particularly involved in this process. A Wesley Intern's job description is "make our ministry go." With that responsibility and freedom, our staff performs an exemplary service in support of our work.

We believe that our ministry serves the stated values of the Annual Conference -- unrelenting love for all people, integrity, excellence, faithfulness & fruitfulness, and innovation -- through the fostering of genuine Christian community. And so, we have a lot of fun together. We gather regularly for fellowship and recreational opportunities. We do this so that the campus population has an alternative to the rowdier distractions that sometimes accompany college years. But we also do this with positive goals in mind. Particularly, we come to care for one another, to trust each other, and to discover what joy there is in genuine faith identity. It is our experience that these relationships endure long past a person's college years. The fostering of this teamwork also promotes a desire to reach out to people and causes beyond the Wesley group. We have taken mission trips, volunteered in campus and community activities, and have shared the news of our ministry with local United Methodist congregations.

We have established meaningful relationships with many of the local church groups and congregations that support our work. We would be much the poorer in our institutional life if churches, Sunday school classes, small groups, UMW circles or units, UMW groups or individual volunteers did not provide our Tuesday evening Fellowship Meals. These folks find joy in their participation in our ministry. In turn, the Wesley community has frequently found new friends and lasting associations through interaction with these generous souls.

The college experience is a magical time for many people. We believe that the work and witness of our Wesley Foundation helps make that so in the lives of countless students. We are grateful for our task, and for the support that we receive from The Memphis Annual Conference. We anticipate another great year in 2016 - 2017. The peace of the Lord be with you.

BETHEL WESLEY FELLOWSHIP

Understanding its call to witness in the campus community of Bethel University to the mission, message, and life of Jesus Christ, the Bethel Wesley Fellowship in McKenzie, TN reaches out to and receives people in his name. It accomplishes this by providing opportunities for its participants to strengthen their relationship with God and to relate to one another via worship, sharing, and service.

A relatively new ministry, the BWF is in its fifth semester—having launched in the spring of 2014. But over the last year, the group has taken significant strides forward. In January 2016 the group was sanctioned by Bethel University as an official student organization. Two months later, a midnight gathering dubbed Paint, Prayer & Pancakes welcomed over one hundred students—one of the largest campus ministry gatherings of any denomination for the semester. Less than a week afterward, our group would participate in an ecumenical ministry night alongside several other campus ministries. Moreover, we have ramped up our web presence, amassing more than two hundred likes on our Facebook page and regularly sharing via our Twitter and Instagram accounts; we have been featured in an article on the conference website as well.

Still, perhaps our most important step was taken in petitioning the Conference Board of Higher Education for standing as a campus ministry within the Memphis Annual Conference and recognition as the Bethel Wesley *Foundation*. This important approval will confirm our sense that we are following God's directing and further legitimize our efforts to offer Christ in our neighborhood.

Every success of this ministry can be attributed to God's provision. Even so, that provision has come largely through the openhandedness of United Methodist congregations and organizations across northwest Tennessee; to all who have contributed in any way, we give sincere thanks. We are hopeful and excited for the future of this ministry, and look forward with expectation to the greater things that are yet to come.

The Wesley Foundation--U of M, Lambuth Campus

The academic year of 2015-2016 was one of great transition for the students of the Wesley Foundation.

The spring 2015 graduation saw a dozen students, a host of former student leaders, and our founding worship leader move to their life beyond college. *The Wesley* entered the fall semester with a new look, to offer Christ to the campus as part of a hurting world.

Over the course of the fall semester worship services moved to evening services for the first time. A new band was assembled to lead worship in the newly updated facilities at Lambuth Memorial U.M.C. Thursday's students continued to gather on campus to study the Book of Mark, and in the evenings to gather off campus to discuss pressing issues in the world, and of their hearts.

In the fall *The Wesley* hosted its first movie and discussion. *The Lion Witch and Wardrobe* was fodder for lively discussion with almost 40 students. During October students gathered for the fourth annual *Wesley Campfire Cookout* to reach students from the campus community. Students also joined forces with the M.S.A. to pack 10,000 meals for *Stop Hunger Now*.

During the spring semester students hosted the fourth annual "Blessing of the Semester" welcoming faculty and staff to worship and dine with students. Worship was led by Dr. Jeremy Tubbs, as congregants focused on remembering to love what is holy. Funds raised that day were used to support *Blood/Water Mission*, an organization that seeks to end the AIDS crisis, and provide cleaning drinking water in Africa. Twice students joined forces with Northside U.M.C. to feed the homeless through *Room In the Inn*. Students challenged the campus to donate boxes of Mac'N'Cheese to support the local women's shelter *The Dream Center*.

During the course of the semester forty students regularly attended the variety of *Wesley* services. One of the most distinguished blessings of the year was a profession of faith that was made by a former atheist during one of our weekly Bible studies and seeing that student become on the most faithful members. This year, Boston University welcomed new faculty in ethics, psychology, theologies of spirituality, comparative theology, church renewal, Black church leadership, and mission studies.

STH continued to expand and deepen its spiritual life program, led by Charlene Zuill, United Methodist elder. Bishop Susan Hassinger, Claire Wolfteich, and many others also offer a rich selection of courses in spirituality and leadership.

STH added a chaplaincy track to the MDiv degree, preparing students for hospitals, prisons, and military settings.

ENGAGING IN DIALOGUE

Power, Privilege and Prophetic Witness is our theme for 2015-2017. We have engaged the theme in classes, lectures, retreats, and workshops, seeking to be honest and vigorously open to change while honoring the dignity of all persons.

Studying intersections of theology and race. This year we engaged in: a premier viewing of a documentary on North Korea; a dialogical viewing of *Selma*; dialogues on racism with Thandeka and Andrew Sung Park; a retreat on building race relations; circle worship; a student-led event on Black women in the U.S.; and events on interfaith understanding.

CARING FOR THE CHURCH through leadership and service.

Students serve local churches and church bodies as interns, staff, and volunteers. Faculty serve with such bodies as: United Methodist Women, World Methodist Council, Ministry Study Commission, Women of Color Scholars and Mentors program, Pan Methodist Commission on Children in Poverty, and boards and agencies of the general church and annual conferences.

Young Latino/a leaders gather each year with seasoned mentors to enhance their gifts and service as Christian leaders: Hispanic Youth Leadership Initiative (HYLA) and Raíces Latinas Leadership Institute.

STH is facilitating dialogue on church renewal through its Evangelism and Church Renewal initiative.

STH faculty, alumni/ae, and students contributed this year to a special issue of *Worship Arts Magazine*, published by the Fellowship of United Methodists in Music and Worship Arts.

CARING FOR THE WORLD

STH offers opportunities for engaged learning with the Doctor of Ministry program in Transformational Leadership; an urban ministry course; travel seminars to India, the Arizona- Mexico border, Israel-Palestine, Mexico, and Turkey (Ephesus); work with leaders in Ferguson, MO; and a travel seminar for UMC clergywomen to Cuba, co-sponsored by GBHEM and STH.

Collaborations with the global church included sponsorship of the *Dictionary of African Christian Biography*; events and art exhibits on local and global ecology; and dialogues with global church leaders.

Memphis Theological Seminary

Annual Report to the Memphis Annual Conference

Memphis Theological Seminary (MTS) highly values our longstandingpartnership with the United Methodist Church. At MTS, we are committed to foster a vital Methodist ethos where persons and congregations are formed by the Wesleyan tradition through theological education, support of local Methodist clergy, laity, and congregations, and maintaining healthy connections with five surrounding Annual Conferences in the Mid-South (Memphis, Tennessee, Mississippi, Arkansas, and North Alabama). Both in and out of the classroom, we assist our Methodist constituents to seek the fullness of the Christian gospel through "lives devoted to scholarship, piety, and justice," as the Seminary's mission statement holds. Or, in the words of Charles Wesley's hymn coined for the opening of the Kingswood School, to "Unite the pair so long disjoined, knowledge and vital piety."

We are pleased to report to the Memphis Annual Conference that academic year 2015-2016 has been a notable one for our work with United Methodists.

Our **Methodist House of Studies** provides a strong "community within a community" for all students who identify with the Wesleyan tradition. In May of 2015 upon graduation, we awarded our first *Certificate in Wesleyan Studies* to those students who had completed five or more courses that focus upon Methodist history, theology, and practice of ministry. UMC students who attend MTS find in our course offerings and interaction with Methodist faculty a firm foundation within the rich Wesleyan tradition. Under the leadership of Dr. Lee Ramsey and Rev. Billy Vaughan (ordained elders in the Memphis Annual Conference) The House of Studies actively cultivates relationships with the surrounding Annual Conferences and develops the the House of Studies as a bridge to the local churches, pastors, laity, and judicatories that we serve.

We are excited about the recent hiring of **Dr. Michael Turner**, who will begin serving as Associate Professor of Wesleyan Studies on August 1, 2016. Dr. Turner holds the Ph.D. in Church History from Vanderbilt University, is a scholar of 19th century American Methodism, a dynamic classroom instructor, and a committed leader within the United Methodist Church.

Enrollment remains strong among UM students who comprise 25% of our student body (total enrollment 250) within three separate degree programs: Masters of Divinity, Masters of Arts in Youth Ministry, and the Doctor of Ministry degrees. This year the Association of Theological Schools approved MTS to initiate a Masters of Arts in Christian Ministry degree. This will be a 42 credit hour general degree in theological education tailored to the interests of laypersons who seek solid theological and practical training for Christian ministry. It begins Fall 2016.

Of particular importance to all of our UMC candidates for ordination, in early 2016, the University Senate of the United Methodist Church approved Memphis Theological for listing for the preparation of candidates for ordination in The United Methodist Church. This endorsement of the University Senate undergirds our commitment to provide the best of theological education to all United Methodist Students who seek preparation for ministry at Memphis Theological Seminary.

AFRICA UNIVERSITY REPORT

James H. Salley Associate Vice Chancellor for Institutional Advancement

The Africa University story is one of faithfulness and generosity. Every chapter—from the dream, to Africa University's founding, to its current, vibrant reality—documents the unwavering commitment of the members, local congregations, and annual conferences of The United Methodist Church.

In 2015, the Memphis Conference invested 69.54 percent of its asking to the Africa University Fund apportionment. Africa University is thankful to the local congregations of the Memphis Conference for their dedication to Africa University. The contributions of the Memphis Conference help Africa University to nurture and equip principled, global leaders who are answering the call to serve. Thank you, Memphis Conference. Please work towards the goal of a 100 percent investment of the Memphis Conference asking to the AUF in 2016.

Institutional Update: Africa University increased its focus on the quality of life and success of its students in 2015. New staff development strategies are being implemented to ensure that the majority of the faculty have terminal degrees in their various disciplines. Academic programs are being restructured to make them more relevant and marketable and by 2020, fulltime student enrollment is projected to grow by 60 percent. A new strategic plan, (2017-2021), is in development. The plan assigns resources more effectively, while ensuring that fiscal responsibility and accountability are maintained. In addition, the university is increasing its friend-making and fundraising efforts in Africa, particularly among its graduates and their families.

Currently, Africa University has a total enrollment about 1,500 full-time students who represent 26 of Africa's 54 countries. An additional 770 students are gaining new skills and knowledge as they pursue undergraduate and graduate degrees on a part-time basis.

Africa University graduates number around 6,200. They are dispersed across the continent and engaged in vigorous efforts to improve public health, food security, peace, stability, and the enjoyment of economic prosperity in Africa. These graduates are leaders and role models who inspire a new optimism and they are advancing the mission of The United Methodist Church in Africa.

Looking ahead: Africa University's new strategic plan calls for a significant increase in the proportion of self-funded students and for achieving a 60:40 ratio of international to national students within the next three to five years. To do this, the university must add more on- campus student housing and recreational facilities. The availability of scholarships will also be vital to ensuring access to an Africa University education for young people from modest backgrounds and conflict zones.

The ongoing support of local churches in the Memphis Conference, and across The United Methodist Church, is crucial to Africa University's ministry and its impact within Africa. Please pray for Africa University. Consider making a second-mile gift to support student scholarships and other needs. Remember to include Africa University in your will. Thank you, Memphis Conference, for working to increase your investment in the AUF. This is helping young people to use their gifts to uplift and transform their communities. Rust College Holly Springs, Mississippi

Established in 1866 by the Freedmen's Aid Society of the Methodist Church on a former slave auction site, Rust College reached another milestone in the 2015-2016 academic year – the 150th Anniversary of its founding. This achievement in and of itself is one that alumni, students, faculty, staff, and supporters from every arena can be particularly proud. Rust is the oldest one of 11 Historically Black Colleges and Universities established after the Civil War by the Methodist Church still in existence today serving more than 900 students annually from 26 states and 6 foreign countries. Rust's Mission continues to be in tune with the church's overall philosophy – *doing no harm, doing good and staying in love with Jesus Christ* as we serve the young people who look to Rust as their bridge to a better tomorrow through education.

Rust College Religious Life is a diverse community providing the administration, faculty, staff and students sacred space to be fellow travelers on a journey of faith that leads to transformation of the individual and the world.

The Office of the Chaplain oversees religious life activities, coordinates training for student ministers, and provides counseling for administration, faculty, staff, and students.

Informed by Christian tradition, Rust College religious life strives to be an ambassador for Jesus Christ to a diverse higher education community. Grounded in the Wesleyan tradition, Rust is the place where "Tomorrow's Leaders are Students Today." Students who will be and do "all the good they can, by all the means they can, in all the ways they can, in all the places they can, at all the times they can to all the people they can, for as long as they can."

Highlights for 2015-2016 year include:

- Dr. Gemma Beckley, Chair and Professor of Social Work, spent the second semester of the 2015-2016 academic year doing research and teaching in India as a Fulbright Scholar. Dr. Beckley is the first Fulbright awardee in Rust College history.
- The Lettie Pate Whitehead Foundation has provided a grant of \$140,000 to the Rust College General Scholarship Fund for 2015-2016.
- The College ended the 2014-2015 fiscal year with a balanced budget for the 49th consecutive year. (Annual Budget is \$20,096,500).
- Rust College received a grant for \$145,000 from the Hearin Foundation to support needy students seeking financial aid. The total grant equaled \$580,000 over a four year period.
- The University Senate of the United Methodist Church stated that Rust College is in full compliance and will continue to be listed as a United Methodist related institution.
- Rust College was named 2nd of the top15 least expensive schools to receive a degree, with an average cost of \$13,600 over a 4½ year period for students to graduate.
- The Council on Social Work Education Commission on Accreditation reaffirmed the Baccalaureate Social Work Program for Rust College for eight years.
- Dr. David L. Beckley, President, has been elected to the Council of Independent Colleges (CIC) Board of Directors for a three year term (January 2014-January 2017). He also was elected to the Africa University Board of Directors in March 2016.
- As a part of the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities, Rust College junior, English Fields, from Corinth, Mississippi was recognized as an HBCU All-Star.
- Awarded an \$80,000.00 Grant from the Arthur Vining Davis Foundation.
- University of Mississippi Ronald E. McNair program offers, Jordan White, Savahn Jordan and Kendrick Armstrong the opportunity to be 2016 Ronald E McNair scholars.
- A \$478,464.00 Grant from Lilly Endowment Foundation will provide for a new program at Rust College geared toward connecting high school students to theology and faith.
- The College was awarded a Minority Science and Engineering Improvement Program (MSEIP) Grant of \$250,000.00 per year for three years totaling \$750,000.00.
- Tanzania Griffin, a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, majoring in Biology has been crowned Rust

College 2016 Miss United Negro College Fund.

- Dr. Marco Robinson had the opportunity to participate in mission work and conduct research in Haiti.
- Rust College elected its first non-African American Miss Freshman, Laura Sue Nordin, from Lamar, Arkansas.
- Rust College Division of Business was recently ranked #5 out of 50 small colleges for business administration degree program by "Best Value Schools.com".
- Rust College will be celebrating its 150-year Anniversary November 11-13,2016.
- Mississippian Debra Butler, Assistant Professor of Social Work, is named the Rust College "Teacher of the Year" by the Mississippi Humanities Council.
- Christian Menzi, a freshman Business major from Zimbabwe, has been selected to be a Lina H. McCord Ambassador this summer in support of the Black College Fund through Dr. Cynthia Hopson's office with the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry.
- Our frugal fiscal practices continue to keep us financially sound. For the last 49 years, Rust College has had a policy of only building "debt-free" non-income producing building. As a result of this policy, Rust has long term debts less than \$1.5 million related to residential hall construction and renovations in 1990. We actively recruit foundations, corporations, alumni and friends for scholarship grants to help underwrite the tuition cost of our students who must have financial support to get and stay in school. Our text book-use-system assists us in keeping our tuition and fees to a minimum. For example, in 2010 tuition, room, board, books and fees total \$10,930 annually. In 2015 the total cost is \$13,600 which amounts to an increase of only \$2,670 over a five-year period.

As you, our friends of the United Methodist Church, continue to uphold your promise of educational opportunity established many years ago, we, the members of the Rust College family, will uphold the promise made by our founder, Rev. A. C. McDonald in 1866, *"to do not hothouse work"* but will work to build men and women morally, spiritually and academically sound. We are thankful to you for your prayers and financial support. Without it we would not have been able to sustain quality academic programs or offer scholarship assistance to needy students. Again, thank you for your commitment to "our" legacy established 150 years ago. Your continued support is essential as we endeavor to build a stronger legacy for this generation and those in years to come who will look to Rust and our great church for higher educational opportunities.

• The Lewis Center for Church Leadership informs more than 17,000 pastors and lay leaders on trends and ideas through its e-newsletter. The center has influenced more than 5,600 church leaders through leadership assessments, sexual ethics trainings, and fundraising trainings.

• The new Institute for Community Engagement is forwarding Wesley's mission of raising prophetic leaders in the public square through classes, partnerships, conferences, and resources.

Wesley Students Are Answering God's Call. Wesley provides more than \$2 million dollars annually in scholarships to our students thanks to the consistent support of alumni, congregations and friends of the seminary. The Ministerial Education Fund and conference partners help us equip a broad range of students to serve the church as pastors and leaders. These include:

- Two Master of Divinity students who are exploring ordination in the UMC that have created outreach opportunities for people who ordinarily would not consider going into a church. **Zach Spoerl** and **Matt Wilke**, working with three United Methodist Churches and Wesley, have started Pub Theology in downtown D.C., drawing spiritual-but-not-religious young adults into Christian community.

- Master of Theological Studies student **Jane Adams** is working with denominations and congregations on issues of poverty and hunger in the U.S. As an intern at the Center for Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships at the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, she provides tools for building on charitable activities such as food pantries and backpack ministries. As a member of a local United Methodist congregation, she's putting her knowledge to work in her local church and neighborhood, too.

Christian leadership must innovate for greater faithfulness and be able to engage the full diversity of people within our society even while holding true to the foundations of our faith and tradition. The people named above – as well as so many more of our students – exemplify these aims. Read more about our students at wesleyseminary.edu/stories.

Mourning the Loss of a Christian Leader. The Rev. Clementa Pinckney was a Doctor of Ministry student at Wesley in the Leadership Excellence track. He was working on a research project on the combined role of pastor and statesman, when his life was taken along with eight others at Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, S.C. Rev. Pinckney exemplified the spiritually powerful and prophetic leadership that is at the core of our mission. To ensure Pinckney's legacy continues, Wesley has established scholarships in his name for Doctor of Ministry candidates seeking to empower their congregations, engage their communities, and influence public discourse. **Additionally**, Wesley has developed a Doctor of Ministry track exploring the intersection between public life and church leadership. This degree focus amplifies Wesley's mission and location and, we hope, will raise up leaders to continue Pinckney's legacy.

UNITED THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio continues to educate a significant number of pastors and local church leaders for the Memphis Conference of the United Methodist Church.

United has always focused on developing faithful, fruitful, inspired and inspiring pastors and local church leaders. 83% of the 2015 graduates of United are now serving in local congregations. 53% of the2015 graduates from all other seminaries affiliated with the Association of Theological Seminaries are serving in local congregations.

Furthermore, 44% of the current 449 students at United are African American which makes United one of the most racially diverse seminaries in the United States. An average of 12% of the student body at most seminaries in the United States are African American. 43% of the students at United are female compared to an average of 33% at other United States seminaries.

United is one of the most racially and gender diverse seminaries in the United States and produces a higher percentage of local church pastors than most other seminaries in the United States.

United is also in the process of leadership transition. In November 2015 President Wendy Deichmann resigned as President and, after a well-deserved sabbatical, will return to serving as a Professor of History and Theology. Under President Deichmann, United was listed as one of the 12 fastest growing seminaries in the United States largely because of the growing Doctor of Ministry program and our on-line degree programs. 44% of United's students are in the Master of Divinity program, 41% are in the Doctor of Ministry program and 15% are in other degree or certificate programs.

In January 2016 the United Board of Trustees selected Dr. Kent Millard, former pastor at St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Indianapolis, as Interim President while they search for a new President.

CANDLER SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

For more than 100 years, **Candler School of Theology** at Emory University has prepared *real* people to make a *real* difference in the *real* world. Since our founding in 1914, over 10,000 students have graduated from Candler, where they have been shaped as Christian leaders who put faith and love into action, transforming the world in the name of Jesus Christ.

One of 13 official seminaries of The United Methodist Church, Candler is also one of seven graduate professional schools of Emory University, a top-tier research institution offering extensive resources and a rich context for study. Our location in Atlanta provides a learning environment that reflects the highly diverse communities of the 21st century. Simply put, there is no better place for ministry preparation that addresses our major denominational priorities: developing leaders, starting and growing churches, ministry with the poor, and improving global health.

In order to keep pace with the needs of the church and the world, Candler now offers 17 degrees: seven single degrees and ten dual degrees pairing theology with bioethics, business, development practice, law, public health, or social work. One of our newest degrees is a retooled Doctor of Ministry that is 90 percent on online, so students can remain in their places of ministry as they study—and apply what they learn in real time. We've also partnered with the University of Georgia's School of Social Work to create an MDiv/MSW where students learn to maximize their effectiveness by combining pastoral skills such as spiritual counseling with social work practices such as family therapy and community assessment.

Our student body continues to reflect the diversity and breadth of the Christian faithful. 466 students are enrolled, with 48 percent women, 34 percent people of color (U.S.), and a median age of 29. Students represent 44 denominations, with 51 percent coming from the Methodist family. 82 percent of students are seeking a degree to prepare them as ministry professionals.

Candler has a deep commitment to alleviating student debt and employs a multi-pronged approach to tackle this issue. In 2015-2016, we awarded nearly \$5.5 million in Candler scholarships, with 92 percent of MDiv students and 84 percent of all students receiving support. And our comprehensive financial literacy program teaches money management skills that serve our students now and will continue to serve them—and the churches they serve—well into the future.

At the end of the 2015-2016 academic year, Candler says goodbye and Godspeed to a handful of noted faculty as they retire: Barbara Day Miller, Luke Timothy Johnson, Steve Tipton, and Bishop Woodie White. Yet even as these legends take their leave after distinguished careers of scholarship and service, we look forward to welcoming a new crop of scholar-leaders who will join us in the coming months and grow with us in the coming years. We are especially pleased to welcome Bishop Larry Goodpaster, who will join the faculty as bishop-in-residence in the fall of 2016.

Candler draws considerable strength and inspiration from its relationship with The United Methodist Church. Our ability to fulfill our mission of educating faithful and creative leaders for the church's ministries in the world depends upon your support, gifts, and prayers. Wesley Living is a group of organizations that is essentially about people—elderly residents and at-home clients, hands-on serving staff, pastors, maintenance personnel, service coordinators, community managers, program managers, corporate staff and executives, boards of directors—all necessary to the mission of enhancing the lives of older generations of the area. We proudly do so in a covenant relationship with the Memphis Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church.

Pastoral care is a key to the lives of our residents and clients. During the past year our staff has worked diligently with the district superintendents to establish relationships with local pastors throughout the annual conference where we serve. Today, every community is being served.

Providing affordable housing and assisted living for our seniors is a major part of the ministry effort. The demand remains high and the goal is to continually update the existing while expanding the services being provided. Wesley Highland Meadows, a 200 unit community in the Raleigh Frayser area of north Memphis was successfully financed last year utilizing Low Income Housing Tax Credits and other federally insured loans. Recently a renovation and preservation project was completed totaling more than \$6,000,000.00. The lives of every resident have been greatly enhanced by these efforts. A similar sized community in Whitehaven is being launched this year to grow in service to the elderly.

For the sixth year Wesley Home Services provides non-medical, in-home assistance services which range from companionship to housekeeping to personal assistance. Serving the broad range of people and locations in this ministry continues to be both a blessing and challenge. The challenge hinges on attracting employees with the highest moral, ethical and compassionate values coupled with the necessary skills to make Wesley's value unique from others providing this service.

The number of elderly needing quality, affordable housing and services continues to grow as the traditional resources for construction and tenant services become more difficult to access. Wesley Living has positioned itself to be the premier provider as other ideas continue to be discussed locally, regionally and nationally. Wesley remains engaged and participative to aid in solving these social issues.

These conditions create a growing demand for assistance to residents from Wesley Senior Ministries Foundation. Food, medicine, rent, medical bills, and furnishings are supplied to those in need. A growing demand continues as a result of the modified selection policy to serve the homeless. The Foundation has continued to grow into a larger part of the answer to resident needs. David Kabakoff, President of the Foundation, and Kristi Owens, Executive Director create a dynamic duo. Please see the report in the Journal.

The mission of Wesley Senior Ministries Foundation, through the Golden Cross Senior Residents Fund[™], is committed to provide the resources to enhance the quality of daily life and well-being of the elderly residents of Wesley Living communities.

Our residents were greatly blessed by the Memphis Conference in 2015! New churches participated financially with Golden Cross offerings and our Key Women of the United Methodist Women have packed their meetings and donated items like never before. The amazing generosity of the Memphis Conference has worked harder than ever towards our goal of <u>transforming lives, one</u> <u>need at a time!</u> Day in and day out our residents experience firsthand the love of Christ through your support.

Wesley Senior Ministries Foundation now serves the needs of over 2,200 senior residents living in the 29 Wesley Living affordable housing communities in West Tennessee, Murray KY and Jonesboro, AR. Through the GOLDEN CROSS Senior Residents Fund[™], we support those dear residents with daily use items, emergency financial assistance and social activities.

Wesley Living has adjusted its tenant selection plan to grant preference to senior who are homeless. According to the Homeless Research Institute, the estimated elderly homelessness will increase 33% by 2020. By 2050, the elderly homeless population is projected to more than double. Living on limited, fixed incomes—including Social Security and/or Supplemental Security Income—elderly persons experience severe housing cost burdens more frequently than the general population, potentially resulting in housing loss.

Since this was a new initiative addressing a complex sociological problem, the results were hard to project. Who were these homeless seniors? Where would these homeless seniors come from? Would they be the stereotypical homeless from the nooks and crannies of our metropolitan area or would they come from other domains? Was an invitation being extended to a population under bridges and overpasses with all the inherent issues associated?

The incidence of homelessness is increasing as the data has predicted. One lady experienced a late life divorce. Rejected by her former husband's family, she was forced to live in a popup camper behind her former home. Another lady moved into one of communities literally from a treehouse. These dear folks, after many productive years, sometimes suddenly find themselves in untenable situations. A wavering economy, unexpected late life job loss and late life living changes, such as divorce, all contribute to this new group of homeless. These situations are what the collection of Wesley senior care companies are uniquely qualified to serve.

Through your generosity our residents celebrated the second annual "Bear Your Heart for Art" contest. Blank teddy bears were decorated and after a wining community was named 140 decorated bears were donated to the United Methodist Neighborhood Centers to distribute to children in need.

Thank you to all the faithful and generous supporters of the GOLDEN CROSS Senior Residents Fund[™] throughout the Memphis Conference. With your blessings lives have been transformed, one need at a time.

It is important to remind at this point, the GOLDEN CROSS Senior Residents Fund[™] relies solely on your generosity. No apportionments are received by the Memphis Conference. In addition since our incredible Board of Trustees insures funds are available to operate the Foundation, 100% of monies donated to GOLDEN CROSS go directly to the benefit of the residents of Wesley Living communities.

The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building." (I Cor. 3:7-9) It continues to be my privilege to serve the United Methodist Foundation for the Memphis and Tennessee Annual Conferences. This significant ministry in conjunction with the United Methodist Development Fund for Kentucky and Tennessee is helping further the work of God in our communities. One of the most important ways that we do that is by joining in partnership with you in your ministries. We are committed to helping you reach out to the world by being "God's field and God's building.

The Foundation is here to empower you to make faithful and new ministry initiatives. We do that in several important ways. First, we serve as a custodian for endowed funds on behalf of local churches and other United Methodist ministries. As of March 1, 2015, our holdings are \$55,560,679. Last year, in spite of the great volatility of the markets, the fund remained almost flat. We are thankful that by way of partnership with you, \$1,669,716 were withdrawn in order to strengthen existing or to begin new ministries.

We help by means of the United Methodist Development Fund of Tennessee/Kentucky. Accepting investments from individuals, churches and organizations, we are able to loan money at a competitive rate to United Methodist churches and ministries for building projects. Currently, the Development Fund is loaning money at 3.99% and paying 1% to shareholders. With \$21,192,490 in assets, the Development Fund is ready to serve you.

In 2014, we launched a new initiative to partner with you. In 2014, 23 churches in the Tennessee and Memphis Annual Conferences took advantage of our Stewardship Grant Program. These churches said "yes" to the challenge to embrace best stewardship practices. In doing that, they became eligible for \$1,000 grants. The program continued this year and we made an additional 15 grants. In the winter of 2016, we are beginning a new program in partnership with the Lake Institute of Indiana University. Watch for more information about this program called Creating Congregational Cultures of Generosity.

LAKESHORE CAMP AND RETREAT CENTER

The summer of 2016 will welcome an exciting addition to Lakeshore's ministry. DayShore will be a day damp partnership with local churches and/or community organizations or clusters wanting to reach out to underserved children in their areas. DayShore will take all that is positive and spiritually meaningful from the shores of Eva, TN and carry it to the home court of the many children who might not be able to make it to Lakeshore for camp.

Our mission remains committed to offering ways for all to experience life, love and the God of Grace. At the time of preparing this report, we can celebrate the news that we have contracts for 6 of our 9 available DayShore weeks with the remaining 3 weeks under negotiation. We will consider it a joyful problem if we have to add a second DayShore team for 2017.

Last year we bore witness to the love of God to 1,965 summer campers and approximately 300 counselors. In 2015 we offered just short of \$70,000 in full or part camperships and raised approximately \$55,000 to help with the load. We logged over 39,000 volunteer hours of mostly young people leading and learning to lead their peers and younger campers.

For the above reasons and more, we firmly believe that the ministry of camp and retreats in the Memphis Annual Conference has never been stronger. We are intentionally faithful to all "Four Areas of Focus" and remain committed in ministry with, and as a resource for, the Memphis Conference.

A new strategic plan was developed last year under the amazing guidance of Roy Riley from Murray First United Methodist Church. Under this strategic plan, DayShore was affirmed and initiated. We expect to hatch even more program initiatives from this plan in years to come.

As is true in every year, we are thankful for your prayers and support. We remain committed to asking you for less apportionment funding each year (6 years to date) and hope to one day be completely self- sustainable. In the meantime we cannot do this ministry without you. Again, thank you so very much.

Through this formal affiliation, MLH will have access to the most current information provided by Mayo Clinic physicians. Our commitment to a mission of service is in our DNA. We take pride in our faith-based relationship. During 2015 we provided passionate patient-and-family-centered care to tens of thousands of people in the Mid-South and beyond. - Over 41,000 In-Patient and Out-Patient Surgical Patients

Our Associates are vital to our organization. We feel honored that our Associates voted MLH – for the third year in a row – as a "Top Workplace" by the Commercial Appeal. MLH received the Commercial Appeal's New Ideas Award for Innovative Thinking. U.S. News & World Reports magazine has again named Methodist Memphis Hospitals the Best Hospital in Memphis. Le Bonheur Children's Hospital, part of Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare, was named to U.S. News & World Report's 2015-2016 Best Children's Hospital in seven clinical areas: Cardiology, Neonatology, Nephrology, Neurology/Neurosurgery, Orthopedics, Pulmonology and Urology.

Our Faith & Health Division continues to provide significant and innovative service and programming through our Center of Excellence in Faith & Health. Please note some highlights in the following areas:

• Our Congregational Health Network works alongside more than 600 congregations in a covenant relationship to educate, serve and minister to congregants and their communities to promote better health outcomes.

• Our Faith and Health team is addressing disparities of care in many areas. Joined in a collaborative effort both with our partners West Cancer Center, Church Health Center and others we are serving the underserved and offering healing and hope to those who need it the most. A vibrant and unique prison ministry at the Memphis Correctional Facility for Women. It is the embodiment of the Gospel and has experienced steady growth as it empowers those incarcerated to become disciples of Jesus Christ and to live out their call to discipleship in and outside of prison.

16. Disability Awareness Sunday – October 8, 2017

To celebrate the gifts and graces of persons with disabilities and to call for full inclusion of persons with disabilities in the community. Funds donated will go to support – Asbury Communities of Tennessee (ACT) whose mission is to provide a secure living environment for adults with developmental disabilities, regardless of faith or denomination. The group seeks to provide nurturing homes in which these adults may live purposeful and meaningful lives, that their families may know loving persons of faith will always care for them.

17. Reelfoot Rural Ministries Sunday – October 22, 2017

Reelfoot Rural Ministries provides numerous spiritual and social services for low- income families, children and the elderly in rural northwest Tennessee and southwest Kentucky.

18. Partner's in Permanency – October 29, 2017

<u>Hannah's Hope</u>

A place to belong, to call home, to be loved "no matter what," is as essential to our emotional wellbeing as food, water and shelter is for our physical health. With the mission of "promoting permanency for children through strengthening commitment, planning and parenting," Hannah's Hope is striving to serve those children in the West Tennessee area who suffer from a lack of permanency. Through programs to enrich parenting skills and efforts to raise corporate consciousness to the need for "forever homes," many children will benefit and thrive.

Western Kentucky Family Services Inc.

A Christian ministry committed to providing a safe haven to foster children until they reach permanency. Both basic and therapeutic (children who are either medically fragile or who have severe acting out behaviors due to abuse and/or neglect) foster care are provided within the Purchase Region. The agency facilitates foster care adoptions and conducts international home studies for persons wanting to adopt children from other countries.

19. Memphis United Methodist Neighborhood Centers, December 3, 2017

Supports the work of the Neighborhood Centers in Memphis – a ministry of presence and support among the poor and marginalized.

20. World Hunger Offering, February 8 to April 26, 2017

MEMORIALS

OWEN EVERETT ROSEBERRY

November 28, 1930—May 18, 2015

Owen Everett Roseberry grew up during the depression in South Memphis as one of 6 children whose father was a school janitor. From the jokes and stories told and re told at family get together's, it made for an extremely loving and happy household. After receiving the call to preach, he attended Lambuth College in Jackson, Tennessee and then finished his Degree in Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia.

Over his lifetime, Everett would go by many names. He was called Pee Wee as a child, Everett as a husband, beloved Dad, Pop Pop to his grandchildren. But the name he loved to be called the most was Brother Everett. He truly LOVED being a pastor. Beginning his career in rural Kentucky, continuing



in rural West Tennessee, and finishing in Memphis, his career was characterized by his love of service in the community. He visited hospitals, nursing homes, shut-ins, as well as, the poor and needy as part of his daily routine. His passion in the pulpit was always based on his favorite verse, John 3:16. But some say he was most remembered for his famous Uncle Remus children's stories he told every Sunday night service. He was able to make "Ole' Brer Rabbit", "Brer Bear", and "Brer Fox" come alive to the children (adults loved them also) with a specific kind of moral at the end of each story.

Everett loved to vacation with his family and friends, often going to Florida to enjoy the beach. His specialty was body surfing in the waves, and he taught his children to enjoy this as well. He was known for trying all kinds of gadgets from "As Seen on TV", beginning with the famous Veg-O-Matic.

His love for people was overt and contagious, his love for everyday life was obvious each day, and his love for Jesus Christ was shared with all that would listen.

LENA GAIL HALEY STEWART

May 7, 1970 - May 23, 2015

Lena was born in Murray, Kentucky to Joe Rob and Barbara Haley. She grew up attending Independence and Temple Hill United Methodist Churches, where she was very active. In later years, she would return to these churches, (and Cole's Campground UMC) as a pastor's wife.

She attended Calloway County Schools up to her graduation in 1988, where she began attending Murray State University. In September of that year, she visited the Wesley Foundation at Murray State and met a young man from Russellville; they began dating on October 1, 1988. This same young man, would declare his call into the ministry to her, and later enter the ministry in the UMC in 2001.

Lena married David C. Stewart on March 7, 1992, and later in that year

moved to Russellville, KY, where she taught Head Start and Adult Education. In 1993, they began taking in foster children, and did this until 1996, when they moved to Campbellsville, KY. There, Lena served as a 3rd grade teacher in a Christian school.

After moving back to Murray, Lena joined Dave in the adventure of a lifetime as he entered the ministry in the UMC full time. The ministry took them from West Kentucky to the heart of the inner city in Memphis and finally to West Tennessee, very close to the edge of the Memphis Conference. In all of these appointments, Lena was an extremely important and active part of the ministry, from leading children's ministries to welcoming guests to different community meals. All during this time, she continued to nurture children through the foster care system, both as a foster parent and as a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) volunteer.

Children were Lena's life, and even though she never had any birth children of her own, there are many whose lives were touched by "Big Momma" (48 foster children alone). A rare form of colon cancer struck Lena's body in January, 2014, but it did not weaken her spirit. One of her last acts on this earth was going to Family Kitchen at Parsons First UMC so that she could "say goodbye" (a move was coming) to her special friends there. Lena completed her earthly journey one week later.

Lena is survived by husband, Rev. David C. Stewart of Union City, TN; a son, Christopher (Holly) and grandson, Zayden of Parsons, TN; her father, Joe Rob Haley, sister Karen Birdsong (Ronnie), brother, Alan (Tina), all of Almo, KY. Other survivors include David & Ruth Stewart (David's parents), Melissa and DeWayne Reynolds (David's sister), all of Russellville, KY; nieces Jessica (Joe) Barrett, Jennifer (Erik) Rhodes, LeeAnna Kondracki, Victoria (Duncan) Anderson, 5 great nephews and 3 great nieces. She is preceded in death by her mother Barbara Haley and nephew Jeremy Haley.

WILLIAM H. GRANBERRY, JR. August 7, 1929 – June 18, 2015 MARY JANE GRANBERRY

January 31, 1930 - May 12, 2016

William H. Granberry, Jr. (Bill) died on June 18, 2015, at the age of 85. Bill was born to William H. and Lena Granberry, Sr. and raised in Memphis, TN. He was active at Highland Heights Methodist Church where at the age of 17 he made the decision to enter the ministry of the Methodist Church. After graduating from Treadwell High School in 1947, he was granted a license as a local preacher. He attended Lambuth College in Jackson where he majored in English and graduated in 1951. Bill subsequently attended and earned his Masters of Divinity from Emory University.



Mary Jane Granberry died on May 12, 2016, at the age of 86. She was born to Walter W. and Mary Ellen Welden and raised in Atlanta, GA.

An only child, Mary Jane recalled fond memories of vacationing in Miami with transportation provided by Delta Air Corporation for whom her father worked as one of Delta's original aircraft mechanics. Mary Jane graduated from the University of Georgia and taught high school history before marrying William H. Granberry, Jr.

During the period as a seminary student in Atlanta, Bill met Mary Jane while singing in the choir at Capital View Methodist Church. Mary Jane described the meeting as "love at first hearing" after she heard him sing. They married as soon as Bill graduated from Emory and spent their "honeymoon" at the Memphis Annual Conference where Bill received his first appointment to Garland-New Salem-Elm Grove in 1954. After marrying, Mary Jane became a homemaker.

Bill went on to serve in the Memphis Annual Conference for over 35 years. He served at Greenfield, Hampton Memorial, Finley, Bemis - Lester's Chapel, Newbern - Church Grove, Grimes Memorial, Oakhaven, Adamsville First Ext. Ministry, Somerville First, Trinity - Antioch, and Browns. Additionally, he served on Lakeshore's Board of Trustees for several years and volunteered at the camp in other capacities. Bill's major interest was in Christian education and Bible teaching. He trained teachers throughout the conference and taught training schools in music. Bill retired from the Memphis Annual Conference in 1989.

After his retirement from the conference, Bill and Mary Jane moved to Venice, Florida. There they became active at Grace United Methodist Church where Bill served as the Associate Pastor until 1997, and taught the Wesleyan Adult Sunday School class for several years afterward.

Bill was very active in music ministry throughout his life. He worshiped in song with a deep bass voice. While in Venice, Bill and Mary Jane were members of the Exsultate Community Choir of South Sarasota County. In his spare time, Bill, like his father, enjoyed model railroading. He was also known to tell a joke or two. Mary Jane was very active in the UMW throughout her and Bill's time in the Memphis Conference and after retirement, in Venice. She was known for her loving kindness and thoughtfulness.

WILLIAM ROBERT MCCLARIN

May 8, 1933--August 13, 2015

William Robert McClarin was born in 1933 to Rev. Paul T. and Frances Miller McClarin. He graduated from Lambuth College in 1955 and the Memphis Theological Seminary / Candler School of Theology in 1962. He was married for 60 years to Sara Ramsey McClarin of Hopewell, TN. They had three children: Philip Stephen, Greg Alan and Rebecca Marie Owen.

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest Commandment." [Matthew 22:37-38] Bill loved the Church. He loved being in the church; preaching in the church; laughing and talking in the church. He loved worshipping at the church; promoting the church; reading and studying at the church. In



the times he wasn't in the church - he was out doing the church's work. He was visiting the sick and shut-ins, making hospital calls or conducting funerals. He was serving on District committees, or Memphis Conference committees, or General Board of Discipleship committees. Bill was a walking advertisement for the United Methodist Church.

Bill had 7 ancestors in his family lineage who were preachers, including his father, so the pressure was on to continue in the 'family business;' but there was some hesitancy at the beginning. Though try as he might to resist, he surrendered to the call in 1953. It was a good hire.

"It was He who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up." [Ephesians 4:11-12] John Wesley sent his young ministers off to the "new world" with three simple words, "Offer Them Christ." Well, Bill did! Across 12 appointments /15 churches and over 60 years of active ministry; including being Pastor Emeritus at Northside UMC for the past 15 years, which came after his 'retirement' in 2000; that lasted almost two months.

There were churches that made him cry when he left and there were churches that made him cry when he found out he was appointed there. (Many of his congregations shared these same emotions!) There were miles and miles of driving between 4-point charges, with little or no money to eat on, a 1/8th of a tank of gas, and a tire you needed to put air in after every service station.

On his Shiloh Circuit, there were churches where 24 attendees on a Sunday morning was a packed house! A church where the piano player, a teenager, knew only three hymns; and a church that almost doubled its membership during one revival with Professions of Faith / Baptisms.

At Sharon UMC, he was part of the Sharon Volunteer Fire Department. Bragging often that, "We never lost a lot! We drowned a bunch of houses; but we never lost a lot!" On his appointment to Reidland UMC in 1968, he was so excited to get started that he actually pried open one of the sanctuary windows because he hadn't yet received the church keys. He just wanted to stand in the pulpit and get the feel of the place. Among many other gifts, Reidland allowed his love of ping-pong to thrive. Not a board meeting or a trustees meeting was held unless it was adjourned at the ping-pong table. Reidland was also where Bill hosted a week-long revival with Rev. Clovis Chappell being the evangelist. Standing room only for every

Service and worship times were never posted because, "Clovis starts when he is ready and quits when he is finished." I don't know how many times we heard Bill say, "I got a seminary's worth of education that week just walking and talking with Rev. Chappell."

There were a couple of the churches Bill was appointed to strictly because; in the Cabinet's opinion, they were causing trouble and needed to be straightened out. In one of those; on just his second Sunday there, Bill had as one of the points in his sermon, "what this church needs is about 50 good 2016 Memphis Conference Journal

funerals." (You almost have to be a minister to see through the harshness of that statement to grasp its meaning and purpose.) That church ended up being one of his most successful appointments.

Among the many character traits Bill possessed was the knack of upsetting the status quo. He had the reputation of 'sticking up for the little guy' and butting-heads with some in the congregation that thought the church would just fold and disappear if they weren't running it. After appointing the church's first female Chairman of the Administrative Board in its 160 year history; a rather upset, long-standing member remarked, "You know Pastor, we have been on that Board for over 30 years!" To which Bill replied, "Wow that is quite a run. This will be just her first year."

Outside of his local churches, Bill spent several years travelling the country on New Life Missions for the General Board of Discipleship, delivering sermons from San Francisco to Miami. He served 26 years as a counselor or Director of Youth Camps at Lakeshore Methodist Assembly; helping to build up the next generation in the body of Christ. As for Conference responsibilities: District Youth Coordinator; District Secretary of Missions; Conference Board of Missions; Conference Commission on Equitable Salaries; Conference Board of Discipleship; Conference Board of Communications; Conference Board of Higher Education; Conference Commission on Insurance; Conference Committee on Nominations; and District Committees on Ordained Ministry.

Being a fanatical sports fan, Bill referred to his sports-related activities as "field mission work." He coached both his sons on various minor league and little league baseball, basketball and football teams. On one occasion, he got rather loud and over-enthusiastic as his minor league baseball team put together a last inning, come-from-behind, 10-run victory. During the celebration, a disgruntled fan from the losing team came up to him and stated, "Preacher; I sure am glad I'm not a member of your church!" which brought on the still too hyped-up and rather uncharacteristic retort, "I'm glad too!"

Bill lived an adventurous, God-directed, and God-inspired life. Whether baptizing an infant, or teaching young Confirmands about the amazing grace and wonderful love of Christ their Savior, or marrying a nervous couple, or holding the hand of a dying parishioner; Bill tried to fulfill his Godly calling to "Feed My Sheep" every day.

In the words of John Wesley's "Rule for Christian Living": Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, In all the ways you can, in all the places you can, At all the times you can, to all the people you can, For as long as you can.

Bill did! And we are very proud of Reverend William Robert McClarin. And we miss him greatly.

September 26, 1929 – January 9, 2016




He was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1952 and served throughout Europe during the Korean Conflict until 1954.

Scottie was born in 1951 in Charlotte, North Carolina. Though she was a William Randolph Hearst scholar at Duke University, she transferred to North Carolina State University, finishing with a bachelor's in science education. She and Wayne were married in 1973, followed quickly by a



move to New Orleans and then New York. During this time, she taught physical science, earth science, chemistry, physics, and biology at two different schools. Scottie and her family lived in Maine, Texas, and Oregon, settling in Memphis in 1988.

She became passionate about Christian education, becoming the superintendent of children's Sunday school at Christ United Methodist Church. This pursuit lead to a Master's Degree from Memphis Theological Seminary, and she was ordained as Deacon in the United Methodist Church. After seminary she was at the First United Methodist Church, where she served as the Minister of Spiritual Formation and the Executive Director of FirstWorks, a nonprofit serving low-income families, children, and individuals. We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Memphis Conference Treasurer's Office (a nonprofit organization) (the Conference), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2015 and 2014, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements. **Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits. We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our unmodified opinion on 2015 and our qualified audit opinion on 2014.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As of December 31, 2014 several real property locations owned by the Conference were not recorded in the financial statements because the cost has yet to be determined. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require real property to be recorded at cost if purchased and fair value if donated. The effects on the accompanying financial statements of that departure from those accounting principles are not reasonably determinable. However, the cost of each property were determine and were recorded in the financial statements as of December 31, 2015.

Unmodified Opinion on 2015 and Qualified Opinion on 2014

In our opinion, except for the possible effects on the 2014 financial statements of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Memphis Conference Treasurer's Office as of December 31, 2015 and 2014, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Note 1 Nature of Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

A. Nature of Operations

The Memphis Conference (the Conference) is a regional body of The United Methodist Church comprised of the lay members, clergy, and 400+ churches in West Tennessee and West Kentucky. The Conference is primarily responsible for all the ministries that are jointly provided by and for United Methodists in its geographic area. The Conference administers Conference operating and program funds that are received from churches, boards and agencies, and individuals of the conference in accordance with the budget and other directives of the Conference, the respective board and agencies and donors.

B. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

C. Financial Statement Presentation

The Conference follows the recommendations contained in the Presentation of Financial Statements, Not-For-Profit Entities topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification. Under those provisions, net assets and revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the absence or existence and nature of donorimposed restrictions as follows:

Unrestricted net assets - Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily restricted net assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Conference pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time.

Permanently restricted net assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may be maintained permanently by the Conference. Generally, the donors of such assets permit the Conference to use all or part of the income earned on the assets.

D. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumption that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

E. Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Conference defines its cash, designated cash and cash equivalents to include cash on hand, demand deposits, and commercial paper and other investments with initial maturities of three months or less whether those amounts are unrestricted or restricted.

F. Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in changes in net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized. However, if a donor contributes an investment required to be held in perpetuity, gains and losses on the investment are subject to the same permanent restriction unless the donor explicitly states otherwise (currently the Conference has no such investment).

G. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of financial assets and liabilities is measured according to the *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* topic of the FASS Accounting Standards Codification. Fair value is required to be evaluated and adjusted according to the following valuation techniques.

<u>Level 1</u> - Fair value is determined using quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities.

<u>Level 2</u> - Fair value is determined using quoted market prices in active markets for similar assets and liabilities.

<u>Level 3</u> - Fair value is determined using unobservable market prices in a market that is typically inactive.

H. Income Taxes

The Conference is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

I. Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable include apportionments received after year-end for the budget year ended December 31, 2015 and 2014. No allowance for doubtful collections has been recorded.

J. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are carried at cost if purchased and fair market value if donated. Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, excluding land, which are 3 to 40 years. Depreciation expenses for the year ended December 31, 2015 and 2014 was \$20,375 and \$24,081. Property includes land, building and improvements at the Conference Headquarters in Jackson TN.

K. Donated Services

Contributed services are reflected in the financial statements at the fair value of the services received only when those services either (1) create or enhance nonfinancial assets, or (b) require specialized skills that are provided by individuals possessing those skills and would typically need to be purchase if not provided by donation. Unpaid volunteers make contributions of time in various administrative and program functions. The Conference has not valued these donations.

L. Revenue and Support

Contributions are received and recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.

The primary source of support is Apportionments received from local churches in the Conference. Apportionments expire at the end of each calendar year and, therefore, have been recorded as unrestricted support. Contributions and Other Revenue are primarily receipts by programs that have external sources of revenue such as registration fees or reimbursements.

M. Functional Allocation of Expenses

Expenses are charged directly to program. Management and general, or fundraising based on a combination of specific identification and allocation by management.

N. Prepaid Items

Certain payments to vendors reflect costs applicable to future accounting periods and are recorded as prepaid items.

Note 4 Concentration of Risk

The Conference had bank deposits in a financial institution that were \$3,529,700 and \$3,988,059 in excess of the \$250,000 insured by the Federal Depository Insurance Corporation (FDIC) at December 31. 2015 and 2014.

Note 5 Notes Payable

The Conference has a promissory note of \$500,000 dated August 25, 2000 with United Methodist Development Fund of Tennessee/Kentucky, Inc. There were four modification and extension agreements made to the note. Under the most recent modification and extension agreement, the note is to bear interest of 5.95% from July 1, 2010 until July 1, 2012. Beginning on July 1, 2012 and on the same day every 24th month thereafter until maturity, the note will bear interest at a new fixed rate to be established by the United Methodist Development Fund Board. The note matures on July 1, 2020. The note was paid in full as of December 31, 2015.

Note 6 Operating Leases

On July 17, 2015, the Conference entered into a lease agreement with NovaCopy for their copier. The agreement is for 63 months, with monthly payments of \$935. On January 19, 2011, the Conference entered into a lease agreement with MailFinance Inc. for a postage meter. The agreement is for 63 months, with monthly payments of \$195. Note 7 Pension Plans

The Conference provides pension benefits for clergy serving churches in the Memphis Conference under Episcopal appointment, and full-time permanent staff of the Conference through various retirement plans. All plans are multi-employer plans administered by the General Board of Pension and Health Benefits of The United Methodist Church (GBOPHB). GBOPHB operates under the authority of the church's General Conference and implements the plans in accordance with plan documents. Pension benefits for clergy are a combination of defined benefit and defined contribution plans. Pension benefits for Conference lay staff are all defined contribution to all

plans for the years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014 were \$1,888,611 and \$1,870,623. The various retirement plans are listed below:

<u>Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP)</u>:

CRSP is a multi-employer 403(b) retirement plan that provides pension coverage to eligible clergy. CRSP is both a defined benefit plan, which provides benefits based on years of credited service and a defined contribution plan, which provides a retirement account balance established and funded by the Conference. Effective 1/1/2014, contributions to the defined benefit plan are actuarially determined and contributions to the defined contribution plan equal 2% of the clergy's, monthly compensation, plus a matching contribution of up to 1% of the clergy's compensation, for a maximum of 3%.

Supplement One to CRSP (Pre-1982):

Pre-1982 is a multi-employer 403(b) defined benefit plan for Conference clergy entering service prior to 1982. General Conference 2000 required each annual conference to adopt a formal funding plan to retire the Conference pre-1982 pension obligations. The Conference's Pre-1982 plan has been fully funded. The Conference approves a minimum distribution (past service rate) each year for participants in the Pre-1982 plan, based on a recommendation by the Conference Board of Pensions. The PSR for the year ended December 31, 2015 and 2014 was \$575 and \$560 for pre-1982 service years, which is

.89% and .88% of the Conference average compensation respectively.

United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP):

The UMPIP is a multi-employer 403(b) defined contribution plan providing eligible clergy and employees of the Conference with retirement savings. Conference employees and clergy may contribute up to the dollar limits set by current Internal Revenue Service regulations under both pre-tax and after-tax elections. The Conference makes no contribution to the plan for clergy. The Conference contributes an amount equal to 9% of its eligible lay employee's compensation to the plan.

Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP)

CPP is a multi-employer health and welfare plan that provides death and disability benefits as well as other supplemental benefits to eligible clergy and their beneficiaries. CPP is funded by the Conference at a rate of 3% of compensation.

Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP)

MPP covers clergy who served from 1982 through 2006. It is a multi-employer defined contribution plan, but differs from a true defined contribution plan in that upon retirement, participants must annuitize at least 65% of their account balances, and the Conference is responsible for funding the annuities should the need arise. Upon annuitization, the monthly benefit becomes a defined benefit.

Amounts designated for pension contributions that have been transferred to the legal title of the GBOPHB multi-employer plans are not included as net assets of the Conference. As of December 31, 2015 and 2014 the remaining GBOPHB multi-employer plans were valued as follows:

Note 8 Health Care Plan

healthcare cost trend

The Conference sponsors the Group Insurance Program of the Memphis Annual Conference (GIP). The GIP is open to all eligible plan participants including clergy, full-time Conference staff, designated part- time local pastors and their respective dependents. The Conference Treasurer is the plan administrator. The plan administrator uses a third-party administrator for processing claims and other duties but retains responsibility for benefits payable. The GIP is a self-funded plan paying covered benefits out of Conference assets. Plan participant help cover some costs of covered benefits through contributions, deductibles and out-of-pocket expenses. The Conference has been operating on a pay-as-you-go system. Conference payments to the GIP for the years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014 were \$3,794,787 and \$3,719,472.

A liability (Unfunded Postretirement Benefit Obligation) has been recognized representing the underfunded status of the Conference GIP in the amount of \$27,793,354 and \$26,705,978 as of December 31, 2015 and 2014.

During fiscal year ended December 31, 2015, the Conference was able to determine the value of the properties listed below. A restatement of \$25,897 was made to the financial statement as of December 31, 2015 to reflect the net value of these properties:

In prior years the Conference reported a liability of \$237,35 (2013) and \$226,354 (2014) for the amount of apportionments designated for the ministerial pension plans that had been received but not yet transferred to the pension plan investments. It has been determined that this was a transfer from the general bank account to the pension bank account only and should not affect the pension expense. The effect of the change for the year ended December 31, 2014 increased the Net Assets Designated for Pension \$237,350, reduced the liabilities \$226,354 and increased the pension expenses for the year \$10,996.

In prior years the Conference included Ministerial Education Net Assets as Unrestricted - Designated for other purposes, however it was determined that the Ministerial Education should be included with temporarily restricted net assets IAW The Book of Discipline para.816 stating that 25% of Ministerial Education revenue from apportionments shall be retained by the annual conference and administered by the Board of Ordained Ministry. The Funds are to be used to fund seminary education grants for approved students and for continuing education needs of ordained clergy. The effect of the change for the year ended December 31, 2014 had zero net effect, it was reclassified which increased the Temporarily Restricted Net Assets by \$630,996 and decreased the Net Assets Designated for Other Purposes by \$630,996.
