## MEMPHIS CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

## RULES OF ORDER

1. The procedure of the Annual Conference shall be governed by the Rules of Order of the preceding General Conference insofar as they apply; otherwise Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall apply except
a. that those present and voting shall be a quorum for the Annual Conference and its subordinate bodies,
b. where the Book of Discipline provides otherwise and
c. when the final report of CF/A is before the Conference, up to twenty minutes of debate and Christian Conferencing shall be provided before the call of the previous question may be entertained by the chair.
d. the agenda for an Annual Conference may include a consent calendar which may contain the reports of designated conference agencies and any business matter of the conference. A majority vote of the conference delegates present may remove one or more items from the consent agenda for separate consideration by the Annual Conference.
e. through the bishop's leadership and in consultation with the extended cabinet, the sessions and agenda of the annual conference shall reflect the spirit and nature of Wesleyan conferencing and shall reflect alignment with the stated mission of the Memphis Conference. (Mission Statement adopted June 2014). ๆ605.2
2. There shall be a Committee on Rules, composed of three lay persons and three clergy persons, to be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations, provided that, in addition, the Conference Chancellor shall serve as Chairperson and the Conference Secretary shall serve as an ex-officio member without vote.

## The Committee on Rules shall:

a. receive proposals for new Standing Rules and/or modifications of present rules.
b. propose new Standing Rules and/or modifications in present rules.
c. provide interpretation to the Annual Conference at points where Annual Conference action may be in variance with Standing Rules.
3. The Standing Rules may, by a two-thirds vote, be amended on the next day after an amendment has been presented in writing. The rule fixing the number of districts may be amended by a majority vote, provided that no change in the number of districts may be made later than the morning of the second day of the Annual Conference session.

## Organization and Procedure

4. There shall be four districts in the Memphis Conference.
5. The bishop, or the bishop's designee, in consultation with the extended cabinet, will lead a mission strategy team (or operational team) to direct the mission and align the resources of the conference with the mission. The mission strategy team will promote effective strategies with and among districts and congregations to accomplish the mission. The mission strategy team will monitor and report progress toward accomplishing the mission.
6. The Memphis Annual Conference shall have a conference personnel committee chaired by the bishop, or the bishop's designee, that will be responsible for all conference personnel policies and procedures, unless the UM Book of Disciplines specifies otherwise. Membership of the committee, not including the chair, shall consist of equal number of clergy and laity members. The personnel committee shall be responsible to staff the conference to purse the mission. The personnel committee shall be responsible for conference job descriptions, employment, and supervision.
7. The secretary of the Annual Conference shall be responsible for editing and publishing the Conference Journal and is authorized to contract for its printing, subject to the approval of the Council on Finance and Administration, and to draw upon the Conference Treasurer for this expense.
8. Conference Membership:
a. Lay Members and Reserve Lay Members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually by the Charge Conference. Two additional lay members, one young person between the ages of twelve and seventeen and one young person between the ages of eighteen and thirty years of age, as required by The Discipline, shall be elected by each District Council on Ministries.
b. The membership, clergy and lay, shall be those persons who meet the qualifications for membership of the Annual Conference as set forth in Paragraph 602 of The Book of Discipline, 2012.
c. A charge shall elect an additional lay member for each 500 members or fraction thereof above 1000, provided that a charge shall elect a number of lay members that at least equals the number of clergy members appointed to that charge. The Conference Secretary will determine the churches which qualify under these provisions and notify the District Superintendent in time for election by the Fall Charge Conference.
d. When additional lay members are needed to make an equal balance between lay and clergy membership, the cabinet will assign to each district the number of additional lay members subject to election by the Charge Conference of the church in which that lay person holds membership.

## 9. Required Reports:

a. The Council on Finance and Administration shall furnish to the Conference Treasurer's office, as early in the year as possible, an official copy of the Conference budget.
b. By January 1 of each year, each District Superintendent shall furnish the Conference Treasurer an official itemized copy of the pastors' minimum compensation package for that year as set by the Charge Conferences. The total will be delineated by: base salary, travel and professional expenses, utilities and household allowance. An asterisk will indicate that the charge pays the group health insurance premium. A (p) will indicate a parsonage is provided, (h) will indicate a housing allowance and the amount will be noted, and (-) will indicate that no parsonage or housing allowance is provided.
10. The Conference Secretary shall be the custodian of records. The Conference Secretary shall keep a service record of all clergy members and diaconal ministers and shall publish this report in the Journal.
11. The Conference shall select from among its members a Conference Historian who shall record a detailed personal history of each clergy member in a suitable book for future reference.
12. Nominations and Resolutions:
a. Nominations:

1) The conference nominating committee, chaired by the bishop or the bishop's designee, shall discover, enlist, and nominate leaders to populate the organizational structure of the conference to advance the conference's stated mission to discover, equip, connect, and send lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world one neighborhood at a time. The conference nominating committee will nominate to the annual conference this body of quadrennial leaders. The conference nominating committee will nominate on an annual basis to fill vacancies or to expand the work of committees, boards, and councils. $\$ 608.3$
2) The Committee shall nominate from time to time the members of the boards, commissions and standing committees of the Annual Conference, unless such nomination is otherwise provided for in the Discipline, and shall make such other nominations from time to time that may be required by the Annual Conference. Each Conference board, commission, committee, etc., shall keep a record of attendance at its meetings. This record of attendance will be filed with the Conference Program Ministry Team office and be available to assist this committee to correctly make its nominations.
3) Vacancies in officers and elected members of the Connectional Ministry Team (CMT) may be filled until the next Annual Conference by the Connectional Ministry Team, upon nomination of the CMT Committee on Personnel. Vacancies occurring in other positions, for which the Committee on Nominations would ordinarily make a nomination, may be filled at the direction of the Chairperson of the Committee on Nominations until the next session of the Annual

Conference. The Chairperson may exercise the prerogative to poll the Committee on Nominations by means other than a called meeting of the Committee.
4) The Conference Secretary shall nominate persons to serve on the Committee on the Journal Minutes and the Bishop shall nominate the members of the Committee on Courtesy. The members of these committees shall be elected during the organizational session of the Annual Conference.
5) Nominations of trustees for Methodist LeBonheur Healthcare Systems, Inc., and Reelfoot Rural Ministries, Inc., UM Neighborhood Centers, Wesley Foundations, Hannah's Hope and West KY Family Services shall come through the Conference Work Areas/Boards to which they are related and to the Conference Committee on Nominations for presentation to the Annual Conference.

## b. Resolutions:

1) There shall be a Conference Committee on Resolutions composed of eight members, four lay persons and four clergy whose responsibility will be to receive, to study and to present such petitions and resolutions to the Annual Conference. This committee is to be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and is to be elected quadrennially.
2) All resolutions shall be submitted to the Committee on Resolutions at least thirty (30) days prior to the first day of the Annual Conference session. The Chair shall present to the Annual Conference, in their original form, all resolutions so submitted. In addition, the Committee may present to the Annual Conference for consideration a revised version of any such resolution.
13. The District Superintendents shall constitute the Committee on Memoirs. A memorial service for deceased members of the Annual Conference and their spouses shall be held during each regular session of the Annual Conference.
14. Moving date for pastors will be set by the Bishop and Cabinet on or before April $1^{\text {st }}$.

## The Ministry

## 15. Pastors' Report:

a. The pastor of the local church shall complete, each January, the Local Church Report to the Annual Conference for the preceding year. The report will be submitted according to the instructions of the Conference Statistician.
b. The pastor will see that a copy of the annual Local Church Report to the Annual Conference is retained by the local church and saved as a permanent record.
16. Pastors, other than student pastors, who receive salary support from the Conference Commission on Equitable Compensation, are required to reside within the bounds of the charge to which they are appointed and render full time service unless the exception is unanimously approved by the cabinet.

## Financial

17. No resolution, report, motion or enabling act which involves a monetary obligation on the Conference shall be passed until it has been submitted to the Council on Finance and Administration and its recommendation has been reported to the Annual Conference. In the first business session of the Annual Conference, the report of CFA shall be presented for information only. As Conference agencies make reports and budgetary requests, the concurrence or non-concurrence of CFA must be stated. If the Conference approves an agency budget request which is at variance with CFA's recommendation, that action shall constitute an automatic amendment to CFA's report. When CFA's report is the "order of the day" for approval as a whole, any previous Conference action amending that report shall be sustained without need for further amendment of the report, though amendment to CFA's report may be permitted.
18. The Conference Treasurer will close the books on such date as the Council on Finance and Administration shall designate but not later than January 15. At the closing of the books, all unobligated funds shall be transferred to the Conference Reserve Fund.
19. The Council on Finance and Administration will provide in the Conference budget an amount for conducting Annual Conference.
20. Unless the bishop and cabinet, in consultation with the new church development team, determine that exceptional circumstances exist:

After the payment of any current year apportionments the proceeds from any local church property sales resulting in closure or abandonment and the proceeds from the sale of district or annual conference real property shall be designated as follows:
a. $75 \%$ for planting new communities of faith in the Memphis Conference, allocated at the discretion of the new church development team, and
b. $25 \%$ for planting new communities of faith or the revitalization of existing churches in the district.

This statement shall be included in resolutions for closures of congregations, unless otherwise restricted by property deeds.

## Boards and Commissions

21. All Quadrennial Conference agencies shall meet within 10 days of the Annual Conference at which they are elected to organize and report their officers to the Conference Secretary.
22. The tenure of all elected officers of the Conference and all members of its boards, commissions and committees, except the Conference Historian and members of the Commission on Archives and History, shall be limited to two consecutive quadrenniums, unless otherwise provided in The Discipline. This shall not apply to the Conference Lay Leader's previous service on the Board of Laity.
23. Conference reports and motions:
a. All Conference agencies making reports to be voted upon by the Annual Conference shall complete their reports in time to have them in the Conference Connectional Ministries office in time for distribution to the Conference members. Any such item of business not so submitted must be in the hands of the members of the Conference at least twentyfour hours before consideration or receive a three-quarters vote of the house before consideration.
b. All reports, petitions, motions and resolutions presented to the Annual Conference shall be in the hands of the Conference Secretary in triplicate on forms provided by the secretary.
c. Any motion made from the floor of the Conference for the purpose of initiating or altering a matter for consideration (initial motion, amendment or substitute) which affects the Conference churches must be provided to the chair in writing. Such motion will be read from the chair, and the written version shall be considered the official version for the purposes of voting and for the recorded minutes.

On behalf of the Board of Ordained Ministry, I'm honored to bring our report on behalf of the women and men, lay and clergy, who do this important work on behalf of the annual conference. Will all members of the Board of Ordained Ministry please stand? Please join me in thanking these servants for being faithful stewards to the important work charged to this body.

1. The work of aligning our processes and procedures with the Tennessee Conference and administered through the Nashville Area Office of Ministerial Concerns continued this year, with the launch of an Area-wide Licensing School for Local Pastors. Together with our Residents in Ministry, our collaborative efforts with our Area partners remains ever fruitful. # BOARD OF PENSIONS AND CLERGY WELLNESS 

Rev. Dr. Scott Alford, Chairperson

## Part A

The Board of Pension and Health Benefits continues its ministry of serving the clergy and clergy families of the Memphis Conference, and we are grateful for the chance to share together in this work. We are especially delighted to work alongside Larry Davis, our Conference Treasurer, and Clare Wilson, our Assistant Treasurer. It's always evident that they are committed to their ministry with the conference, and, as a board, we will forever be thankful for their service.

This past year, we have continued our trajectory of ensuring a financially stable and beneficial funding of our pension and insurance programs. To protect our assets, the work of incorporation moves forward, and bank deposits have been adjusted to better cover any funds over FDIC insured limits. The reserves we hold with Wespath and the United Methodist Foundation for the Memphis and Tennessee Conferences are routinely monitored so as to be good stewards of the funds committed to those who have served and continue to serve this conference faithfully.

We are pleased that the funding status for all pension plans are funded in full. There has also been an economic study completed to provide us with necessary information to better determine effective reserve levels for our accounts. Again, we work hard to ensure that our pension plans are financially stable.

In October, we held a Clergy Benefits Seminar in partnership with Methodist Healthcare to educate our clergy on available benefits through Wespath as well as other items related to retirement and taxes. We hope to plan another similar event in the future.

Moving forward into this next year, we understand that talks of merger with the Tennessee Conference and the forthcoming report from the Commission on a Way Forward will be important conversation topics in our work. Rest assured, we will provide whatever guidance we can to these endeavors.

## Part B

Allowances to Retirees
Regarding allowances for the benefit of retired ministers, the Conference Board of Pension and Health Benefits recommends the following:

That ministers retired prior to the opening session of a regular annual conference shall receive an allowance at the rate of up to $\$ 75.00$ per day effective June 3,2012 for each day in attendance at the conference. Reimbursement shall be authorized by the Board of Pension and Health Benefits upon receipt of a voucher showing the actual expense incurred. This benefit shall be available also to surviving spouses, subject to the same conditions.

That upon retirement, full-time active ministers in regular appointment will receive a one-time retirement stipend in the amount of \$1,500 effective January 1, 2011.

That upon retirement, part-time active ministers in regular appointment will receive a one-time retirement stipend proportional to their appointment percentage at retirement in the amount of $\$ 1,125$ ( $75 \%$ ), $\$ 750$ ( $50 \%$ ), and $\$ 375$ (25\%) effective July 1, 2014.

Those full-time, active members in regular appointment may receive the retirement one-time stipend at the time of taking disability leave in lieu of receiving it at the time of retirement.

Beginning January 1, 2017, retirees and spouses on their plan receive a defined contribution of $\$ 250$ per month (\$3000 annually) through a Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) and are allowed to participate in the Medicare Supplement program called One Exchange. The One Exchange program is available through Wespath, though it is operated by Towers-Watson. Retirees/Spouses may use their HRA accounts to pay premiums or help with deductibles or copays. To qualify for the retiree subsidy, the retiree must have served a minimum of 20 years in a full-time appointment (local church, campus ministries, or under appointment to an entity accruing pension benefits) in the Memphis Conference or other conference in the case of one who has transferred from another conference. The retiree subsidy
program has been terminated for future retirees. To allow future retirees adequate time to plan for retiree medical expenses the cut-off age is 60 . Everyone who was 60 years of age or older as of July 1,2016, with 20 years of service as defined above would remain eligible for the retiree medical subsidy.

Part D
Resolutions Relating to Rental/Housing Allowances for Retired, Disabled, or Former Clergypersons of The Memphis Conference
(Revision effective January 1, 2014)
The Memphis Conference (the "Conference") adopts the following resolutions relating to rental/housing allowances for active, retired, terminated, or disabled clergypersons of the Conference:

WHEREAS, the religious denomination known as The United Methodist Church (the "Church"), of which this Conference is a part, has in the past functioned and continues to function through ministers of the gospel (within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code section 107) who were or are duly ordained, commissioned, or licensed ministers of the Church ("Clergypersons");
WHEREAS, the practice of the Church and of this Conference was and is to provide active Clergypersons with a parsonage or a rental/housing allowance as part of their gross compensation;
WHEREAS, pensions or other amounts paid to active, retired, terminated, and disabled Clergypersons are considered to be deferred compensation and are paid to active, retired, terminated, and disabled Clergypersons in consideration of previous active service; and
WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized the Conference (or its predecessors) as an appropriate organization to designate a rental/housing allowance for Clergypersons who are or were members of this Conference and are eligible to receive such deferred compensation;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT an amount equal to $100 \%$ of the pension, severance, or disability payments received from plans authorized under The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church (the "Discipline"), which includes all such payments from Wespath during the period January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019, by each active, retired, terminated, or disabled Clergyperson who is or was a member of the Conference, or its predecessors, be and hereby is designated as a rental/housing allowance for each such Clergyperson; and
THAT the pension, severance, or disability payments to which this rental/housing allowance designation applies will be any pension, severance, or disability payments from plans, annuities, or funds authorized under the Discipline, including such payments from Wespath and from a commercial annuity company that provides an annuity arising from benefits accrued under a Wespath plan, annuity, or fund authorized under the Discipline, that result from any service a Clergyperson rendered to this Conference or that an active, a retired, a terminated, or a disabled Clergyperson of this Conference rendered to any local church, annual conference of the Church, general agency of the Church, other institution of the Church, former denomination that is now a part of the Church, or any other employer that employed the Clergyperson to perform services related to the ministry of the Church, or its predecessors, and that elected to make contributions to, or accrue a benefit under, such a plan, annuity, or fund for such an active, a retired, a terminated, or a disabled Clergyperson's pension, severance, or disability plan benefit as part of his or her gross compensation.

NOTE: The rental/housing allowance that may be excluded from a Clergyperson's gross income in any year for federal (and, in most cases, state) income tax purposes is limited under Internal Revenue Code section 107(2), and regulations thereunder, to the least of: (a) the amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the Clergyperson's employer or other appropriate body of the Church (such as this Conference in the foregoing resolutions) for such year; (b) the amount actually expended by the Clergyperson to rent or provide a home in such year; or (c) the fair rental value of the home, including furnishings and appurtenances (such as a garage), plus the cost of utilities in such year. Each clergyperson or former clergyperson is urged to consult with his or her own tax advisor to determine what deferred compensation is eligible to be claimed as a housing allowance exclusion.

The 2019 Past Service Rate (PSR) is \$624, which represents a $1.9 \%$ cost of living adjustment. The Board of Pension and Health Benefits has adopted the policy to update the PSR based on the rate of change in the Conference Average Compensation.

Wespath's actuarial valuation of the Pre-82 plan for the Memphis Conference shows more assets than benefit obligations. We anticipate no additional deposits into this account in the near future.

## Part G CRSP Eligibility and UMPIP Contributions for Part-Time Clergy

The Clergy Retirement Security Plan (CRSP) is for full time clergy under Episcopal appointment within the bounds of The Memphis Annual Conference. The United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) is for all clergy, including those serving less than full time, under Episcopal appointment within the bounds of The Memphis Conference.

Effective January 1, 2014, the Memphis Conference has elected to cover only clergy serving full time under the Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP). The Memphis Conference will contribute to the United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) on behalf of clergy who are no longer covered under CRSP. Clergy who are serving threequarter, half-time or one-quarter time will receive a contribution in the amount of $6 \%$ of plan compensation to their UMPIP accounts.

## Part H <br> Active Clergy Health Insurance

The Memphis Conference offers two medical plans...the B1000 Gold plan, which is a PPO plan, and the High Deductible Plan (HDHP) H1500. The main difference is the choice between having a lower premium and higher deductibles and paying a little more premium for lower upfront costs. The HDHP allows the participant an opportunity to set up a Health Savings Account which can provide significant tax and retirement benefits. Dental and vision coverage are also available from Health Flex, and these coverages are optional. Each year, the participant must select in which plan they wish to be enrolled. Should no plan be selected, the participant will automatically be enrolled in the HDHP.

Health Flex requires mandatory participation for all full-time clergy appointed to local churches and conference entities (DS, campus ministries, new churches, etc.). Part-time clergy ( $75 \%$ and below) are no longer eligible for conference health insurance. Mandatory requirement simply means that all appointed clergy will be included, and their church will receive a bill for the premium unless the clergyperson chooses to opt-out of the coverage. The individual clergyperson may opt-out for one of the following reasons:
a. Coverage from a previous employer
b. Covered by spouse's plan
c. Covered under Tricare
d. Covered by Medicaid
e. Insurance is deemed unaffordable under ACA rules. If the annual cost of the single rate (\$176 per month) exceeds $9.5 \%$ of the Adjusted Gross Income the coverage is deemed unaffordable. Our insurance is affordable for those making at least minimum compensation.

The cost of the health insurance premiums will be billed to the local church. Churches are billed for $100 \%$ of the premiums and are expected pay $80 \%$ of those premiums from church budget and collect the $20 \%$ balance by withholding from the clergyperson's salary on a pre-tax basis. Since dental and vision are optional coverages, they may be withheld from the clergyperson's salary in full or paid at the same rate as the medical premiums on a pre-tax basis.

The due date for submitting premium payments is the $25^{\text {th }}$ of each month, and a $2 \%$ late fee will be added for payments received after the due date. Insurance may be subject to cancellation after 90 days of nonpayment.

Medical insurance premiums for next year will increase $4.2 \%$, and dental premiums will increase $1.9 \%$. There will be no change to vision premiums. The tables below list 2019 premiums.

## COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR Fiscal Year 2019

I. The Council on Finance and Administration concurs with the Connectional Ministries Team regarding conference and general church special day observances. We also concur with the special day designated offerings.
II. We recommend that only under emergency conditions, as determined by the CFA in consultation with the bishop and the cabinet, shall funds be borrowed from an outside lender for current expenses. The maximum such borrowing shall be $\$ 250,000$ (two hundred fifty thousand dollars).
III. The CFA recommends that it be authorized to act on requests for funds in those situations in which budgeted funds, as approved by the conference, are inadequate to meet emerging missional needs or unforeseen circumstances. Those requests which are approved shall be funded from the Conference Reserve Fund, and the amounts of the funding shall be reported to the conference (2016 Discipline p.612.7).
IV. We advise all agencies that the conference treasurer will be instructed to issue funds only up to the amount of the projected income for each fund for the year. Salary items shall be paid at full budgeted amounts, but the amounts remaining in the budgets after salaries are funded will be expended only up to the projected percentage of apportioned amounts that will be collected. Each group is responsible for proper allocation of its funds for the year, and no funds will be issued when the projected income ceiling has been reached, without prior approval of the Council on Finance and Administration.
V. We recommend approval of the Reserve Fund report of the Council on Finance and Administration. We further recommend acceptance of the audit report from the conference's certified public accountant for 2017, and that the audit for 2018 be submitted no later than May 31, 2019.
VI. We recommend that all conference-authorized travel be reimbursed as follows:

VIII. All who are requesting funds of the conference for 2020 are asked to have their requests, in writing, to the conference treasurer by March 1, 2019. We request full disclosure of the expenditures of the groups for 2018, and budget projections for the expenditures for 2019 funds.
IX. We request that each district, through its district superintendent, submit to the CFA by March $1^{\text {st }}, 2019$, a copy of the budgets for those funds that are apportioned and administered within the bounds of the district. An audit of the funds handled during the year 2018 is requested by the spring 2019 meeting of the CFA. We recommend following, as far as applicable: the outline of the General Council on Finance \& Administration's Local Church Audit Form or, if performed by a certified public accountant, to the Standards of Review of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.
X. We would remind all conference entities of the provision in the 2016 Discipline, paragraph 614.5.a, which disallows special conference-wide funds appeals without prior approval of the Annual Conference upon CFA's recommendation.
XI. All items added to the conference budget at the annual conference session will become a part of the year's budget under consideration, and will not be taken from the Conference Reserve Fund.
XII. The Director of the Conference Connectional Ministries Team and/or the Annual Conference Treasurer or their assigns shall serve as an ex-officio member of all special study committees authorized by the annual conference session.
XIII. The Conference Treasurer shall execute the policies established by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, and in consultation with the Conference Investment Coordinating Committee, regarding the investment of funds and the regulation of cash flow.
a. All funds shall be invested following the Guidelines of the General Council on Finance and . Administration wherever they may be relevant or applicable.
b. The objectives for the investment of conference funds shall include: (1)

The preservation of the principal value of the investment
(2) The investment should provide a reasonable rate of return
(3) The investment should be invested, so far as is practical, with those agencies whose management policies are consistent with the Social Creed of the United Methodist Church.
c. The Treasurer shall report annually to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration the location and amounts of invested funds, and the earnings gained.
XIV. Moving expenses for those hired or appointed as district superintendents, CMT staff members, campus ministers, or CFA staff members will be paid by the conference. These payments will not include amounts for storage, packing materials or labor to pack.
a. Local churches may not reimburse a minister's professional expenses more than two months ahead of the prorated budget amount at any given time.
b. Expenses from January 1 to June 30 in any given year may not exceed $1 / 2$ of the total annual budget amount for reimbursable expenses.

## BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS

I. We recommend that the 2019 salary of each district superintendent, the program ministries director, and the conference treasurer be $\$ 85,000$. (Treasurer salary will also include an amount equal to DS housing). We recommend that travel expenses for these positions be reported monthly by voucher for reimbursement. The Superintendent's housing allowance shall be $\$ 30,000$..
III. We recommend that the budget as presented in the "CFA Recommendation" column on the budget summary page of this document be approved, and that the fiscal year be designated as $1 / 1 / 2019$ through $12 / 31 / 2019$.

## TITHING/DIRECT BILL RECOMMENDATIONS

I. We recommend the conference budget for 2019 be based on $10 \%$ Line 52 of the 2017 statistical report.
II. We recommend that all churches remit 10\% of annual budget income as defined by line 52 which includes: Payment of pledges toward budget/annual spending plan

- Receipts in support of the annual budget/spending plan - Interest on accounts used to support annual budget
- Funds received from facility rental or sale of church owned assets (i.e.
furniture) • Funds received from fundraisers used in support of annual budget
III. Income for the tithe formula does not include:
- Receipts from capital campaigns or interest from previous years'
campaign - Receipts from memorials, endowments or bequest
- Receipts from sale of church owned land
- Receipts for benevolent causes such as Special Sunday offerings or designated donations given by individuals (pass through donations)
IV. To be considered a Tithing church, churches must remit their tithe monthly and remit at least $10 \%$ of line 52 on the 2019 statistical report.
V. Pension responsibility for a those who are serving in a clergy appointment whether fulltime or part-time, shall be allocated to the church, board, institution, or agency for which he or she is serving. The Direct Bill amounts for 2019 are:
? Fulltime $11 \%$ of plan compensation (Salary plus Housing) Part-time 6\% of plan compensation
? Unpaid balances will be carried over at the end of the year
VI. We remind all pastors that the 2016 Discipline (par. 340.2(c)(2)(f) requires that all finances of the local church are to be reported to the conference
VII. The Conference Treasurer will close the 2018 books on by close of business on January $10^{\text {th }}$ 2019.

school, Orientation to Ministry, Healthy Boundaries training)
- Clergy Spiritual Life Retreat combined to serve both conferences
- Area wide Hispanic Ministries team
- Area wide Archives and History team
- Area wide New Church Development team
- Annual conference sessions have worshiped and learned around the same themes and speakers,

Whereas: After successful alignment efforts demonstrated increased focus, efficiency and fruitfulness, an advisory team was identified to further pursue what benefits and challenges would be presented by formation of a new conference to include all geographic areas of the current Memphis and Tennessee Conferences,

Whereas: Bishop McAlilly, along with other conference leaders, led 18 district sessions for clergy and laity across the Memphis and Tennessee Conferences to offer information which had been compiled by the advisory team, and

If each conference votes in 2019 to approve such plan(s), including a motion for approval to the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference in 2020, and if those are passed, we would meet as a fully unified new annual conference in 2021.
4. That in the 2018-2019 conference year, the Memphis and Tennessee Conferences continue the process of alignment in any additional areas where there might be a benefit to both conferences.
5. That the advisory team continue its work on two main items listed below needing more clarification, with quarterly reports during the 2018-2019 conference year.
a. The methodology used to pay for the conference budget, including health and pensions costs.
b. A decision regarding utilization of one health care provider for both conferences.
6. That the advisory team complete its study and offer its findings on these and any other remaining items no later than the 2019 annual conferences.

## BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Erv Walker, Chair

The Purpose of the Board of Trustees is to receive, hold in trust, buy and sell real and personal property and to invest funds, if any, as prescribed in The Book of Discipline, 2016, Section IV. Annual Conference Property, $\boldsymbol{\Pi}$ 2512.1-8, in the name of and on behalf of the Memphis Annual Conference. Additionally, pursuant to $\mathbb{T} 2517$ Responsibilities of Annual Conference Trustees Related to Health and Welfare Institutions, the Conference Trustees have the responsibility of establishing and maintaining statements of relationship between the Conference and related health and welfare organizations within the bounds of the Conference.

The Board of Trustees has two regular meetings each year, spring and fall. The board also routinely conducts business via e-mail and phone conferences in order to minimize the impact of time and travel on the board members as well as to be effective and timely in its work.
The Board of Trustees oversees and/or contributes to the maintenance of five properties on behalf of the conference and provides assistance to the districts in completing property transactions approved by prior Annual Conference resolutions. It provides guidance and information as requested in matters pertaining to the full range of former and current property issues.

The Trustees hold the following campus ministry facilities: Murray State University Wesley Foundation, University of Memphis Wesley Foundation and University of Tennessee-Martin Wesley Foundation and Director's parsonage.

The Trustees voted to approve a property management and brokerage program with A. Anthony Corporation to effectively manage discontinued and abandoned churches across the Conference.

The Trustees budget proposal of $\$ 71,000$ for 2019 was submitted to CF\&A.

## EQUITABLE COMPENSATION COMMISSION

Martha Dell King, Chair

The purpose of the Equitable Compensation Commission (ECC) is to support full-time clergy serving as pastors in the charges of the annual conference by: (a) recommending conference standards for pastoral support; (b) administering funds to be used in base compensation supplementation, and (c) providing counsel and advisory material on pastoral support to district superintendents and committees on pastor-parish relations; and (d) submitting an arrearage policy to be adopted by the annual conference. This purpose is consistent with the provision of $\mathbb{T} 625$ of The Book of Discipline, 2016. Given these primary efforts of the Equitable Compensation Commission, the use of conference tithes assists the Equitable Compensation Commission to achieve its purpose by having funds available to address and support issues of equitable compensation as related to full-time clergy serving as pastors in the Memphis Conference. Funds are disbursed to each pastor to provide sufficient compensation, in addition to supplemental aid/income, to ensure that the minimum base salary be met for all eligible clergy. In short, the conference tithes allotted to assist the Commission in addressing issues of equity and fairness without penalty to the pastor or pastoral charge. These actions directly link the basic concepts of the mission statement, "...to discover, equip, connect and send lay and clergy leaders..." to the approved and adopted practices of the Equitable Compensation Commission. Specifically, clergy are financially equipped to eliminate any related pressure that might distract from the primary focus of offering Christ to a hurting world.
An integral part of this process is to assure that our pastors and churches in the mission field are not forgotten or denied adequate support. The ECC strives to financially support those churches and charges that are engaging the areas of the mission field that are not able to financially sustain them at this time.
With all these elements being a critical part of what we believe, clergy who are supported through equitable compensation would serve as living proof of what God's grace looks like when there is respect for each individual's dignity and self-worth. The outcome could very well be fruitful and faithful churches. And, with this, we will be the recipients of pastoral, missional, and congregational excellence.

## MEMPHIS CONFERNCE DISASTER RESPONSE

The mission of United Methodist Disaster Response is to offer a caring Christian presence to communities that have experienced disaster. The purpose of disaster response in the Memphis Conference is to live into that mission in our local communities. While it is occasionally necessary to partner with conferences outside the area, our primary focus is to prepare churches and individuals to respond to neighbors in need.

Disaster response ministry in the Memphis Conference is vital for a number of reasons. Obviously, it is an important ministry in times of relief and recovery for people affected by disaster. This ministry is also important for the health of the local church. When a church is spiritually and physically prepared to respond to and engage the surrounding community, that church grows stronger and it is more effective in sharing the love of Christ to its community.

This year will, hopefully, be the beginning of a better organized and equipped plan for disaster preparedness and response in the Nashville Episcopal Area. With the coordination for each conference now resting with me, I will rely heavily on the excellent leadership that is already in place in each district. We will also look to add committed individuals to the leadership team. Our focus will be to consolidate best practices from each conference to form an area-wide disaster plan.

One of the most important aspects of disaster response is preparation, and that means training. We will focus on training individuals and churches in the areas of preparation and response. There is a place for everyone in disaster response. All age and skill levels are welcome. We will offer trainings in churches and districts to help educate and train people for the work of offering hope in trying times of disaster. Please feel free to contact me if you wish to schedule a training for your community. (disasterresponse@memphis-umc.org) Likewise, watch for conference news that will communicate when trainings will be available in your area. Initially, the goal is one Early Response Team training and one Connecting Neighbors training in each district annually.

The ministry of disaster response touches on all four focus areas of ministry in the Memphis Conference. Disaster response "Invests in Young People" by offering opportunities for them to be involved. In fact, people of all ages are encouraged to share in this ministry of hope. Churches and families are urged to include children in assembling supplies for times of response. Additionally, older youth work alongside adults in cleanup and repair efforts for neighbors affected by disaster. These are all opportunities that help connect young people into the life and mission of the church.
"Engaging in the Mission Field" is at the very core of disaster response ministry. Local congregations, districts, and conferences should be present when the community around them has been impacted by disaster. This connects the church with her neighbors, expresses the concern of the church for her community, and illustrates the love of Christ for the world. The work of offering a caring Christian presence cannot be attained without "Engaging the Mission Field" in authentic and relational ways.

Disaster response ministry has the potential to "Create and Transform Lay and Clergy Leaders" when people truly engage in this work. The submission of one's self in loving service to others produces spiritual maturation. Disaster response and preparation involves this kind of submission. Lay and clergy transformation takes place when self-giving is paired with the power of the Holy Spirit.

When congregations are prepared to respond to the needs of their community, growth takes place. This is how disaster response ministry helps foster "Growing Fruitful and Faithful Churches." As churches help their membership find ways to be involved in ministry, spiritual growth happens. Growth leads to a higher level of involvement in all aspects of worship life together. Increased discipleship allows a church to become more highly involved in the surrounding community. Finally, increased community involvement can result in a realization of the love of Christ present with them.

## NEW CHURCH DEVELOPMENT

Every church was once a new church. Every church began as a dream of a person or group of people who desired that a new group of people know Christ and be a part of the community that we know of as the church.

To fully appreciate the current reality of The United Methodist Church in the Nashville Area, we must turn to statistical data. From 2006 to 2016, church attendance in the two conferences decreased by almost 15 percent. At the same time, the state of Tennessee saw an increase in population of nearly 10 percent. It should be noted that population growth coupled with decreased worship attendance is not the only factor that leads us to start churches. We start churches because it is our Gospel mandate to make disciples!

The stark contrast between population growth and decreased worship attendance shows us there is a problem. We have lost our biblical and Wesleyan church planting heritage. But we can recover it. With every problem there is a solution, and one solution is the establishment of new churches. Many will say that our existing churches can regain their vitality, and this is true for some. But study after study supports the fact that the biggest factor in overall growth is establishing new churches.

Some may see the current reality as too daunting to face. They may bemoan how our current culture is antagonistic toward the church and continue to slip into an irreversible decline toward closure. Others though, will embrace this news as a challenge. They will take on a new awareness that the proverbial fields are "ripe for the harvest." They will understand that the culture we live in is not against Jesus, but many people just do not know who He is. The Nashville Area will meet this challenge through prayer, a belief in God's power, and a comprehensive strategy to create new churches and faith communities.

After a year of work and prayer the NCD team offers the Pathways of Planting strategy for assessing, evaluating, and training potential planters and discerning potential locations for church plants. We will begin to implement the Pathways strategy in collaboration with the Bishop and Cabinet as we seek to create new places for new people to connect with Christ.

# UNITED METHODIST FOUNDATION FOR THE MEMPHIS AND TENNESSEE CONFERENCES

"As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life." (I Timothy 6:17-19) The Bible has a lot to say about money and much of that constitutes a warning to believers. The warning does not primarily regard the making or saving of money. Instead, the scriptures offer a consistent warning regarding one's attitude toward it. It is very tempting (if you have been financially blessed) to become overly dependent on wealth. It is tempting to place one's hope in something that ultimately is very unreliable. Therefore, you and I are instructed to put money to work on behalf of others. In this way, we both can be of significant help and we remain free from the false hope of riches. At the United Methodist Foundation and Development Fund for the Memphis and Tennessee Annual Conferences, we are pleased to act as agents for promoting the freedom which comes with increased generosity. We do that in a number of ways.

First, we serve as a custodian for endowed funds on behalf of local churches and other United Methodist ministries. As of February 28, our holdings are $\$ 57,527,670$. Last year, the fund yielded a net return of approximately $12.5 \%$. In 2017 alone, $\$ 5.4$ million were distributed for ministries in the two annual conferences. Endowed fund giving truly allows local churches to multiply their generous work!

We also serve by means of the United Methodist Development Fund of Tennessee/Kentucky. By accepting investments from individuals, churches and organizations, we are able to loan money at a competitive rate to United Methodist churches and ministries for building projects. Currently, the Development Fund is loaning money at $3.99 \%$ and paying $1.5 \%$ to participants. Currently, the Fund has $\$ 11,932,131$ on loan to local churches and ministries in the two Annual Conferences. By both loaning for new construction or refinancing existing capital debt, the Development Fund empowers churches to continue current and create new programs!

In 2014, we launched a new initiative to help churches and ministries gain greater ability to encourage generosity. Over $\$ 70,000$ has been given to churches in the Tennessee and Memphis Annual Conferences through the Stewardship Grant Program and by partnering with the Lake Institute's Creating Congregational Cultures of Generosity program. In 2017, the Foundation Board voted to initiate a new grant program to help alleviate educational debt. Beginning last summer, the Foundation worked with newly commissioned clergy to help them find productive ways to retire educational debt. \$3,600 was distributed in 2017. We are excited about the ways in which this program will also encourage greater generosity.

In closing, I am reminded of that great hymn of our faith: "How firm a foundation, ye saints of the Lord, is laid for your faith in His excellent Word! What more can He say than to you He hath said, to you who for refuge to Jesus have fled?" Nobody truly knows what the future will hold for us, but of this one thing, you and I can be confident: our Lord is faithful and as we look to him, we will never be disappointed.

# REELFOOT RURAL MINISTRIES, Inc.

The mission of Reelfoot Rural Ministries (RRM) defines how the staff and volunteers of this organization strive each day to love our neighbor. The mission statement is: "Following Christ in building relationships, we provide resources and offer hope to our Reelfoot Lake neighbors." At the core of our work is relationships. Our reason for existing as a ministry is succinctly defined in this focus statement; "Restoring Hope, One Relationship at a Time." While our neighborhood includes the counties in northwest Tennessee and southwest Kentucky around Reelfoot Lake, our primary goal is to approach each neighbor, one relationship at a time. This helps us earn trust and discern needs.

Over the past year, the staff and board of Reelfoot Rural Ministries have been prayerfully seeking God's guidance in visioning for the future work at this conference agency. We have enlisted the expertise of a professional consultant to lead us through this season of strategic planning. The focus of this work has been to outline detailed goals for the changes in ministry that are needed in the current context we serve, and to develop strategies with which to attain those goals. In the months to come, we will continue to discern needs and how best to match available resources to effectively impact the communities we serve. While this obedience to God may result in a different look and feel to some services at RRM, our supporters and clients can rest assured that RRM will continue the work of "Restoring Hope, One Relationship at a Time" on behalf of Christ and the Church.

The work of Reelfoot Rural Ministries impacts all four focus areas of ministry for the Memphis Conference.
Reelfoot Rural Ministries began by serving children and continues this strong focus today. Each ministry at RRM impacts children and young people in some way. However, we specifically seek to "Invest in Young People" through our day care, school supplies drive, backpack buddies, the annual toy store, and the home rehabilitation work camp. The service projects help young people to gain skills for life as well as experience in serving the world for Christ. The day care center in Tiptonville, Tennessee serves two-dozen children each day. This ministry provides love, education, encouragement, and three meals per day for children. The goal of the center is to prepare the children to succeed in primary school and to know that they are beloved children of God. Parents are assured that the children receive quality care by the three-star rating provided by the state of Tennessee. However, the children's personal growth and health are even better evidence of the quality of care provided. The families we serve are from various life stages, ranging from single parents in school or just starting employment, two parent households, and grandparents. Any family in our area can receive childcare, but preference is given to the working poor in the service area.

We seek to "Engage our Mission Field" daily through the 14 ministries in which RRM is involved. These ministries include: Tenne Butler Day Care, School Supplies, Christmas Toy Store, Lake County Imagination Library Sponsorship, Senior Center for meals and activities, Food Distribution Center, Emergency Services, Dental and Oral Hygiene Clinic, Vision Clinic, Special Needs Home, Lake County Backpack Buddies, ReHOME-Home Rehabilitation Work Camp Ministry, Emergency Financial assistance, and the RRM Thrift Store. Some of these ministries require neighbors to come to us and others involve staff and volunteers in the surrounding communities.

Creating and transforming lay and clergy leaders along with growing fruitful and faithful churches are both areas of focus that are enhanced through the multiple volunteer opportunities at Reelfoot Rural Ministries. When individuals and groups come to RRM to volunteer, whether for a few hours, for a few days, or for a weeklong work camp, they are changed by the work of the Holy Spirit. This experience allows individuals, groups, and churches to grow closer in relationship with God, one another, and with the neighbors they are serving. This causes transformation that strengthens personal relationships with Christ, thereby strengthening the local church in relationship with one another for ministry opportunities in that church's own neighborhood.

A strong sign of New Life has come in the providential new partnership with Good Shepherd UMC. Graciously opening up their hearts, minds and doors, they are welcoming the Miriam Early Childhood Education Center and Pre-Kindergarten into their space this spring. Faced with necessity of sale of our 3000 Walnut Grove building, we did not know where to turn, but God is "tying the knot" with UMNCM and Good Shepherd in this "Win-Win" both mission and church.

Similarly, our Food Pantry has merged with one only two blocks away. It is offered by Serving in Christ Outreach Ministry under the dedicated leadership of Director Lashanta Rudd. The needs of vulnerable, pregnant women are great and have been increasing to a level that required more staffing to meet these needs. We are pleased that our Memphis based Social Worker has become a full-time staff member to help carry this load. We've experienced some growing pains and are so grateful to the congregation of Bartlett United Methodist Church for allowing us to use an adjoining room to increase our office space. Upon hearing this news, the JOY Circle of the Germantown UMC UMW and the Alpha Class of Germantown UMC provided leadership and resources to improve our office space and we are settling in and basking in the luxury of a fresh coat of pain and new flooring! The staff of Hannah's Hope is ever so grateful to these groups for making a way to improve our office space.

Each year, it seems that God brings a new challenge our way and we find ourselves immersed in the learning of new skills and information to care for one of our clients. This year we experienced our first HIV exposed baby and were amazed at the expert care offered to children such as this sweet girl by the folks at St. Jude who began treating her within hours of her birth. We are thrilled to share that this treatment protocol was successful in protecting this baby from contracting HIV and she is healthy and thriving with her forever family.

We are so thankful for the individuals, UMW Circles, Sunday school classes, and congregations who support the ministry of Hannah's Hope through contributions to the Circle of Hope initiative and by filling Baby Bottles of Hope. It is only with this support that we are able to provide birth mother care bags for our clients after they give birth, provide free counseling to pregnant women in crisis situations, offer free consultations to couples seeking to discern whether God is calling them to adopt and stand in the gap for children in need of a new, forever home. # WESTERN KENTUCKY UNITED METHODIST FAMILY SERVICES

Western Kentucky United Methodist Family Services (WKUMFS) is a 501 (c)(3) Foster Care Support Agency of The Memphis Conference of The United Methodist Church. Its ministry aligns perfectly with the Memphis Conference Mission; especially offering Jesus Christ to the hurting world, one neighborhood at a time. The Holy Scriptures in Proverbs 31:8-9 NLT says: Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves; ensure justice for those being crushed. Yes, speak up for the poor and helpless, and see that they get justice.
The oppression of children entering foster care comes primarily from neglect or drug abuse by their birth parents. There are currently 8,700+ children in foster care in the state of Kentucky. WKUMFS engages this mission field in The Purchase District by establishing connections with social workers and foster parents as it prays for and serves these hurting children.
WKUMFS' Mission is threefold: 1) Provide for the care and maintenance, support and education of foster children and foster families. 2) Transform local churches by informing them of the ever-present need for foster parents, respite parents, and adoptive parents. 3) Develop foster children into good citizens of the community through experiencing the love of Jesus Christ.
The WKUMFS Board of Trustees consists of volunteer laity and clergy from local area United Methodist Churches along with Purchase District and Memphis Conference Connectional Ministry leaders. This diversity provides the opening to connect with local United Methodist Churches giving them a pathway to make a direct impact on the lives and needs of foster children and their foster families.

## What Can Local United Methodist Churches Do to Help?

It isn't all or nothing! Not everyone is meant to bring a child they did not birth into their home ...but everyone can do something. Which is good news! When congregations are inspired and equipped to be with foster and adoptive families: Every child is cared for, every family has hope, congregations are strengthened, and communities are healthier and safer. Here are several ways congregations can get involved: begin a Prayer Initiative, start a Supportive Care Group, hold an Adoption/Foster Care Awareness Event, host a Local Child Placing Agency Training or Special Event, begin a Bags of Love ministry, or donate to WKUMFS.
Improving the life of foster children is the measure of success. The Kentucky Foster Care program measures success against its permanency goals. They are 1) return to birth parent, 2) permanent relative placement and 3) adoption. There are currently $200+$ children awaiting adoption in Western Kentucky. Nine children in foster care, helped by WKUMFS, were eventually adopted in 2017. Jesus described the final judgement in Matthew 25:40 NLT "And the King will say, 'I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these My brothers and sisters, you were doing it to Me!

Imagine living in a dilapidated home with no resources to repair and bring up to a reasonable standard of living. Imagine not having the finances to keep up with the kerosene heating demands. You are sleeping on a filthy, broken down twin mattress. Now, picture yourself in this condition in your late 70's. With the generosity we are able to extend to those in need, shelter is turned into sanctuary.

Here is the response from that resident after finding his way to a Wesley Living community and being blessed by the generosity extended through Golden Cross. "They gave me a place to sleep, sit down, food to eat, and I really appreciate it. The furniture is nicer than I have ever had. My dad was a minister and he always helped others, and I know he was looking down from Heaven, and so pleased that someone helped me." Isaiah 58:10, "Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness and the darkness around you will be as bright as noon."

Golden Cross Senior Ministries now serves the needs of over 2,200 senior residents living in the 29 Wesley Living affordable housing retirement communities in West Tennessee, Murray KY and Jonesboro, AR. Golden Cross Senior Ministries supports those dear residents with daily use items, financial assistance and social activities. That support can't happen without the generosity of God's angels throughout the Memphis Conference.

A beautiful one bedroom apartment, that was clean as can be. I worried how I was ever going to keep it clean with simply a rag and a bar of soap. My clothes were soiled and needed to be washed."

Wesley Mission is essentially about people-elderly residents and at-home clients, staff, pastors, executives and boards of directors-all necessary to the mission of enhancing the lives of older generations of the area. We proudly do so in a covenant relationship with the Memphis Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church.

Since last year's Annual Conference our organization has focused on several service oriented areas with the goal of enhancing the quality of life for the elderly. These areas are Ministry, Preservation, Staff development and the Future. Also, our committed directors of two of the titled organizations boldly determined Wesley Living and Wesley Mission better identifies the everyday way of life the management company strives to provide while the development company strives to look into the future with Faith in God to serve others respectively.

Ministry is at the heart of our purpose and Pastoral care is a key to the lives of those we serve. Every community continues to be served by a United Methodist pastor located close to every community. This would not be possible without the ongoing cooperation of every district superintendent, active clergy and several retired clergy who remain committed to serving.

Last year was spent on many facets of Human Resources and employee benefits to care for our employees as we would our residents and clients. Careers are to be found at Wesley Living and encourage everyone to inquire if a faith based organization is of interest.

## LAKESHORE CAMP \& RETREAT CENTER

First, we hired the largest summer staff yet, offered more camps than ever before and doubled our DayShore teams. Then, we purchased the new summer favorite, the Aquagon, built a hammock village, and remodeled some cabins. Thanks to your crowdfunding efforts we restocked the life jackets and pool tubes. Lakeshore welcomed first-time campers, visited with camp alum, and saw former staff bring their kids to camp for the first time. We gave out more camperships that ever, had a farewell party for one program director and welcomed a new one. Also, we filled every single bed on camp property at the spring Jr/Sr High weekend retreat where youth learned about God, themselves and how to build community with each other. It has been a busy year. We've done so many things, yet that list does not even scratch the surface of the amount of moments, epiphanies, callings and discoveries that have happed on this Holy Ground.

Thousands of campers, retreat goers, volunteers and guests have spent time here last year and I believe it was a fruitful way to experience life, love and the God of Grace.

Lakeshore takes faith formation seriously. During our summer camp sessions we have two daily theme times and nightly worship to learn about God and respond to God's blessings through song and prayer. Camp is more than just the swimming pool and silly songs; it is creating a foundation of faith with age-appropriate messaging. All our moments are God moments, whether at the craft hut, pool, canteen or cabin time. Last summer, three campers were baptized and several more expressed an interest in attending church when they returned home.

We are grateful that you have been with us on this journey this year. # MISSISSIPPI RIVER LAY RESOURCE LEADER REPORT

Working with laity continues to be the emphasis for the LRL in the MS River District. We have trained 65 Lay Servants, which includes 12 youth. We have had five trainings.
We have a new class of Certified Lay Ministers for this year. These 6 people will be commissioned at Annual Conference this year. There is a class of 4 CLMs being trained currently and they should be finished by June. There will be another class of CLMs to start their training in the fall of 2018.
The Exceptional Worship, which is a ministry of the MS River District Lay Servants has moved the services to Forest Heights UMC in Jackson. This has increased the number of special needs folks who want to attend. Exceptional Worship is open to anyone in the conference and will be the third Sunday afternoon at Forest Heights UMC from 2:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. This ministry has grown in the past year. The United Methodist Men of the Memphis Conference have donated money so that this ministry can continue.
There are 9 new Cooperative Ministries established in the MS River District. There is one in each county. The churches are in different stages of development, but all are excited to participating in shared ministry with sister churches.

## PURCHASE DISTRICT

## Rev. Samantha Hall, Director of Resource Ministries

The Purchase District experienced several changes this year. The Rev. Dr. Rob Martin became our new District Superintendent in July, replacing The Rev. Sky McCracken. The Rev. Kim Morrison resigned in September as Lay Resource Leader to focus full-time on pastoral ministry. On November 1, I was hired as the new Director of Resource Ministries for the district. I assist laity and clergy alike to implement innovative strategies within our district to allow every church to more effectively engage its community. I do this most often by providing training and by securing resources that are applicable to the congregations. I am working to build relationships by attending services and special events at different churches, through social media, and assisting when needed.

We are investing in young people in many ways. While young people have always been a priority for us, we have a renewed focus in this area of ministry. The Purchase District experienced a tragedy on January 23, 2018 when a fatal shooting occurred at Marshall County High School. As a district, we offered support to the pastors who were on the front lines as they ministered to families throughout Marshall County. Materials were ordered for pastors and families in our district to more effectively provide grief and trauma support to those who needed it most. Several pastors have taken advantage of training offered by community agencies, and many have participated in and provided special prayer vigils and youth programs. They offered support to the staff at the schools by bringing meals for them, and were there to encourage the students when they returned to school that first day. Our pastors and laity were indeed the hands and feet of Christ during this tragedy and continue to be. Some churches have demonstrated a renewed commitment to children and youth by expanding their youth ministries, or by providing additional opportunities for support. Several congregations sponsored DayShore last summer. Most churches that did not participate in DayShore offered VBS either alone or in conjunction with other churches. The district assisted by providing VBS materials for check-out. The district also assisted in several other ways, including presenting a Safe Sanctuaries ${ }^{\circledR}$ training for all those who work with children, youth, and vulnerable adults. Finally, West Kentucky United Methodist Family Services helps to equip foster parents with access to resources, expert services and life experiences beyond their means and excluded by Kentucky foster care services. We sponsor an annual Christmas party and gifts for children in the program and hold an annual dinner and auction to raise funds for serving the children and families.

We are engaging the mission field through several ministries. During the week between Christmas and New Year's Day, Project Christmas House volunteers traveled to Durant, Mississippi help to build a house for a family who had lost their home due to a tornado and had no insurance. The churches in the district provided prayers, money and volunteers to complete this mission. We have a very active district laity team. Last fall, they sponsored the Rust College Acapella Choir performance, raising $\$ 1600$ for the choir. The Laity Team's ChoirFest brought together choirs and musicians from across our district to present an evening of beautiful music and collected over $\$ 4300$ for Reelfoot Rural Ministries. Our district collected an abundance of Cleaning Kits in the aftermath of Hurricanes Katrina and Irma. Several churches in our district offer food and clothing banks, and some have Free Pantries located at their churches where those in need may obtain nonperishable food and toiletries. We sponsor Third Place Ministries in Marshall County, which operates a thrift shop and provides crisis services for those in need within the community.

We are creating transformational lay and clergy leaders by presenting Basic and Advanced Lay Servant trainings and by purchasing and distributing materials through our resource library to match the needs in our congregations.

The Purchase District is cultivating fruitful and faithful churches by participating in the Creating Congregational Cultures of Generosity training presented by Rev. Dr. Phil Jamieson of the United Methodist Foundation. We received excellent resources and information and the churches who sent teams plan to apply it to encourage more generous giving within their local contexts.

## TN RIVER DISTRICT LAY RESOURCE LEADER

The responsibility of a Lay Resource Leader is to offer training and resources to further the mission of the Memphis Conference: to discover, equip, connect, and send lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world, one neighborhood at a time. It means to develop a vital plan of encouraging local churches to reach outside the walls of their church building in order to build relationships with people in their communities. It means to develop a model of discipleship. It means letting go of programs that are not bearing fruit and replacing them with a vibrant ministry which invests in people. It means engaging the mission field with community and neighborhood leaders in assessing the priorities and needs of the residents so that we might begin a meaningful witness through evangelism.

Leaders are being discovered and equipped through a variety of training opportunities, including the 55 participants now receiving leadership training through the expansion of the Generative Leadership Academy, with a leadership team of ten GLA graduates. The quarterly sessions include; The Nature of God, A Life of Piety, Acts of Mercy, and Gifted, Called and Sent. Lay and clergy teams are being developed with the strategic goal of growing fruitful and faithful churches. During the past conference year, 84 servants have been trained through the Lay Servant Ministry, both basic and advanced classes. A resource library located at the district office is maintained with Sunday school curriculum for children, youth, and adults. Seasonal studies and DVD's are available for clergy and small groups to encourage discipleship.

Clergy and laity are encouraged to connect with their county-wide Discipleship Networks to begin the conversation around strategies for discipleship within our churches as well as evangelism in the surrounding neighborhood and community. Some important questions to ask in these conversations are, "What is the definition of a disciple? Why is it important for disciples to make disciples? How do we go about making a disciple?"

Meeting with the eight Discipleship Network Groups monthly, as well as worshipping with local congregations weekly throughout the ten county area of the district, keeps me informed of current strategies with the capacity to offer relevant resources to strengthen the local church.

Disciples can be sent through a variety of avenues into their communities with the focus of making additional disciples. This is being modeled through community-wide Vacation Bible Schools in a city park, prayer and share porch visits in neighborhoods, meals and conversation throughout a housing project, mentoring a student in a classroom, developing sheltering ministries, or Hispanic enrichment classes. Sharing the love of Jesus puts our faith into action in order to provide meaning and purpose for those who are searching for a relationship with the Lord.

Students hear the Word in weekly large and small study groups and worship, with both congregate and intimate times preparing them to use their own words to be the Word in the world and to use their words like God uses words, to encourage, comfort, and empower.
Connections are made as students share worship at Wesley and in local churches, both as participants and leaders; as they work in community ministries throughout the Purchase Area; through study, fellowship, and service with Wesley groups in Martin, McKenzie, and Memphis; during Tuesday evening meals provided by district churches; at retreats and training events with local congregations; and in leadership roles for the Calloway County annual Living Nativity.
A United Methodist Murray State faculty member serves as part-time staff, available to the students as both advisor and friend, regularly helping with the student council's planning retreat, and, with the ministry's pastor and director, observing the emotional and spiritual health of the students as well as the tenor of the ministry as a whole. # THE WESLEY FOUNDATION--U OF M, LAMBUTH CAMPUS

The academic year of 2017-18 began as a rebuilding year for the Wesley Foundation having seen over a dozen regular students enter into their post college careers in May of 2017. This opened the door for new leadership to lead the largest, most active student group on campus.

Over the course of the fall semester evening worship (Compass) services, held at Lambuth Memorial, focused on considering "What Will You Name This Place?" based on Jacob's encounter with God at Bethel. God's Text-Bible study focused on a variety of topics based in scripture, "God, revelation, sin, grace, forgiveness" etc. On Thursday evenings students were invited to participate in a redesigned, and student led discussion group, seeing as many as 18 students weekly agree to read scripture together, and pray for one another.

The Wesley Foundation embarked on a capital campaign "The Next Five Years." To date it has raised half of its annual $\$ 15,000$ goal.

Students took leadership roles and regularly began to serve the homeless community in Jackson through Room in the Inn. Students also hosted their second "Wesley Game Night" on campus as a part of Christmas celebration for the campus. Who knew college students loved competitive Bingo.

During the spring semester students hosted the fifth annual "Blessing of the Semester" welcoming faculty and staff to worship, and a fellowship meal raising funds for Lenten World Hunger Offering. Weekly, evening worship focused on "Worship: Our Work". God's Text-Bible Study focused on 14 weeks of prayer. Wesley students also hosted the third "Wesley Game Night," with competitive bingo bringing together the broader campus community. Students also helped host Room In the Inn with Northside U.M.C. The spring semester ended with a service of worship that celebrated the unity we have as we celebrated the Resurrection of Christ through the Easter season.

## UT MARTIN WESLEY FOUNDATION

The Wesley Foundation at UT Martin is a ministry of the Memphis Conference of the UMC whose Mission Statement is: DISCOVER, EQUIP, CONNECT and SEND lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world, ONE NEIGHBORHOOD AT A TIME.

Within the neighborhood of the UT Martin community, the Wesley Foundation seeks to love like Jesus Christ by offering college students intentional opportunities to CONNECT, GROW and SERVE on the University campus among college students, faculty and staff, local church communities, and the wider UT Martin community. This mission is rooted Acts 2:42:47.

It is in our DNA to Invest in Young People. Everything we do is driven by the desire to meet young adults at UTM where they are in their journey, love them, support them and disciple them. Despite an old and deteriorating facility we strive to provide a safe, clean, and well maintained space for young adults to gather, fellowship, share table, worship, study the Bible, do homework, have access to computers and printers, and receive community and pastoral support. We offer weekly Tuesday night Bible studies (average around 12 in attendance) and Thursday night meal and worship (average around 30 in attendance). Beyond regular programs, though, we have developed 5 different small groups (4-5 members each) that meet either in the building or somewhere on campus throughout the week. Three of these small groups have been modeled after the Wesleyan Class Meeting experience and are being facilitated by members of Martin FUMC. Walk through the building on any given day at the lunch hour and you will find anywhere from 6-15 students cooking lunch, eating together, playing ping pong, or studying on the couch. It's a fair estimate to say that we know the stories and situations of around 50 UTM students and we play some sort of supporting role in their college experience.

We Engage the Mission Field of the UTM campus daily by being a consistent presence to students and the community. Specific mission projects that Wesley has engaged in this year include: campus mission projects (i.e. Empty Bowls and Cups for a Cure that we participated in with the UT Martin Art Department), mission projects in the Martin community (i.e. the agape notes we make for We Care ministries), and outside of the Martin Community (i.e. the trip to Reelfoot Rural Ministries we made this past fall and the work with Blessing Basket, a Foster Care ministry in Cottage Grove, TN).

We work to Create Transforming Lay and Clergy Leaders by empowering and equipping students for their current and future ministry roles. Our student council has 6 student leaders who are responsible for leading specific areas of our ministry. The experience on council refines their gifts and equips them for current and future ministry. We also have worship intern position that allows a student to practice an even deeper level of responsibility, commitment and ministry. This summer we have four students who will serve on staff at Lakeshore CRC, one student who will be on staff at Project Transformation, one who has been hired on staff at Camp Magruder (UM Camp in Oregon), and two who will serve as interns at local churches. In most cases, Wesley has helped bridge those opportunities.

We contribute to the work of Growing Fruitful and Faithful Churches by intentionally partnering with local United Methodist congregations. We have students who regularly attend and even serve in leadership positions at Martin FUMC. We have partnered with Martin FUMC to create a student adoption program that intentionally fosters relationships between students and church members. Local churches throughout the district provide our meals and often stay to fellowship and worship with us, a practice that is mutually life-giving. This school year we have had four Wesley students who were placed in church staff/intern positions through the Wesley Foundation and MS River District office.

We give God thanks for the movement of the Holy Spirit in and among us! Grace and peace of Christ.

# UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER CAMPUS MINISTRY

At the University of Tennessee Health Science Center (UTHSC) in Memphis, the United Methodist campus ministry continues to grow and explore new opportunities. In March of 2011, Jonathan Lewis started as the campus minister there, and he continues to serve in that position. Jonathan is also Program Manager of UT and Conference Ministries with Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare (MLH) in the Faith and Health Division. Jonathan was ordained as a Deacon in full connection in the Memphis Conference in June of 2016. He also serves at Crossroads United Methodist Church in Collierville.

UTHSC is composed entirely of graduate schools, all of them specializing in some form of health science-from dentistry to medicine to nursing to laboratory science and much more. Jonathan relates well to UTHSC because of his own immersion in the hospital and healthcare setting, where he ministers to patients, families, and medical professionals of all kinds.

The campus ministry student group at UTHSC is called the Faith Health Collaborative (FHC). For more information and partnership opportunities, please visit the student group website at www.faithhealthcollaborative.com. FHC engages the entire UTHSC community - all colleges and programs, all students, faculty, and staff. FHC connects UTHSC to the Faith and Health Division of MLH, including its clinical work, its fruitful partnerships with community organizations and congregations, its local and international missions and service opportunities, and its unique educational initiatives through the Center of Excellence in Faith and Health. This ministry engages the Faith and Health Division and the United Methodist Church at UTHSC in an impactful way. Since being officially approved as a campus student group in 2016, FHC has recruited student vice presidents from 5 of the colleges that make up UTHSC and also has an active membership of nearly 50 students.

Specific initiatives for FHC include...

## Connection to United Methodist Congregations and Programs

Through FHC, students, faculty, and staff connect to Chaplain Lewis and the United Methodist Church. Relationships and partnerships with United Methodist congregations and programs are a significant part of FHC in much the same way that the Faith and Health Division at MLH functions. FHC aims to be an innovative vehicle that increases student exposure to the church and its health ministries.

## Support and Service

Chaplain Lewis is a trained spiritual caregiver and currently a counseling intern at the Methodist Employee Assistance Program, and his increased exposure to UTHSC enables him to offer more support and care to the entire UTHSC community, witnessing to the love of Christ that can work through the United Methodist Church and its people, reflecting the call of the Gospel to love God and love our neighbors. FHC also connects UTHSC to the service, missions, and programs of the Memphis Conference and the larger United Methodist connection.

## Education

In partnership with Church Health, Chaplain Lewis continues to help design and facilitate the "Serving The Underserved" certificate course. FHC helps to expand and develop that educational experience, aligning itself with the Wesleyan emphases
on health, education, and personal formation. In 2017, Serving The Underserved expanded to offer the certificate course twice per year, once in the Fall and once in the Spring. Serving The Underserved received over 150 applications from interested students and faculty persons in 2017. Also, in partnership with a student group from Church Health, FHC has been sponsoring lunch and learn events on campus that usually attract 40-50 students, faculty, and staff.

## THE WESLEY FOUNDATION AT MEMPHIS

The mission of the Wesley Foundation at Memphis is to make disciples of Jesus Christ in the university setting. We have concluded an exciting year of activity and service. At the core of who we are is our worship life. Our community gathers weekly for a time of spirited music, heartfelt prayer and intentional discerning of the meaning of the Word of God for our lives. Our volunteer musicians - the 1 Kings 17:13 Band - leads us in singing traditional hymns and songs but with a vigorous presentation that has become the band's trademark. Our worship, while being informal, has a traditional structure that our students have embraced strongly. In addition to this calendar event, we hold a weekly service of Holy Communion for the Wesley family. We also hold special worship events such as a service of Thanksgiving, a Service of Lessons and Carols as our community disperses for its Christmas break, an Ash Wednesday service, Holy Week services and occasional other worship gatherings.

All this is to say that our beginning and ending is grounded in worship. Through a corporate experience of prayer, praise and discernment the Wesley Foundation helps our fellowship identify priorities both individually and collectively. With this bedrock, Wesley's participants are able to participate in one of our stated goals for student ministry: leader development. Studies show that many college-aged students "check-out" of their enhancement of the quality of leadership during their undergraduate years. Many leave home, go through their degree programs, and then return to their communities of origin with little or no expansion of their leadership skill-sets. The Wesley Foundation actively involves our students in a process by which they discern need in the lives of our young people. As part of our Ministry Team they design program, execute events and evaluate the effectiveness of the things we have done. In this way they hone their skills so that, by the time they finish their university careers, they are prepared to return home and "hit the ground running" in their occupations, in their communities, and most importantly, in their local congregations. We have an active Wesley Intern program through which we invite young adults to be particularly involved in this process. A Wesley Intern's job description is "make our ministry go." With that responsibility and freedom, our staff performs an exemplary service in support of our work.

We believe that our ministry serves the stated values of the Annual Conference -- unrelenting love for all people, integrity, excellence, faithfulness \& fruitfulness, and innovation -- through the fostering of genuine Christian community. And so, we have a lot of fun together. We gather regularly for fellowship and recreational opportunities. We do this so that the campus population has an alternative to the rowdier distractions that sometimes accompany college years. But we also do this with positive goals in mind. Particularly, we come to care for one another, to trust each other, and to discover what joy there is in genuine faith identity. It is our experience that these relationships endure long past a person's college years. The fostering of this teamwork also promotes a desire to reach out to people and causes beyond the Wesley group. We have taken mission trips, volunteered in campus and community activities and have shared the news of our ministry with local United Methodist congregations.

We have established meaningful relationships with many of the local church groups and congregations that support our work. We would be much the poorer in our institutional life if churches, Sunday school classes, small groups, UMW circles or units, UMW groups or individual volunteers did not provide our Tuesday evening Fellowship Meals. These folks find joy in their participation in our ministry. In turn, the Wesley community has frequently found new friends and lasting associations through interaction with these generous souls.

The college experience is a magical time for many people. We believe that the work and witness of our Wesley Foundation helps make that so in the lives of countless students. We are grateful for our task, and for the support that we receive from the people of The Memphis Conference

## GBHEM GENERAL AGENCY REPORT

GBHEM launched a new mission and vision in August 2017. The updated mission and vision simplify GBHEM's role as the primary leadership development agency for The United Methodist Church.
Mission: Build capacity for United Methodist lay and clergy leaders to discover, claim and flourish in Christ's calling in their lives, by creating connections and providing resources to aid in recruitment, education, professional development and spiritual formation. Vision: Generations of thriving, diverse and compassionate Christian leaders for The United Methodist Church and the world.

## OUR WORK THROUGHOUT 2017 AND 2018

The Office of Discernment and Enlistment at GBHEM hosted Exploration, a biennial event for young adults ages 18-26 to hear, discern, and respond to God's call to ordained ministry as a United Methodist deacon or elder. More than 350 attended the event in Portland, Oregon in November 2017.
The Young Clergy Initiative (YCI) funded 34 innovative projects across the church in 2017 to attract young people to ordained ministry. Since its inception, more than 100 projects have been funded through YCI.
GBHEM works with the Commission on Central Conference Theological Education (CCTE) to distribute grants for the theological education of pastoral leaders in the Central Conferences. In 2017, the CCTE awarded 67 grants totaling more than $\mathbf{\$ 1}$ million to the seven Central Conferences of The United Methodist Church.

The Publishing Ministry, established to engage, nurture, and advocate for the intellectual life of The United Methodist Church, released 13 books in 2017, reaching more than 10,000 people.
In 2017, GBHEM's Office of Loans and Scholarships awarded 2,000+ students with $\$ 4.1$ million in scholarships and 350 students with $\$ 1.4$ million in low-interest loans. More than $\$ 1.6$ million was awarded to 200 recipients of the Excellence in Clergy Leadership Scholarship, which helps United Methodist clergy avoid excessive educational loan debt, minimize financial stress and build financial acumen.

To aid pastors in their ministry journey, GBHEM's Candidacy Office introduced EM360. A formation guide to help pastors and congregations meet mission and ministry goals, EM360 is a tool to help clergy leaders identify and gauge pastoral effectiveness. In 2017, 1,438 candidates enrolled in UMCARES to seek certified candidacy for licensed or ordained ministry. A total of 589 candidates were certified.

The Black College Fund distributed more than $\$ 9.68$ million in 2017 to the Historically Black Colleges and Universities related to The United Methodist Church for faculty development, infrastructure maintenance, academic programs and scholarships.

Clergy Lifelong Learning led African-American, United Methodist pastors who lead predominantly white churches in cross-cultural diversity training in South Korea in 2017. Continuing education and coaching opportunities are available through the innovative, multilingual platform, UMC Cyber Campus.

In 2017, Schools, Colleges, and Universities established the Siri S. Gadbois Fund in partnership with the National Association of Schools \& Colleges of The United Methodist Church (NASCUMC) for mentoring among institution leaders (kickoff in 2018). The Cutting-Edge Curriculum Award was created to recognize 10 exceptional faculty members who are building effective and innovative academic courses (winners announced at the end of 2018 spring semester).

In partnership with Discipleship Ministries, GBHEM provides e-readers to theological schools in remote areas of Africa and Asia, offering access to the latest textbooks and references books. The E-Reader Project distributed $\mathbf{6 6 7}$ e-readers in 2017 and nearly $\mathbf{2 , 5 0 0}$ devices to $\mathbf{2 2}$ theological seminaries since the program inception in 2013.
In 2017, GBHEM and the Association of United Methodist Theological Schools (AUMTS) hosted two academic theological colloquies. Initiated in service to the intellectual life of the church, the colloquies are intended to be a resource for the church. The first colloquy (March 2017) focused on human sexuality and church unity, the second (November 2017) reflected on the practice of Missio Dei. Both events produced a study guide and book.

Amidst a transition in the governance of Zimbabwe, lectures, research, and outreach activities at Africa University have continued uninterrupted.

- Invest in Young People:
- Currently, Africa University hosts a stable, focused, and vibrant campus community of 1,417 students and faculty and staff from 31 African nations. An additional 392 students are pursuing degree programs on a part-time basis.
- Africa University's annual operating budget of just-under $\$ 10.5$ million prioritizes student access and retention, with more than $\$ 2.2$ million in scholarships and financial aid awards disbursed in 2017.
- Create Transforming Lay and Clergy Leaders:
- A new academic structure and the realignment of programs is encouraging innovation and enhancing Africa University's relevance to The United Methodist Church and to sub-Saharan Africa.
- The recently-launched Institute of Theology and Religious Studies offers multi-disciplinary training and leadership formation opportunities for both clergy and laity.
- Engage the Mission Field:
- Researchers at Africa University are providing critical data on mosquitos and regional malaria control programs to aid Africa's efforts to eradicate malaria and other insect-borne diseases.
- Through teaching and research, Africa University is making trailblazing, regional contributions in migrant and refugee protection, child rights, and the harnessing of intellectual property for development.
- The first 25 years of AU's ministry have produced more than 8,000 graduates who are leading efforts to make disciples, minister to the poor, improve global health, and better the quality of life in communities across sub-Saharan Africa.

Africa University is embracing new opportunities for service and impact within and beyond the church in Africa, thanks to the unwavering support of the Memphis Conference. Memphis United Methodists are urged to pray for Africa University and to work diligently to help the university to equip and send forth effective global leaders.

## Candler School of Theology

For more than 100 years, Candler School of Theology at Emory University has prepared real people to make a real difference in the real world. Since our founding in 1914, more than 10,000 students have graduated from Candler, where they have been shaped as thoughtful, principled, and courageous Christian leaders dedicated to transforming the world in the name of Jesus Christ.

One of 13 official seminaries of The United Methodist Church, Candler has been included on a list of "Seminaries that Change the World" for five years running, and was recently named a "Bright Spot in Theological Education" by Auburn Seminary.

Candler is also one of seven graduate professional schools of Emory University, a top-tier research institution offering extensive resources and a demonstrated commitment to service. Our location in Atlanta provides a hands-on learning environment rich with opportunity: The General Board of Global Ministries is headquartered here, as are numerous public health, international development, and social service organizations. Simply put, there is no better place to prepare for
ministry that engages our major denominational priorities: developing leaders, starting and growing churches, ministry with the poor, and improving global health.

In order to keep pace with the needs of the church and the world, Candler offers 16 degrees: six single degrees and ten dual degrees pairing theology with bioethics, business, international development, law, public health, or social work. One of our newest degrees is a Doctor of Ministry that is 90 percent online, so students can remain in their places of ministry as they study and immediately apply to their context what they learn in class. Our Teaching Parish program allows eligible United Methodist students to serve as pastors in local churches while they're enrolled-they earn a salary as they earn course credit and pastoral experience, plus they are mentored by an experienced United Methodist elder.

Candler's student body continues to reflect the diversity and breadth of the Christian faithful, with an enrollment of 455 , reflecting 49 percent women, 35 percent people of color (U.S.), and a median age of 30 . Students represent 39 denominations, with half coming from the Methodist family. 82 percent of students are seeking a degree to prepare them as ministry professionals.

Candler has a deep commitment to alleviating student debt and employs a multi-pronged approach to tackle this issue. In 2017-2018, we awarded $\$ 5.3$ million in Candler scholarships, with 97 percent of MDiv students receiving aid and the average scholarship covering 75 percent of tuition. Plus, our comprehensive "Faith \& Finance" program teaches money management skills that serve our students now and will continue to serve them-and the churches they lead-well into the future.

Half of Candler's faculty are United Methodist and 58\% come from traditions within the larger Methodist family. This year, we welcomed fellow United Methodist Helen Jin Kim to the faculty as Assistant Professor of American Religious History, and we sent best wishes along with our colleague Mary Lou Greenwood Boice as she retired after 25 years of remarkable service to Candler.

Candler draws considerable strength and inspiration from its relationship with The United Methodist Church. Our ability to fulfill our mission of educating faithful and creative leaders for the church's ministries throughout the world depends upon your support, gifts, and prayers. ## BREAKING NEWS:

- Students: Our entering students were the most diverse in our history, creating remarkable opportunities for indepth exchange and fruitful collaboration.
- Faculty: We welcomed three amazing faculty this year: Rebecca Copeland in Theology (focus on environmental theology); Theodore Hickman-Maynard in Black Church Studies; and Cornell William Brooks as Visiting Professor of Social Ethics, Law, and Justice Movements. Thanks to loyal alums, we also endowed the Harrell Beck Professorship in Hebrew Scripture and installed Kathe Darr as the first Beck Professor.
- Congregations: The Lilly Endowment awarded the Center for Practical Theology $\$ 1.5$ million to create an innovation hub, which will foster creative vocational reflection in congregations, and a sharing of the congregations' wisdom.
- Doctor of Ministry: The DMin in Transformational Leadership is soaring with lively student cohorts that are broadly ecumenical, culturally diverse, and global. The model includes intensives, online courses, and faculty mentoring.
- Scholarships: We continue our offer of free tuition to UMC registered candidates for ordained ministry, and we continue to build student scholarships and housing as a central campaign priority. New scholarships include the Dale Andrews Scholarship in Practical Theology and Race, Korean Student scholarship, and the Bishop John H. Adams and Dr. Dolly D. Adams Scholarship for candidates for ordained ministry in the AME, AMEZ, and CME churches.
- Arts Initiatives: Recent exhibits and events include "Symbols and Art of China, Korea, and Japan" and "Bridging Divided Communities through the Arts"
PARTNERING FOR MINISTRY AND TRANSFORMATION: Preparing students for ministry means meaningful partnerships with the local spiritual community.
- Congregational courses: Courses in congregations with church leaders and students learning together.
- Religion and Conflict Transformation Clinic: Internships and workshops that foster justice and reconciliation.
- Travel seminars: Courses engaging local communities on Arizona-Mexican border, Israel and Palestine, India, spiritual life centers, and Serbia and Croatia (with focus on interreligious dialogue).

- Ecumenical partnerships: Continuing close work with UMC, AME and other Wesleyan denominations, while launching robust Communities of Learning with the Episcopal Church and United Church of Christ.
- Partnership with Hebrew College: Joint courses and public events, plus co-sponsoring The Journal of Interreligious Studies. The focus is on enriching theological education with interreligious learning and leadership opportunities.


## TAKING ACTION GLOBALLY AND LOCALLY:

- Faculty and students have led and participated in service for victims of hurricanes and fires, protests on behalf of Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, protests of white supremacist movements, protests and services on behalf of immigrants and DACA young people, and ecumenical and interreligious witnesses for justice in the city of Boston.
- The community (often student-led) has had deep conversations on issues that divide (including theological issues). We seek to foster respectful listening that builds community life and communal action.

## GAMMON THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

Gammon Theological Seminary, located in Atlanta, GA, is the United Methodist constituent member of the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC), a consortium of historically African-American theological schools. Gammon/ITC is a co-educational, professional graduate school of theology. Its faculty personifies vigorous scholarship, rigorous academic discipline, and significant research in the service of the church and other communities in the world. Gammon/ITC is the world's premier resource for black church scholarship and faith-based solutions to the spiritual and socio-economic challenges confronting the African American community and beyond.

Founded in 1883 by the Methodist Episcopal Church and with assistance from the Freedman's Aid Society, today Gammon Theological Seminary is one of the 13 theological schools of the United Methodist Church. The faculty and administration of Gammon/ITC create an environment in which critical thinking, investigative reflection, decision making, and responsible action are fostered. Gammon/ITC is a member of the Atlanta University Center Complex, the world's largest enterprise of African American higher education. It is also a member of The University Center of Georgia and the Atlanta Theological Association. The school is fully accredited by the Association of Theological Schools and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
Gammon/ITC offers the following degree programs: the Master of Divinity, the Master of Arts in Christian Education, and the Doctor of Ministry. Admission is open to qualified men and women of the United Methodist Church.

The support of this Annual Conference helps Gammon/ITC students carry on a proud tradition. They are taught to think independently and communicate effectively. They are also challenged to become involved in finding solutions to problems that affect the human condition, and to become active in the community beyond this campus. Additionally, graduates of this institution are encouraged to maintain a lifelong desire for intellectual growth, spiritual development, and the acquisition of skills for the practice of ministry.
Gammon/ITC has had a very exciting and busy year living out its mission, which is to recruit, support and educate pastors and leaders for the United Methodist Church. Gammon Theological Seminary is extremely grateful to this Annual Conference for your support of theological education, and for your commitment to ensuring that God's church will be served by persons who are called and trained to lead us forward.

# MEMPHIS THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY 

Michael K. Turner, Director

Memphis Theological Seminary is pleased to report that theological education for United Methodist students continues to remain vibrant and forward-looking.

The Seminary continues to offer a robust selection of classes in Wesleyan Studies. Dr. Michael Turner (Associate Professor of the History of Christianity and Wesleyan Studies) continues to teach all the required UMC courses for ordination in Methodist History, Doctrine, and Polity each academic year. Dr. Turner, along with his colleagues Dr. Lee Ramsey (Marlon and Sheila Foster Professor of Pastoral Theology and Homiletics), Dr. Carmichael Crutchfield (Associate Professor of Christian Education, Spiritual Formation, and Youth Ministry / General Secretary of the Department of Christian Education for the CME Church), and Rev. Billy Vaughan (Director for the Formation for Ministry Program) also offer a number of electives each year in the field of Wesleyan Studies. Recent offerings include "Pastoral Care in the Wesleyan Tradition," "John Wesley's Practical Theology," "The Prophetic Rhetoric of Henry McNeal Turner," and "Covenant Discipleship Groups." Students that take a minimum of five courses in Wesleyan studies electives have the opportunity to earn the Certificate in Wesleyan Studies.

The Methodist House of Studies at MTS continues to provide opportunities for Wesleyan formation for both students at the Seminary and pastors within the surrounding Annual Conferences that we serve. Dr. Turner (Western North Carolina Annual Conference), Dr. Ramsey (Memphis Annual Conference), and Dr. Crutchfield (CME Church) serve as the Directors and Associate Directors of the Methodist House of Studies. The Methodist House provides support for all of our UMC students at MTS by regular gatherings for fellowship and mutual learning. Recent gatherings have focused on topics that include hospital chaplaincy, clergy taxes, and the ordination process in the UMC. The faculty members associated with the MHOS also provide academic and vocational advising to all UMC, CME, and AME students at the Seminary.

Additionally, the MHOS has sponsored training for clergy covenant group leaders in the Tennessee and Memphis Annual Conferences during the past year, co-sponsored "Molding Christian Conversation in a Polarized Society: Beginning the Conversation about Same Sex Marriage and the UMC" with the Turner Center for Church Leadership, and co-sponsored retreats on "At Table: United Methodists Seeking a Way Forward" with the Turner Center for Church Leadership and the Tennessee and Memphis Annual Conferences. Dr. Turner has also led various workshops on Methodist heritage at congregations in the greater Memphis area.

Currently, faculty members at the MHOS are developing a Continuing Education Certificate in Wesleyan Studies in partnership with the Mississippi Annual Conference, a council designed to facilitate dialogue between the various PanMethodist traditions, and we are assisting planning a Methodist-focused day at the Civil Rights Museum. In May of 2019, Dr. Turner will be leading a Wesleyan Pilgrimage to England. The trip will be open to students, alumni, and interested Methodists from the annual conferences we serve.

In addition to the work of the MHOS, Memphis Theological Seminary also has received a $\$ 1,000,000$ grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. to establish a Center for Pastoral Formation, Imagination and Leadership. This Center will better equip pastoral leaders in the field as well as students preparing for ministry to lead the church in the twenty first century. By way of this center we are determined to offer both students at the seminary and pastoral leaders in the field the resources they need to thrive in ministry. As with our Formation for Ministry program at the seminary we are committed to fostering an imagination and accountability for the challenges pastoral leaders are facing.

Also, in September the Seminary broke ground on the freestanding Hamilton Chapel. The 300 -seat facility, which will likely be complete by Easter of 2019. The chapel was made possible in part by a $\$ 3$ million gift from Barbara Hamilton and her the late Dr. Ralph Hamilton. Dr. and Mrs. Hamilton were prominent members of Germantown United Methodist Church. This year, Jeanne Varnell completed the $\$ 500 \mathrm{~K}$ pledge to support the Methodist House of Study that she and her late husband Henry pledged to the Ministry for the Real World Campaign.

We are grateful for the support of the Memphis Annual Conference and for the many fine students who have attended MTS from Memphis over the years. We appreciate the confidence that the Conference places in MTS for preparation of United Methodist women and men for Christian ministry, and we welcome your ongoing involvement and prayers for Wesleyan studies at Memphis Theological Seminary. # RUST COLLEGE OF HOLLY SPRINGS, MISSISSIPPI

Established in 1866 by the Freedmen's Aid Society of the Methodist Church on a former slave auction site. Rust is the oldest one of 11 Historically Black Colleges and Universities established after the Civil War by the Methodist Church still in existence today serving more than 1,000 students annually from Mississippi, 16 states and 6 foreign countries. Rust's Mission continues to be in tune with the church's overall philosophy - doing no harm, doing good and staying in love with Jesus Christ as we serve the young people who look to Rust as their bridge to a better tomorrow through education.

Rust College Religious Life is a diverse community providing the administration, faculty, staff and students sacred space to be fellow travelers on a journey of faith that leads to transformation of the individual and the world. The Office of the Chaplain oversees religious life activities, coordinates training for student ministers, and provides counseling for administration, faculty, staff, and students.

Informed by Christian tradition, Rust College religious life strives to be an ambassador for Jesus Christ to a diverse higher education community. Grounded in the Wesleyan tradition, religious life is the place where "Tomorrow's Leaders are Students Today." Students who will be and do "all the good they can, by all the means they can, in all the ways they can, in all the places they can, at all the times they can to all the people they can, for as long as they can."

Highlights for 2017-2018 year include:

- The College ended the 2016-2017 fiscal year with a balanced budget for the $51^{\text {st }}$ consecutive year.
- Rust College received a $\$ 145,000$ grant from the Hearin Foundation to support needy students seeking financial aid. The total grant equaled $\$ 580,000$, over a four-year period.
- Mrs. Carrie Conway, Senior Program Officer with the Lettie Pate Whitehead Foundation visited with President, executive team and student recipients on the Rust campus. The Lettie Pate Whitehead Foundation awarded a $\$ 140,000$ grant to Rust College General Scholarship Fund for 2017-2018.
- Dr. Hilda B. Williams, Assistant Professor of English, received the Humanities Teacher of the Year award.
- Reverend Jesse Jackson, Civil rights activist and Rainbow PUSH Coalition President visited campus in an effort to reach young voters and encouraged voter registration and engagement.
- Ms. Ba'Sheera Williams, a senior English literature major from Yazoo City, Mississippi was selected Student Ambassador for the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities.
- Awarded a \$32,170 Mississippi IDeA Network of Biomedical Research Excellence (MS INBRE) grant.
- Awarded a $\$ 50,000$ Grant from the Department of Health and Human Services Public Health Services.
- Awarded a $\$ 1,336,000.00$ grant from the Lilly Endowment UNCF Career Pathways Initiative program.

As you, our friends of the United Methodist Church, continue to uphold your promise of educational opportunity established many years ago, we, the members of the Rust College family, will uphold the promise made by our founder, Rev. A. C. McDonald in 1866, "to do not hothouse work" but will work to build men and women morally, spiritually and academically sound. We are thankful to you for your prayers and financial support. ## UNITED THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

Dr. Kent Millard, President
"Now to him who by the power of God at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine..." - Ephesians 3:20

United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio, celebrated a 77\% increase in new students for the fall of 2017. While 71 new students enrolled in September 2016, 126 new students enrolled in September 2017. This was made possible by increasing student aid opportunities and empowering faculty members, trustees and administrators to personally

recommend candidates for a \$5,000 grant toward tuition. United experienced God's provision, trusting what God said through St. Paul: "[God] is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine" (Ephesians 3:20).

Many of the seminary's new students are current pastors who want to become more effective leaders for the Church through a Doctor of Ministry degree. United's Doctor of Ministry program has 170 students enrolled this year from 29 states, 2 non-US countries and 27 Christian denominations. The average number of doctoral students in all Association of Theological Schools (ATS) is 60 students, making United one of the largest Doctor of Ministry programs among ATS member schools.

The Doctor of Ministry program provides academic rigor, peer group support, spiritual growth and practical application. Pastors identify a need within their community and, with the support of a peer group, mentor and United faculty, they develop a model of ministry that will resolve the challenge in their congregations or communities.

Rev. Rudy Rasmus, pastor of the 9,000-member St. John's United Methodist Church in downtown Houston is a current doctoral student, who says he has been both challenged and supported in the DMin program.
"The program is rigorous," Rev. Rasmus says. "It is contextual, it is intentional and the professors and staff are at the top of the form."

United also has 212 students enrolled in the Master of Divinity degree program who usually seek to serve as pastors in local congregations. $88 \%$ of entering students are ordained or seeking ordination to serve a local congregation compared to $56 \%$ in other ATS member schools.

United also provides a two-year Master of Arts in Christian Ministries degree, which many persons serving as Directors of Christian Education or other local church positions pursue.

United provides flexible course options: $90 \%$ of students take at least one course online, and courses are also available as traditional on-campus courses, week-long on-campus intensive classes and virtual courses that meet simultaneously on campus and in the cloud via webcast.

Whether you are clergy or laity, an alumnus or a prospective student, looking for master's or doctoral work or continuing education or simply deeper biblical knowledge, Wesley wants to support you in your current and future call to ministry. Here are a few ways Wesley can help you grow in faith, wisdom, and ability.

## Expand your leadership skills

Wesley's internationally respected Lewis Center for Church Leadership is a key resource for cutting-edge church research and disciple-growing strategies for the local church. Under the directorship of the Rev. Dr. F. Douglas Powe, Jr., the Lewis Center's Leading Ideas e-newsletter, reaching almost 20,000 people in ministry each week, has launched its new podcast - Leading Ideas Talk.
The Institute for Community Engagement at Wesley continues its innovative online Health Minister Certificate Program from Heal the Sick to prepare congregations for public health work in their parishes. Some scholarships are available for this program.

Wesley also offers opportunities for individual study without pursuing a degree. The courses can also be taken for personal education and enrichment.

Wesley continues to be a leader in Doctor of Ministry programs, offering practical and spiritually renewing tracks in theological education. Wesley announces an exciting new 2019 Doctor of Ministry track, in partnership with Wesley House in Cambridge, UK: "Winds of the Spirit and Ministries for a Changing World." Other 2019 tracks will include Church Excellence, Spirituality and Story, a $13^{\text {th }}$ Global Asian Church track and Public Engagement: Healing Communal Brokenness and Despair.

## Discover exciting pathways to seminary studies

Wesley understands the struggle of responsibly accepting your call while being concerned about balancing life, family, ministry and student debt. We are here to help make responding to that call possible. Through our partnership with Shenandoah University and our new 3+3 Fast Track B.A./M. Div. program, students enter ministry with less debt after earning their degree in 6 years.
Wesley's Master of Divinity degree can now be completed via online, weekend, short-term intensive, and weeknight courses in 5 years. This format is designed to be more accessible to those with busy ministry, work, and/or family commitments throughout the region.
The new African American Church Studies Master of Divinity specialization gives contextual preparation for the unique opportunities and challenges our future leaders may encounter in African American churches, while the Public Theology specialization allows master's degree students to gain skills for community leadership and advocacy. Wesley continues to offer our 36-hour Master of Arts and a 60 -hour Master of Theological Studies to equip those called to ordained deacon ministries or to other ministries beyond the pulpit.

## Enrich your congregational outreach and explore new dimensions of ministry

Through the Wesley Innovation Hub, Wesley is working with 20 local congregations to design innovative ministries to enrich the religious lives of young adults. The Wesley Innovation Hub is made possible by a generous grant from the Lilly Endowment.

In a time of polarization, the Center for Public Theology, under the leadership of Distinguished Professor of Public Theology Mike McCurry, continues to equip pastors, seminarians, people of faith, and the media to create spaces for civil dialogue at the intersection of religion and politics. The Center also provides events, such as the Wesleyan Political Theology Project, to help faith leaders lead prophetic, open dialogue in their communities.
The Luce Center for Arts and Religion remains the only seminary-based program uniting arts and theology. The Luce Center offers regular classes and workshops with visiting artists.

Helen L. Williams, passed away Sunday, June 11, 2017, surrounded by her loving family. Born July 8, 1930, in Mayfield, Kentucky, Helen was graduated from Mayfield High School and then, on May 29th, 1948, she eloped with Roy D. Williams, Jr., and they were married in Corinth, Miss. Helen attended Lambuth College, in Jackson, Tennessee, until she and Roy returned to live in Mayfield. Later, when Roy was ordained a minister, she faithfully supported him as they moved from place to place, as directed by the United Methodist Church. After spending a few years at his first appointment, in Maury City, Tennessee, they moved to Memphis, where Helen helped Roy as he served as an Associate Minister at Madison Heights UMC. Then, in 1963, Helen, along with their children Carol and Dee, helped Roy found and become charter members of Frayser Heights UMC, in Memphis. There, Helen directed the choir, in addition to a multitude of other duties involved in starting a new church. When they moved to Wesleyan Hills UMC, Helen picked up where she left off and became the choir director there, too. For 10 years, he and Janice served as treasurer for the Board Of Global Ministries' central office in Lima becoming the liaison between contributing churches and the national Methodist Church in Peru.
Upon returning to Tennessee, Elton and Janice were appointed to the Ripley Circuit in Lauderdale Co, TN, and Springdale, Frayser Heights, Grimes, and Greenland-Davant United Methodist Churches in Memphis. During retirement, they worshipped at St. Luke's United Methodist Church, where he was active in the visitation ministry. They lived nearby and enjoyed sharing a duplex-style home with the Sieger family, where he spent much time outdoors tending to his vegetable and flower gardens, shrubs, and trees. Elton served as the President of the Lambuth Alumni Association and as Chairman of Archives and History Committee as he researched and wrote for UMC Memphis Conference Historical Society. He continued his education at Boston University, where he earned a Ph.D. from the School of Theology in sociology and Christian ethics. During this time, he was elected "Man of the Year" among his graduate class, which he sometimes attributed to his wife's ability to make peach cobbler. His dissertation focused on The John Birch Society, an organization with concerns including the infiltration of Communism into American culture. Because of the depth of the research and its timeliness, "The John Birch Society: Anatomy of a Protest," was published by Beacon Press in 1964 as a seminal study on this topic and translated to a French and Armenian edition. It was most recently referenced in a January 2016 New Yorker Magazine article, "A View from the Fringe: The John Birch Society and the rise of the radical right." In 1968, he and Dolores attended the Christian World Council in the former Prague, Czechoslovakia where he also traveled across the Berlin Wall to East Berlin with a Quaker missionary who wanted to distribute medicine in this Communist area of the world. Dr. Broyles went on to serve United Methodist churches in Winchester and Lexington, Massachusetts and Orono and Boothbay Harbor, Maine before going to Memphis, Tennessee where he worked not only in pastoral roles at churches (Union Avenue and Wesleyan Hills United Methodist Church) but as a chaplain at the UT Center for Health Sciences and the Neighborhood Center in North Memphis. He is preceded in death by his parents, Edith Verna Allen and Joseph Warren Broyles, his brother, Joseph Warren Broyles (Patricia), his brotherand sister-in law Richard Bell Pettit and Julia Jones Pettit, and numerous friends and colleagues whom he is eager to join and become a part of a "cloud of witnesses" for those remain here. John was a graduate of Central High School in Memphis, Tennessee in 1953 and continued his education at Lambuth College in Jackson, Tennessee, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1957. Moving on to Nashville, Tennessee, John attended Vanderbilt University Divinity School graduating in 1959 with a Bachelor of Divinity degree. He also received a Masters of Divinity from Vanderbilt in 1972 and earned his Doctorate of Divinity from Vanderbilt in 1978.
John was an active minister of the United Methodist Church in the Memphis Annual Conference for over 60 years. His began his service in ministry in 1957 as a Probationary Member of the Conference, became a Deacon of the church in 1958, and ordained an Elder in 1960. He served the following churches and congregations throughout West Tennessee and Western Kentucky: New Trinity (1956), Lebanon-Carmel-Concord (1956-1959), Gadsden (1959-1960), Fairview-Northside Jackson (1960-1964), Union Avenue Memphis (1964-1966), Bardwell-Corinth (1966-1969), Broadway Paducah (1969-1972), Pleasant Valley Union City (1972-1977), McKenzie (1977-1982), Reidland Paducah (1982-1987), Whitehaven Memphis (1987-1989), Fulton (1989-1993), Capleville (1993-1995), Brownville (1995-1998). Upon his "official retirement" in 1998, John was appointed in Oak Grove UMC in the greater Jackson area. This projected "short-term" appointment eventually stretched into 17 years, serving as a joyous conclusion of his six decades in the pulpit. Finally, John served as Minister of Pastoral Care at Forrest Heights UMC in Jackson from 2015 until his death.
John was involved in many areas and ministries of the Memphis Annual Conference. He served for years as a counselor and camp director at Lakeshore UMC Camp in Eva, Tennessee, working with the youth of the church. He also served on numerous boards and councils of the Conference, including the Conference Council on Ministries, and the Conference Board of Pensions.
Beyond the Sunday morning sermons, John was very active in all levels of the local churches that he served. He taught Sunday School classes and lead Bible Studies throughout his ministry. He particularly enjoyed leading the annual confirmation classes of young teenagers, bringing them into full membership into the church. John could often be found making coffee, sweeping the floors, mowing the grass or painting the walls of the church buildings. If there was a need, John filled it.
In 1960, John was appointed to the Fairview-Northside circuit in Jackson. At the time, Northside UMC was meeting in a barn across North Highland Avenue from its present location. He helped the congregation grow and to shortly move into their first sanctuary, where he and the other members personally laid the bricks and finished the walls. Today, from those first seeds of HOPE, Northside's campus dwarfs the original buildings as a testimony to his and countless others hard work and faith.
Outside of his service to his churches and the Lord, John's greatest joy was his family. His wife, "Miss Bobbie", was his partner in life, service, and love. John and Bobbie were married on August 26, 1956 in Parsons, Tennessee. From the time that they had met at Lambuth College until the last days of John's life on earth, they filled every day with laughter. If they ever had an argument, no on heard it. It is quite possible a cross word was never spoken between them. Their love and devotion has been a reflection of their love of Christ and an example for all to follow. His, son, Tim, and his grandchildren, Adam, Andrew, and Olivia, were especially cherished. John's time and devotion to family was a cornerstone of his life and faith.
He was loved by all. Never met a stranger. Always ready with a kind hand or a good joke. "Doc" as his family called him, was greatly loved and respected. His presence on earth will be missed, but we know that God's host of angels are continuously rejoicing his arrival in heaven.

## Note 1 Nature of Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

A. Nature of Operations

The Memphis Conference (the Conference) is a regional body of The United Methodist Church comprised of the lay members, clergy, and 400+ churches in West Tennessee and West Kentucky. The Conference is primarily responsible for all the ministries that are jointly provided by and for United Methodists in its geographic area. The Conference administers Conference operating and program funds that are received from churches, boards and agencies, and individuals of the Conference in accordance with the budget and other directives of the Conference, the respective board and agencies and donors.
B. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

## C. Financial Statement Presentation

The Conference follows the recommendations contained in the Presentation of Financial Statements, Not-For-Profit Entities topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification. Under those provisions, net assets and revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the absence or existence and nature of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:

Unrestricted net assets - Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
Temporarily restricted net assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Conference pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time.

Permanently restricted net assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may be maintained permanently by the Conference. Generally, the donors of such assets permit the Conference to use all or part of the income earned on the assets.
D. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
E. Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Conference defines its cash, designated cash and cash equivalents to include cash on hand, demand deposits, and commercial paper and other investments with initial maturities of three months or less whether those amounts are unrestricted or restricted.

## F. Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in changes in net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized. However, if a donor contributes

an investment required to be held in perpetuity, gains and losses on the investment are subject to the same permanent restriction unless the donor explicitly states otherwise (currently the Conference has no such investment).
G. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of financial assets and liabilities is measured according to the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification. Fair value is required to be evaluated and adjusted according to the following valuation techniques.

Level 1 - Fair value is determined using quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2 - Fair value is determined using quoted market prices in active markets for similar assets and liabilities.

Level 3 - Fair value is determined using unobservable market prices in a market that is typically inactive.
H. Income Taxes

The Conference is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

## I. Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable include apportionments received after year-end for the budget year ended December 31, 2017 and 2016. No allowance for doubtful collections has been recorded.

## J. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are carried at cost if purchased and fair market value if donated. Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, excluding land, which are 3 to 40 years. Depreciation expenses for the year ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 were $\$ 19,625$ and $\$ 19,626$. Property includes land, building and improvements at the Conference headquarters in Jackson TN.

## K. Donated Services

Contributed services are reflected in the financial statements at the fair value of the services received only when those services either (1) create or enhance nonfinancial assets, or (b) require specialized skills that are provided by individuals possessing those skills and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. Unpaid volunteers make contributions of time in various administrative and program functions. The Conference has not valued these donations.

## L. Revenue and Support

Contributions are received and recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is

accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.

The primary source of support is Apportionments received from local churches in the Conference. Apportionments expire at the end of each calendar year and, therefore, have been recorded as unrestricted support. Contributions and Other Revenue are primarily receipts by programs that have external sources of revenue such as registration fees or reimbursements.

## M. Functional Allocation of Expenses

Expenses are charged directly to program, management and general, or fundraising based on a combination of specific identification and allocation by management.

## N. Prepaid Items

Certain payments to vendors reflect costs applicable to future accounting periods and are recorded as prepaid items.

For financial instrument valued using level 3 inputs (PACT investment), there is no change to the balance of the investment during the fiscal year 2017. The PACT investment is valued based on the Surplus Note and Cash Payment Calculations provided by United Methodist Property and Casual Trust as of December 31, 2012, which is the most recent information available. There is no change in the valuation technique for PACT investment during the fiscal year 2017.

## Note 4 Concentration of Risk

The Conference had bank deposits in a financial institution that were $\$ 2,318,255$ and $\$ 3,477,845$ in excess of the $\$ 250,000$ insured by the Federal Depository Insurance Corporation (FDIC) at December 31, 2017 and 2016.

## Note 5 Operating Leases

On July 17, 2015, the Conference entered into a lease agreement with NovaCopy for their copier. The agreement is for 63 months, with monthly payments of $\$ 935$. On January 19, 2011, the Conference entered into a lease agreement with MailFinance Inc. for a postage meter. The agreement is for 63 months, with monthly payments of $\$ 195$. The following schedule shows the future minimum lease payments:

## Note 6 Pension Plans

The Conference provides pension benefits for clergy serving churches in the Memphis Conference under Episcopal appointment, and full-time permanent staff of the Conference through various retirement plans. All plans are multi-employer plans administered by the General Board of Pension and Health Benefits of The United Methodist Church (GBOPHB). GBOPHB operates under the authority of the church's General Conference and implements the plans in accordance with plan documents. Pension benefits for clergy are a combination of defined benefit and defined contribution plans. Pension benefits for Conference lay staff are all defined contribution plans. Total Conference contribution to all plans for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 were $\$ 1,876,428$ and $\$ 1,858,821$. The various retirement plans are listed below:

## Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP):

CRSP is a multi-employer 403(b) retirement plan that provides pension coverage to eligible clergy. CRSP is both a defined benefit plan, which provides benefits based on years of credited service and a defined contribution plan, which provides a retirement account balance established and funded by the Conference. Effective $1 / 1 / 2014$, contributions to the defined benefit plan are actuarially determined and contributions to the defined contribution plan equal $2 \%$ of the clergy's monthly compensation, plus a matching contribution of up to $1 \%$ of the clergy's compensation, for a maximum of $3 \%$.

## Supplement One to CRSP (Pre-1982):

Pre-1982 is a multi-employer 403(b) defined benefit plan for Conference clergy entering service prior to 1982. General Conference 2000 required each annual conference to adopt a formal funding plan to retire the Conference pre-1982 pension obligations. The Conference's Pre-1982 plan has been fully funded. The Conference approves a minimum distribution (past service rate) each year for participants in the Pre-1982 plan, based on a recommendation by the Conference Board of Pensions. The PSR for the year ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 was $\$ 599$ and $\$ 587$ for pre-1982 service years, which is $.90 \%$ and $.90 \%$ of the Conference average compensation respectively.

United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP):
The UMPIP is a multi-employer 403(b) defined contribution plan providing eligible clergy and employees of the Conference with retirement savings. Conference employees and clergy may contribute up to the dollar limits set by current Internal Revenue Service regulations under both pre-tax and after-tax elections. The Conference makes a $6 \%$ contribution to the plan for parttime clergy. The Conference contributes an amount equal to $12 \%$ of its eligible lay employee's

compensation to the plan. If the employee contributes $3 \%$ to the plan, then the Conference will contribute 9\%.

## Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP)

CPP is a multi-employer health and welfare plan that provides death and disability benefits as well as other supplemental benefits to eligible clergy and their beneficiaries. CPP is funded by the Conference at a rate of $3 \%$ of compensation.

## Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP)

MPP covers clergy who served from 1982 through 2006. It is a multi-employer defined contribution plan, but differs from a true defined contribution plan in that upon retirement, participants must annuitize at least $65 \%$ of their account balances, and the Conference is responsible for funding the annuities should the need arise. Upon annuitization, the monthly benefit becomes a defined benefit.

Amounts designated for pension contributions that have been transferred to the legal title of the GBOPHB multi-employer plans are not included as net assets of the Conference. As of December 31, 2017 and 2016 the remaining GBOPHB multi-employer plans were valued as follows:

## Note 7 Health Care Plan

The Conference sponsors the Group Insurance Program of the Memphis Annual Conference (GIP). The GIP is open to all eligible plan participants including clergy, full-time Conference staff, and their respective dependents. The Conference Treasurer is the plan administrator. Previously, the plan administrator used a third-party administrator for processing claims and other duties but retains responsibility for benefits payable. The GIP was a self-funded plan paying covered benefits out of Conference assets. Plan participants help cover some costs of covered benefits through contributions, deductibles and out-of-pocket expenses. However, as of January 1, 2017, the Conference contracted with Healthflex and changed their GIP to a fullyinsured plan. Conference payments to the GIP for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 were $\$ 3,621,737$ and $\$ 3,891,766$.

A liability (Unfunded Postretirement Benefit Obligation) has been recognized representing the underfunded status of the Conference GIP in the amount of $\$ 10,667,299$ and $\$ 28,931,587$ as of December 31, 2017 and 2016.

## Note 9 Amendment to OPEB Plan

Effective January 1, 2017, the Conference's Health Care Plan changed from a traditional medical plan to an HRA subsidy. This change decreased the net periodic costs and caused the funded position to improve. In addition, as of January 1, 2017, the plan was amended to limit eligibility for future retirees to participants who were age 60 with 20 years of conference service as of July 1, 2016. The aforementioned changes resulted in an downwards adjustment to the unfunded Post-requirement Healthcare benefits of $\$ 18,367,198$ and contributed to the increase of unrestricted net assets designated for Post-retirement Healthcare benefits from $\$(28,931,587)$ in fiscal year 2016 to $\$ 268,910$ in fiscal year 2017.

## Note 10 Reclassification of Net Assets

In the financial statements for fiscal year ended December 31, 2016, \$703,896 was erroneously classified as Unrestricted Net Assets - Designated for Other Purposes. This amount should have been classified as Unrestricted Net Assets - Designated for Pension. The correction of the 2016 net assets, therefore, was made in the 2017 financial statements.

## Note 11 Other Matters

On September 12, 2017, the Memphis Conference Board of Pensions and Health Benefits approved to move $\$ 10,600,000$ from investments designated for pension to establish an investment designated for post-retirement healthcare.

## Note 12 Subsequent Events

The subsequent events of the Conference have been evaluated as of August 17, 2018, which is the date the report was available to be issued.
