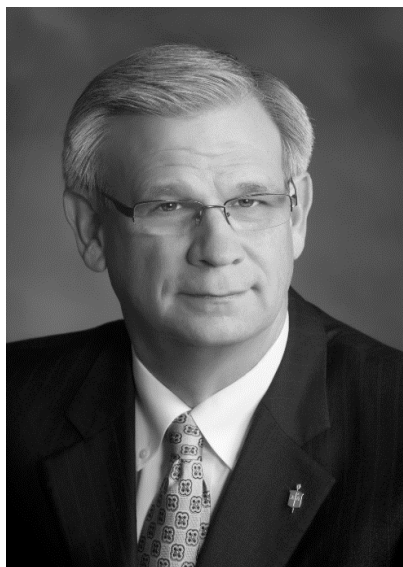

MEMPHIS CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

RULES OF ORDER

As amended by action of 2019 Memphis Annual Conference

1. The procedure of the Annual Conference shall be governed by the Rules of Order of the preceding General Conference insofar as they apply; otherwise *Robert's Rules of Order, Revised*, shall apply except
 - a. that those present and voting shall be a quorum for the Annual Conference and its subordinate bodies,
 - b. where the *Book of Discipline* provides otherwise and
 - c. when the final report of CF/A is before the Conference, up to twenty minutes of debate and Christian Conferencing shall be provided before the call of the previous question may be entertained by the chair.
 - d. the agenda for an Annual Conference may include a consent calendar which may contain the reports of designated conference agencies and any business matter of the conference. A majority vote of the conference delegates present may remove one or more items from the consent agenda for separate consideration by the Annual Conference.
 - e. through the bishop's leadership and in consultation with the extended cabinet, the sessions and agenda of the annual conference shall reflect the spirit and nature of Wesleyan conferencing and shall reflect alignment with the stated mission of the Memphis Conference. (Mission Statement adopted June 2014). ¶605.2
2. There shall be a Committee on Rules, composed of three lay persons and three clergy persons, to be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations, provided that, in addition, the Conference Chancellor shall serve as Chairperson and the Conference Secretary shall serve as an ex-officio member without vote.

The Committee on Rules shall:

- a. receive proposals for new Standing Rules and/or modifications of present rules.
 - b. propose new Standing Rules and/or modifications in present rules.
 - c. provide interpretation to the Annual Conference at points where Annual Conference action may be in variance with Standing Rules.
3. The Standing Rules may, by a two-thirds vote, be amended on the next day after an amendment has been presented in writing. The rule fixing the number of districts may be amended by a majority vote, provided that no change in the number of districts may be made later than the morning of the second day of the Annual Conference session.

Organization and Procedure

4. There shall be four districts in the Memphis Conference.
5. The bishop, or the bishop's designee, in consultation with the extended cabinet, will lead a mission strategy team (or operational team) to direct the mission and align the resources of the conference with the mission. The mission strategy team will promote effective strategies with and among districts and congregations to accomplish the mission. The mission strategy team will monitor and report progress toward accomplishing the mission.
6. The Memphis Annual Conference shall have a conference personnel committee chaired by the bishop, or the bishop's designee, that will be responsible for all conference personnel policies and procedures, unless the UM Book of Disciplines specifies otherwise. Membership of the committee, not including the chair, shall consist of an equal number of clergy and laity members. The personnel committee shall be responsible to staff the conference to pursue the mission. The personnel committee shall be responsible for conference job descriptions, employment, and supervision.
7. The secretary of the Annual Conference shall be responsible for editing and publishing the Conference Journal and is authorized to contract for its printing, subject to the approval of the Council on Finance and Administration, and to draw upon the Conference Treasurer for this expense.
8. Conference Membership:
 - a. Lay Members and Reserve Lay Members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually by the Charge Conference. Two additional lay members, one young person between the ages of twelve and seventeen and one young person between the ages of eighteen and thirty years of age, as required by The Discipline, shall be elected by each District Council on Ministries.
 - b. The membership, clergy and lay, shall be those persons who meet the qualifications for membership of the Annual Conference as set forth in Paragraph 602 of The Book of Discipline, 2012.
 - c. A charge shall elect an additional lay member for each 500 members or fraction thereof above 1000, provided that a charge shall elect a number of lay members that at least equals the number of

clergy members appointed to that charge. The Conference Secretary will determine the churches which qualify under these provisions and notify the District Superintendent in time for election by the Fall Charge Conference.

d. When additional lay members are needed to make an equal balance between lay and clergy membership, the cabinet will assign to each district the number of additional lay members subject to election by the Charge Conference of the church in which that lay person holds membership.

9. Required Reports:

a. The Council on Finance and Administration shall furnish to the Conference Treasurer's office, as early in the year as possible, an official copy of the Conference apportionments for all the churches in the Conference.

b. Each District Superintendent shall furnish to the Council on Finance and Administration, as early in the year as possible, an official copy of the church apportionments for those funds which are apportioned within the district bounds but not Conference-wide.

(These funds shall be apportioned by the District Stewards [*Discipline*, Paragraph 615.3] or in whatever manner each district shall determine.)

c. By January 1 of each year, each District Superintendent shall furnish the Conference Statistician an official itemized copy of the pastors' minimum compensation package for that year as set by the Charge Conferences. The total will be delineated by: base salary, travel and professional expenses, utilities and household allowance. An asterisk will indicate that the charge pays the group health insurance premium. A (p) will indicate a parsonage is provided, (h) will indicate a housing allowance and the amount will be noted, and (-) will indicate that no parsonage or housing allowance is provided.

10. The Conference Secretary shall be the custodian of records. The Conference Secretary shall keep a service record of all clergy members and diaconal ministers and shall publish this report in the *Journal*.

11. The Conference shall select from among its members a Conference Historian who shall record a detailed personal history of each clergy member in a suitable book for future reference.

12. Nominations and Resolutions:

a. Nominations:

1) The conference nominating committee, chaired by the bishop or the bishop's designee, shall discover, enlist, and nominate leaders to populate the organizational structure of the conference to advance the conference's stated mission to discover, equip, connect, and send lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world one neighborhood at a time. The conference nominating committee will nominate to the annual conference this body of quadrennial leaders.

The conference nominating committee will nominate on an annual basis to fill vacancies or to expand the work of committees, boards, and councils. ¶608.3

2) The Committee shall nominate from time to time the members of the boards, commissions and committees of the Annual Conference, unless such nomination is otherwise provided for in the *Discipline*, and shall make such other nominations from time to time that may be required by the Annual Conference. Each Conference board, commission, committee, etc., shall keep a record of attendance at its meetings. This record of attendance will be filed with the Conference Program Ministry Team office and be available to assist this committee to correctly make its nominations.

3) Vacancies in officers and elected members of the Connectional Ministry Team (CMT) may be filled until the next Annual Conference by the Connectional Ministry Team, upon nomination of the CMT Committee on Personnel. Vacancies occurring in other positions, for which the Committee on Nominations would ordinarily make a nomination, may be filled at the direction of the Chairperson of the Committee on

prerogative Nominations until the next session of the Annual Conference. The Chairperson may exercise the to poll the Committee on Nominations by means other than a called meeting of the Committee.

4) The Conference Secretary shall nominate persons to serve on the Committee on the Journal Minutes and the Bishop shall nominate the members of the Committee on Courtesy. The members of these committees shall be elected during the organizational session of the Annual Conference.

5) Nominations of trustees for Methodist LeBonheur Healthcare Systems, Inc., and Reelfoot Ministries, Inc., UM Neighborhood Centers, Wesley Foundations, Hannah's Hope and West KY Family Services shall come through the Conference Work Areas/Boards to which they are related and to the Conference Committee on Nominations for presentation to the Annual Conference.

b. Resolutions:

1) There shall be a Conference Committee on Resolutions composed of eight members, four lay persons and four clergy whose responsibility will be to receive, to study and to present such petitions and resolutions to the Annual Conference. This committee is to be nominated by the Conference Committee on Nominations and is to be elected quadrennially.

the 2) All resolutions shall be submitted to the Committee on Resolutions at least thirty (30) days prior to first day of the Annual Conference session. The Chair shall present to the Annual Conference, in their original form, all resolutions so submitted. In addition, the Committee may present to the Annual Conference for consideration a revised version of any such resolution.

13. The District Superintendents shall constitute the Committee on Memoirs. A memorial service for deceased members of the Annual Conference and their spouses shall be held during each regular session of the Annual Conference.

14. Moving dates for pastors will be set by the Bishop and Cabinet on or before April 1st.

The Ministry

15. Pastors' Report:

a. The pastor of the local church shall complete, each January, the Local Church Report to the Annual Conference for the preceding year. The report will be submitted according to the instructions of the Conference Statistician.

b. The pastor will see that a copy of the annual Local Church Report to the Annual Conference is retained by the local church and saved as a permanent record.

16. Pastors, other than student pastors, who receive salary support from the Conference Commission on Equitable Compensation, are required to reside within the bounds of the charge to which they are appointed and render full time service unless the exception is unanimously approved by the cabinet.

Financial

17. No resolution, report, motion or enabling act which involves a monetary obligation on the Conference shall be passed until it has been submitted to the Council on Finance and Administration and its recommendation has been reported to the Annual Conference.

In the first business session of the Annual Conference, the report of CFA shall be presented for information only. As Conference agencies make reports and budgetary requests, the concurrence or non-concurrence of CFA must be stated. If the Conference approves an agency budget request which is at variance with CFA's recommendation, that action shall constitute an automatic amendment to CFA's report. When CFA's report is the "order of the day" for approval as a whole, any previous Conference action amending that report shall be sustained without need for further amendment of the report, though amendment to CFA's report may be permitted.

18. The Conference Treasurer will close the books on such date as the Council on Finance and Administration shall designate but not later than January 5. At the closing of the books, all unobligated funds shall be transferred to the Conference Reserve Fund.

19. Pension responsibility for a probationary or full member who is serving in an appointment beyond the local church, other than one attending school, shall be allocated to the board, institution, or agency which he or she is serving.

20. The Council on Finance and Administration will provide in the Conference budget an amount for conducting Annual Conference.

21. Unless the bishop and cabinet, in consultation with the new church development team, determine that exceptional circumstances exist:

After the payment of any current year apportionments the proceeds from any local church property sales resulting in closure or abandonment and the proceeds from the sale of district or annual conference real property shall be designated as follows:

- a. 72% for planting new communities of faith in the Memphis Conference, allocated at the discretion of the new church development team, and
- b. 25% for planting new communities of faith or the revitalization of existing churches in the district.
- c. 3% for the ongoing care and storage of archives and artifacts related to closed churches. This amount to be deposited in a fund for the Area Archives and History Commission.

This statement shall be included in resolutions for closures of congregations, unless otherwise restricted by property deeds.

Boards and Commissions

21. All Quadrennial Conference agencies shall meet within 10 days of the Annual Conference at which they are elected to organize and report their officers to the Conference Secretary.

22. The tenure of all elected officers of the Conference and all members of its boards, commissions and committees, except the Conference Historian and members of the Commission on Archives and History, shall be limited to two

consecutive quadrenniums, unless otherwise provided in The Discipline. This shall not apply to the Conference Lay Leader's previous service on the Board of Laity.

23. Conference reports and motions:

a. All Conference agencies making reports to be voted upon by the Annual Conference shall complete their reports in time to have them in the Conference Connectional Ministries office in time for distribution to the Conference members. Any such item of business not so submitted must be in the hands of the members of the Conference at least twenty-four hours before consideration or receive a three-quarters vote of the house before consideration.

b. All reports, petitions, motions and resolutions presented to the Annual Conference shall be in the hands of the Conference Secretary in triplicate on forms provided by the secretary.

c. Any motion made from the floor of the Conference for the purpose of initiating or altering a matter for consideration (initial motion, amendment or substitute) which affects the Conference churches must be provided to the chair in writing. Such motion will be read from the chair, and the written version shall be considered the official version for the purposes of voting and for the recorded minutes.

CHURCH AND SOCIETY COMMITTEE REPORT

Greetings to the connectional ministries of the United Methodist Memphis Conference. The report that I want to present to you will be brief. First, I want to thank our dear sister Robbin McCoy who was a great help to me when I became chair of this committee. With the advice of our sister I was able to converse with Mrs. Edna Boner who gladly told me of her experience with this committee.

With the encouragement and enthusiasm of wanting to work in this area, we convened a first meeting that was held on October 15, 2019. Again, I am thankful to Mrs. Robbin McCoy who guided me through this first meeting. Without her help and advice this meeting would not have been possible. She provided me with the list of committee members whom I convened by email and then by text message. Some responded to our call apologizing because they could not be present, others did not reply at all and others asked me to remove them from the list.

As everything was new for me, I was not discouraged. I continued with the call, having the confidence that someone was going to attend our meetings and we would work together.

We made our agenda for that day and to our surprise two brothers, Pastor Rev. Larry Chitwood (Peace with Justice Representative) and Pastor Rev. Fred Morton (MICAHA and Poor People representative) arrived. We discussed how we could get the other team members involved. We were four people willing to serve on this committee and was hoping others would join us.

We discussed and agreed to continue with our meetings. The next meeting was scheduled to be a zoom conference; to achieve greater participation of leaders of this committee; to reconstitute the Church and Society committee at the Conference. We also discussed that we should invite other interested leaders to the committee. Apart from this agreement, our Brother Larry motivated us to support the work that he was developing in Peace and Justice. IN the same way, Brother Fred spoke to us about the work that he develops in MICAHA, Poor People and the lack of funding to develop those areas.

For our Second meeting (December 5) an invitation was sent a month in advance. A reminder was also sent 15 days before the meeting. However, only Pastor Larry, Pastor Fred, and Sister Amy from Trinity UMC participated. I was very grateful that Brother Larry Chitwood could be on this committee as Co-Chair for me, his help was invaluable.

During the meeting, I presented the need to support projects like the one that Brother Fred was carrying out. This was because he previously sent me a letter. However, I received a report of the limited funds in the Church and Society program. It was decided that Sister Amy could help us find funding for the Church and Society committee. The agreement was that we would meet with Sister Amy's group to learn more ideas about this.

I do not have any more details. I must confess that my first language is Spanish. My English is very basic. I use it only to go and support the members of my church when we visit the doctor or when I take them to the immigration office or school. Unfortunately, to revitalize our group it requires someone who speaks better English than myself. Despite everything, I was very determined to continue, but we did not have another meeting (due to COVID 19). I know that from their own areas our brothers have been working as Church and Society.

I want to thank you for the opportunity you gave me to coordinate this committee. I would love to continue working with you, but not as a coordinator, just as someone who is part of this committee. Again, I am grateful for the opportunity that you gave me to be a part of this committee. I will continue working to improve my English.

DISCIPLESHIP TEAM

The purpose of the Discipleship Team is to seek effective ways to increase the capacity of local churches and extension ministries to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Over the last several years, the work of the Discipleship Team has centered on aligning our efforts, training events, and resources with the mission, values, and four areas of focus of the Memphis Annual Conference. Our efforts in the near future will be geared toward discernment in terms of how we adapt in the season of alignment of our Annual Conference with the Tennessee Conference in forming the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Annual Conference. The design of this team may have to be flexible even as we seek to continue leading in the area of working with congregations and extension ministries in the mission of making disciples of Jesus.

We are tremendously blessed to have excellent leadership in the areas of youth, children, camping, leadership development, family, and scouting ministries.

A strong connection has developed among youth workers throughout the Memphis Conference and among youth themselves. The youth in the Conference continue to take part in the fall and spring retreats, 30-hour famine, and the Youth Annual Gathering (formerly, Youth Annual Conference), which leads up to the Annual Conference in June. Through these opportunities of connection and growth, we are making a difference as hundreds of youth throughout the conference have participated! We have excellent leadership in youth ministry who have taken the initiative to do some preparatory work on forming a youth ministry team for the newly emerging Annual Conference we will be a part of.

Since 2013, the Generative Leadership Academy (GLA) has shown tremendous fruit in developing lay and clergy leaders in congregations, increasing their capacity to make disciples of Jesus Christ and to engage the mission field. In 2017, GLA launched at a new location in West Tennessee at the Natchez Trace State Park. In 2019, there were over 40 new participants for GLA. As our conference transitions into our alignment for the new Tennessee-Western Kentucky Annual Conference, we did not prepare a GLA session for 2020. We are in conversation with leaders in the Tennessee Conference.

The makeup of the Discipleship Team is more extensive than those mentioned herein, and the impact of the various leaders on this team extends further than the work of this team I am honored to lead. The process of discipleship, ideally, infects all aspects of our Conference's work, since the work of making "disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" is the mission of the Church. Still, as we move forward in seeking for innovative, fruitful, and tangible expressions of making disciples, we invite your prayers for discernment and participation to these ends.

MEMPHIS CONFERENCE YOUTH MINISTRY

Despite the challenges the end of the 2019-2020 ministry year brought, we are happy to report that we have seen evidence of the Holy Spirit at work within our Memphis Conference Youth Ministry. This is the second year we have lived into the team leadership model as we seek to empower and minister with the youth in our conference. This year Conference Youth Leadership Team (CYLT) has consisted of Amanda Hartmann Westmoreland, John Shaw, Brittany Martin, Susan Davidson, Josh McClurkan, and Amanda Crice. We are grateful to have every district and a wide variety of experience requested on this leadership team.

We have given participle attention to sharpening our understanding of our WHY for conference youth ministry and in reflection we have named the following:

- Train, Equip, and Resource Young Leaders and those who work with them at the local, district, and conference level

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- Seek God's Justice through Conversation, Education, and Action
- Model Wesleyan Spiritual Formation
- Practice Ministry that is committed to caring for the whole person - body, mind, and spirit
- Foster Connectionalism and Prioritize Diversity that truly reflects the people of our conference
- Align mission and vision across the connection (campus ministry, children's ministry, confirmation, intergenerational ministry, etc.)

It has been our intention to use these pillars as a compass to guide the program ministry we are able to execute. This past fall we welcomed and trained 13 youth from all over the conference to be a part of our Conference Youth Council (CYC); Amber Mathis, Davis Cox, Gage Starks, Jack Cocke, Jonathan Sills, Kirkland Norwood, Kyla Smith, Laura Mobley, Owen Jackson, Sophie Barker, Talon Blackwelder, Virginia Varden, and Emily Koesterman.

These leaders successfully planned and executed a fall retreat at Lakeshore in October around the theme: "Who Do You Say I Am?" using the enneagram to help youth understand their unique gifts and identity in the Body of Christ. There were plans to host this same retreat to more youth from around the conference in March, but that was cancelled due to extreme caution to protect students and their families from the spread of the coronavirus. Our conference youth council met that challenge, though, offering student written devotionals in the early days of quarantine and working together to create a virtual version of this retreat that will be offered to youth around the conference June 10-12.

In January the CYC gathered for worship, service leadership development and planning at St. Matthew UMC in Memphis. There the students made plans for the annual Youth Annual Gathering. Though that has also been affected by the virus, the CYC and the CYLT are working together to help offer something around the new dates of our Annual Conference.

Other work this year has included intentional planning around Youth Lay Servant Training. We celebrate the 36 youth and lay servants representing all four districts who came together this past August to offer a VBS program to neighborhood kids they met during last spring's youth lay servant training event. These young people enjoyed meals provided by Ridgely UMC and worshiped with Tiptonville UMC. Dyersburg UMC helped provide transportation. Together the group served 45 at-risk youth in the area. While this year's spring event had to be cancelled, we were excited about the direction of this ministry to include and empower youth in small membership churches and rural areas.

Additionally, this team has been active in our efforts to ensure the WHY behind our ministry is included in the vision of conference youth ministry in the future TWK Conference. Several members of our CYLT and CYC have participated in conversations to help bridge the ministries of the two conferences, and our Conference Youth Council has been intentional to reach out and form authentic relationships with the CCYM youth in the TN Conference. This has included participation in their annual event Warmth in Winter as well as joint zoom calls together in the wake of COVID-19.

We continue to trust and believe that God is up to something beautiful and that the Holy Spirit uses the youth among us in particularly special ways to guide the church into the New Thing God is doing. Thanks be to God for the privilege it is to walk with these youth on that journey.

BOARD OF LAITY REPORT

The Memphis Conference Board of Laity is composed of various lay and group leaders from around the conference that represent multiple ministries of the laity. Our purpose is to foster an awareness and advocacy for the role of the laity, to encourage laity participation in the life of the church, to provide leadership training for lay leaders, lay servants and annual conference delegates, and to promote the observance of Laity Sunday.

To strengthen our emphasis to **Invest in Young People**, our churches have been active with our children, youth and campus ministries. Rev. Amanda Crice has done an excellent job of leading our Conference Youth Ministry and mentoring several young adults to assume various leadership roles. In this particularly unique time of physical distancing, many of our churches are finding creative ways to connect with our children and youth via virtual Sunday School, mid-week meet-ups, virtual Easter Egg hunts and other activities. Some young people are also making wellness check calls to senior members of their churches. Our young people have also been instrumental in assisting their church leaders in this new world of electronic worship.

Our churches continue to **Engage the Mission Field** within their communities and beyond. There is an increased awareness and need for food ministries and our churches have found creative ways to answer the call. A number of our churches currently serve as food distribution sites and some are even offering front porch delivery of food boxes for needy families. Thousands of face protection masks have been sewn, packaged and shipped to medical facilities within and outside the U.S. Blessing boxes and “share shacks” are popping up around the conference as places to deposit donations of non-perishable food items and paper products that are available to their neighbors. Our United Methodist Men and Women’s groups continue to stay involved in mission opportunities as much as possible.

Our conference continues to provide excellent training opportunities that provide ways for us to **Create Transforming Lay and Clergy Leaders**. Led by Susan Davidson, our Lay Servant Training continues to expand throughout the conference, with many classes comprised of youth and young adults who may be discerning a call to ministry. Bible studies and other small group events are being live streamed and participation has been very strong. Districts offered some sort of leadership training opportunity earlier this year for key local church leaders - some of these being led by Discipleship Ministries. Additionally, laity continue to read, reflect and study on their own in order to further nurture and strengthen their spiritual lives.

Our churches continue to navigate the complex waters of our current physical distancing mandate. We have seen an increase in worship participation via our electronic platforms as we seek to continue to **Grow Fruitful and Faithful Churches**. Our churches have been extremely innovative and creative as they have worked to provide worship experiences for their members. Lay and clergy alike have enjoyed participating in multiple worship service experiences through live streaming, Facebook Live, Zoom, and video recordings. It’s truly been a blessing to worship with churches all throughout our conference that we may not otherwise have an opportunity to visit. It’s also exciting to see that our churches are still taking in new members, even in this time of physical distancing.

Our Board of Laity met recently with Bishop McAlilly. In late March, we had a scheduled one-day retreat with the Tennessee Conference Board of Laity, but it has been postponed until August 29. Meanwhile, it is our plan for both Boards of Laity to meet together via Zoom in the near future so that we can begin to build relationships with each other as we move toward becoming a new conference.

Our laity continue to partner with and pray for our clergy as we work together to fulfill the mission of the Memphis Annual Conference.

LAY RESOURCE LEADER REPORT

The focus of the work in this district is on Lay Leadership. We have had new laity participate in the Lay Servant Ministries. There have been 2 Basic Lay Servant Classes and 2 Advanced Lay Servant Classes. We have had 2 classes of Certified Lay Ministers trained this year. All of these people are serving in ministry in some way. We had a Youth Lay Servant Weekend Mission Trip in August. We had 36 students involved in that ministry. A new opportunity for education for our CLMs was developed. Our District Superintendent, Dr. Cynthia Davis teaches a Practical Theology class every first Saturday before the First Sunday of the month. This is a time of teaching, sharing and Holy Communion. At this time, the communion elements are blessed by Dr. Davis. We currently have 20 Certified Lay Ministers serving churches in our district.

Another ministry in our district is run by lay persons. That is Exceptional Worship, a worship service for special needs people of all ages. This is held at Forest Heights UMC on the third Sunday of each month at 2:00. Special needs men and women, boys and girls participate in this worship service.

We had a district Ministry Celebration last September at Dyersburg FUMC. There, with 300-350 sisters and brothers in Christ, we worshiped together as a District.

Our situation with the Corona Virus has caused many postponements of planned events. Our April Youth Lay Servant Mission Weekend, CLM trainings, District Ministry Celebrations, District Lay Servant Appreciation Brunch and other events will be rescheduled. At this time we are using Zoom to have meetings, training and Sunday School. All of us are making an effort to stay connected as much as possible.

PURCHASE DISTRICT RESOURCE MINISTRIES

We invest in young people. By providing DayShore day camp opportunities at local churches during the summer, we reach out to children who are unable or unready to attend overnight camps. Last summer, there were six camps held which was an increase of one from the year before. Many of these churches work together to raise funds so that they can provide free or reduced registration fees for children who would otherwise not be able to attend. Because of the current pandemic, we are unsure about whether or not we will be able to provide these experiences this year, but prior to that there were plans to continue this ministry. The second "NEXT: Exploring Your Christian Walk" initiative was being planned and may take place this fall once restrictions are lifted regarding group gatherings and social distancing.

We engage the mission field. This is always important and the forefront of our ministries, but it is now more important than ever. Local churches who provide feeding ministries have stepped up their services while at the same time abiding by social distancing guidelines. Many have picked up the slack when some school districts were unable to provide food due to quarantine requirements. Project Christmas House is a ministry of the Purchase District that helps a family rebuild their home after a catastrophic event from which they cannot recover alone. Led by Mr. Bill Carr, a team spent the week between Christmas and New Year's in Hattiesburg, MS working to build a home on stilts to avoid the effects of flooding. We also have churches that work to build wheelchair ramps for those who need them. One church, Reidland, has a team that has continually been in existence for twenty-five years. Led by Mr. Joe Burkhead, the team has devised a protocol that allows them to continue to meet the needs of their community while abiding by social distancing guidelines. At the time of this

writing, they have built three ramps using this protocol. Third Place Ministries in Benton, led by Rev. David Garrett, helps families in crisis with past-due utility bills, gas vouchers to get a person to a medical appointment, clothing vouchers to get children back to school, and several other “crisis” needs. This is made possible by donations from churches and individuals in our community. There is a Thrift Store, New To You, that also assists with funding.

Additionally, Third Place sponsors a radio show led by Mrs. Lois Cunningham that follows the Day1 show on Sundays. The show provides a worship opportunity focusing on scripture from the Revised Common Lectionary. It also brings an awareness to the community of available services and events sponsored by the District.

We create transformational lay and clergy leaders. This year, we have offered several training opportunities for both laity and clergy. Basic Lay Servant and Advanced Lay Servant classes were well attended, and twenty-two Lay Servants were approved during charge conferences this year. A book study and training session for clergy was conducted, and CEU’s were awarded to those who participated.

We grow fruitful and faithful churches. In the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, we are finding this to be different than anything we have ever experienced. Our churches and our pastors are striving to find innovative ways to stay in touch with their congregations and communities. There have been many Zoom Sunday School classes and worship, Facebook Live, YouTube and Vimeo services. Opportunities for online giving have been increased. Due to our present situation, there has been that some of our churches, especially our smaller churches who typically have lower attendance, are experiencing many “views” of their services. We hope that once we are able to worship in person once again that some of our churches will continue to use an online format as a method of outreach to their communities, and that some viewers who have not attended in person prior might do so.

COMMISSION ON ARCHIVES AND HISTORY

Gratia Downs Strother, Conference Archivist

The Tennessee and Memphis Conferences Commission on Archives and History has a twofold purpose, both administrative and connectional. Administratively, we preserve and make available to the Church and the public artifacts and information that document our Tennessee and Memphis Conferences and United Methodist heritage. Connectionally, we are here to strengthen the faith of Christians through the stories of the heroes of the faith that have gone before us and grow a sense of heritage that builds community within our churches and connectedness across our conference.

Our activities the past year:

1. We have begun the process of developing a website to create a virtual online archive. This will enable searching a catalog of our holdings, and for many of those holdings, viewing the actual historic documents and photographs of artifacts online. We have begun the process of photographing and scanning items for the online archive and creating date files with information about each item.
2. Conference historian David Martin has completed the work of updating church clergy files through 2019 clergy appointments. Thanks to his work and the work of retired archivist Von Unruh, we have the most comprehensive clergy lists possible based on current research, for the majority of churches that have existed in our conference history. Martin is also working to photograph every extant UM church in our conferences and document burial locations of Methodist clergy, as well as cemetery information on all cemeteries connected to UM churches.
3. We have continued to serve the public and the Church on site at the conference archives in the McKendree UMC Christian Life Center in Nashville. Visitors to our archives this year have included not only patrons with a current or past connection to the UMC and clergy, but also academic researchers from universities and archivists from UMC archives in other states.

4. We have continually answered patron requests throughout the year, on topics as wide ranging as genealogical information, foreign missions, and laity and clergy involvement in the Civil Rights movement. We were thrilled that journalist Anne Holt called us to help her with research on a news segment she did on Pickett Chapel in Wilson County.

When the Washington Post published an article about notorious slave trader John Armfield and his connection to Beersheba Springs, and mentioned Beersheba Springs as Methodist retreat center, we were able to help the Tennessee Conference Camp and Retreat Ministries with historical information to tell an accurate story of the history of Beersheba Springs on their website. Camp and Retreat Ministries then began the process of acknowledging of the tragic story of slavery connected to this location as well as developing a "Service of Healing and Reconciliation" which had to be postponed due to COVID-19.

5. We have served on the annual conference design teams for both Tennessee and Memphis. In Memphis, Mark Matheny is leading preparations for a celebration of MAC history. In Tennessee, Archivist Gratia Strother is leading preparations for a celebration of TNUMC history. Both celebrations are for the final conferences of these two as separate entities - which will now happen in 2021 due to COVID-19 delays.
6. We have supported church growth through presentations for laity clubs and churches about our Methodist and conference history, and collaborated with church historians on researching and sharing their church's history.
7. We have begun the process of building a network of active church historians across our conference. This work is ongoing.
8. We have collaborated with other historians and archivists from across the country and engaged in continuing education programs to keep our archives on the cutting edge of industry standard methodology and processes.
9. We have continued to preserve the UMC historic sites in our care - the Asbury-Babb House in Wilson County and Strother's Meeting House on the campus of Scarritt-Bennett Center.
10. We have received a number of additions to our collections over the past year:
 - a. Collections of personal records from several clergy, donated by their families
 - b. Collections from closed churches in both the Memphis and Tennessee conferences
 - c. A time capsule collection and companion oral history from a Memphis closed church
 - d. A collection of various items from the Upper Room Museum, including an 1830's circuit rider quilt owned by Elisha Carr and made by his sister Mary "Polly" Carr Stewart Crenshaw. It is believed that the fabric pieces making up the face of the quilt came from Rev. Carr's parishioners, who were mostly enslaved Africans in the African Mission that he served as pastor. The fabrics are a combination of machine and hand-dyed woven pieces, typical of what would have been worn by enslaved Africans. This quilt, like other items in the John Abernathy Smith Heritage Center, illustrates the power of artifacts and documents to illuminate our conference history - in this case, a story of the sparse nature of the circuit rider's life, but also of the African American experience in our conference.

For the coming year, we are committed to continuing this work, launching an online archive, and continuing to preserve and make available to the Church and the public artifacts and information that document our conference and United Methodist heritage.

Review JDC Scope and decisions:

1. Determine the legal structure of the Conference Board of Pension & Health Benefits.
Completed: Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference Board of Pension & Health Benefits will be separately incorporated.
2. Determine use of existing reserves from each conference after a thorough review of the restricted and designated status of each fund.
Completed: A thorough review was conducted. Reserves designated for Pension will remain so designated. Reserves designated for Post-Retirement Medical Benefits will remain so designated per trust documents.
3. Determine depositories and investment policies.
Completed: All accounts will be renamed to Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference and the current Memphis Conference investment policy will be adopted for the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference.
 - a. Checking accounts-MAC & TAC accounts will be combined
 - b. Wespath Accounts
 - i. Deposit Accounts-MAC & TAC accounts will be combined
 - ii. Pre-82 Accounts-MAC & TAC accounts will be combined
 - iii. Superannuate Accounts-MAC & TAC accounts will be combined
 - iv. Combine remaining funds (Pension Crusade PR Trust, TN Pension Reserve Trust, Stabilization Fund) into one account.
 - c. Foundation Accounts-Current TAC accounts with Foundation & Development fund will be renamed and maintained in current location.
 - d. Other Investments-MML Investor Services will be renamed
4. Establish the Pre-82 Past Service Rate (PSR) and contingent annuitant rate.
Completed: PSR of \$750 and contingent annuitant rate of 70% for 2022 will be adopted for Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference.
5. Develop the procedure for clergy seeking medical leave with CPP disability benefits.
Completed; The TWK Conference will establish a joint committee on clergy medical Leave per BOD para.652. Any clergy seeking CPP Disability should first contact their District Superintendent and the Conference Benefits Officer (CBO) who will provide CPP application. Upon receipt of completed application, the CBO working with the Chair of joint committee on clergy medical leave will convene to review application within 2 weeks. The approved application will be forwarded to Wespath for an eligibility determination.
6. Develop policy, procedure, and funding strategy for special grants.
Completed: If medical leave has been granted IAW BOD Para. 356 and the CPP determination has not yet been made, the Board of Pension & Health Benefits may authorize compensation payments not to exceed the projected amount of the CPP disability payments upon request of the District Superintendent. Payments will be funded from Board of Pension & Health Benefits reserves
7. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for Retiree Health Care benefits.
Completed: TWK will adopt VIA Benefits offered by Wespath to provide access to Medicare Supplement plans per BOD for all future retirees without HRA funding. The Memphis and Tennessee post-retirement health care programs will be maintained currently enrolled in their respective program and for those grandfathered under previously approved conference programs.

8. Develop policy and funding strategy for Extension Ministries
Completed: The TWK Conference will assume responsibility for benefits for the following conference-related entities: District Offices; Wesley Foundation/Campus Ministries; Hannah's Hope; Lakeshore UM Assembly; Reelfoot Rural Ministries; Neighborhood Center. Plan designs will be the same as conference plans. Entities will be billed for benefits related expenses.
9. Determine UMPIP Sponsorship.
Completed: The TWK Conference will be the plan sponsor for clergy contributions and remit those to Wespeth through direct billing of churches.

Benefits issues resolved by Benefits Task Team and approved by 2020 MAC & TAC annual conference

1. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for Lay Staff benefits
Completed: Memphis & Tennessee adopted employees 9% plus an additional 3% match if employee contributes 3%.
2. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for Part-time Clergy benefits.
Completed: Memphis & Tennessee adopted UMPIP contributions of 9% of plan compensation.
3. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for Active Health Care benefits
Completed: Memphis & Tennessee adopted Healthflex Exchange for Fulltime Clergy & Conference staff. Premium credit is determined by blended rate model and directed billed to the entities and churches.
4. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for CRSP benefits
Completed: Memphis & Tennessee adopted to cover Fulltime Clergy only. Cost to be directed billed to the entities and churches.
5. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for Conference Benefits Funding Plan (CBFP)
Completed: Memphis & Tennessee CFBP was combined in 2020 in anticipation of the 2021 merger.
6. Develop policy, plan design, and funding strategy for Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP)/UMLIFE.

Motion: Steve Curry moved, As required by paragraph 1509 of the Book of Discipline, that the JDC submit its final action report as described in the document "Scope of Joint Distributing Committee" to be filed with the Secretary of the Tennessee Annual Conference, the Memphis Annual Conference and Wespeth Benefits and Investments, and that the JDC be dissolved, effective April 7th, 2021. Rev. Jefferson Furtado seconded. Motion approved

CONFERENCE BOARD OF ORDAINED MINISTRY

The Lord is with you. **And also with you.**

Bishop McAlilly, sisters and brothers of the Memphis Conference, good afternoon.

I am honored to report on behalf of the women and men, lay and clergy, who make up the Board of Ordained Ministry of the Memphis Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. We thank God for these servants and their faithful stewardship of the work charged to this body.

The Board of Ordained Ministry supports our Bishop's directive to create a culture of call. The Board of Ministry recruits, vets, invests in, prepares, and credentials those called by God to serve as lay, licensed, commissioned, and ordained ministers. Most are familiar with our role in licensing, commissioning and ordination of candidates for ministry, but we begin planting seeds long before that. Under Johnny Jefford's leadership, a Young Clergy initiative Grant provided internships for young adults in urban and rural settings. Currently, a Young Clergy Initiative Intern leads recovery ministry at Fulton First UMC and two new interns will be placed at Clinton First and Capleville UMC this year.

We nurture relationships with students at our Wesley Foundations. We engage campus ministers to connect with student leaders. Whether it is leading conversations, hosting dinner, or providing funding for students to explore their call to ministry, the Board of Ordained Ministry is a resource. This conference year, we helped send 7 students and an adult mentor to Exploration, a conference that helps young people discern their call to ministry. Listen now as one of those students, Danielle Harstin shares her witness...

In this session of heightened racial awareness, so many of us are scrambling to educate ourselves, to prepare ourselves to be more faithful witnesses to the gospel of Jesus Christ who calls us to love God and our neighbor as we love ourselves. The General Board of Church and Society is the agency of the church that helps us connect our faith to acts of compassion and mercy and advocates for just policy in the church and in seats of power around the world. In January, we sent two young adult clergy under 35 years old to the Young Clergy Forum in Washington, DC, Sara Corum and Kris Roof. Please listen as Sara Corum briefly offers her experience...

We continue our report by recognizing our Certified Lay Ministers. The certified lay minister is "called and equipped to conduct public worship, care for the congregation, assist in program leadership, develop new and existing faith communities, preach the word, lead small groups, or establish community outreach ministries as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergy person." (2016 BOD ¶ 268.1)

Wesley's historic questions have been asked of those considered for full connection and ordination since the very first Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1784. BOARD OF PENSIONS AND CLERGY WELLNESS

Rev. Dr. Scott Alford, Chairperson

Part A

The Board of Pension and Health Benefits continues its ministry of serving the clergy and clergy families of the Memphis Conference, and we are grateful for the chance to share together in this work. We wish to thank Larry Davis and Clare Wilson for the daily work they provide in the Treasurer's Office.

With the transition of forming the new Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference, some of our work has been in conversation with the new conference benefits task team as a way for us to begin aligning benefits between the Memphis and Tennessee Conferences.

The board currently holds reserves with Wespath to be used for pension and benefit purposes only, and we are pleased that all pension plans are funded in full. The board monitors our reserves and strives to maintain them at an acceptable level. As with all investments, our reserves are subject to market fluctuations and other variables. Remaining observant and making smart decisions will be key in sustaining proper funding levels. Through incorporation and the creation of trusts, the board has made steps to protect our assets, helping the plans remain financially stable.

Part B: Allowances to Retirees

Regarding allowances for the benefit of retired ministers, the Conference Board of Pension and Health Benefits recommends the following:

That ministers retired prior to the opening session of a regular annual conference shall receive an allowance at the rate of up to \$75.00 per day effective June 3, 2012 for each day in attendance at the conference. Reimbursement shall be authorized by the Board of Pension and Health Benefits upon receipt of a voucher showing the actual expense incurred. This benefit shall be available also to surviving spouses, subject to the same conditions.

That upon retirement, full-time active ministers in regular appointment will receive a one-time retirement stipend in the amount of \$1,500 effective January 1, 2011.

That upon retirement, part-time active ministers in regular appointment will receive a one-time retirement stipend proportional to their appointment percentage at retirement in the amount of \$1,125 (75%), \$750 (50%), and \$375 (25%) effective July 1, 2014.

Those full-time, active members in regular appointment may receive the retirement one-time stipend at the time of taking disability leave in lieu of receiving it at the time of retirement.

Beginning January 1, 2017, retirees and spouses on their plan receive a defined contribution of \$250 per month (\$3000 annually) through a Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) and are allowed to participate in the Medicare Supplement program called ViaBenefits. The ViaBenefits program is available through Wespath, though it is operated by Towers-Watson. Retirees/Spouses may use their HRA accounts to pay premiums or help with deductibles or copays. To qualify for the retiree subsidy, the retiree must have served a minimum of 20 years in a full-time appointment (local church, campus ministries, or under appointment to an entity accruing pension benefits) in the Memphis Conference or other conference in the case of one who has transferred from another conference. The retiree subsidy program has been terminated for future retirees. To allow future retirees adequate time to plan for retiree medical expenses the cut-off age is 60. Everyone who was 60 years of age or older as of July 1, 2016, with 20 years of service as defined above would remain eligible for the retiree medical subsidy.

Part C: Incapacity Leave

In accordance with ¶ 356.1 of *The Book of Discipline*, 2016, the Conference Board of Pension and Health Benefits recommends the following conference members to be approved for disability benefits:

Only pastors granted Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP) incapacity leave by Wespath qualify for Conference Board of Pension and Health Benefits incapacity leave benefits in the Memphis Conference.

Part D: Resolutions Relating to Rental/Housing Allowances for Retired, Disabled, or Former Clergypersons of the Memphis Conference (Revision effective January 1, 2014)

The Memphis Conference (the "Conference") adopts the following resolutions relating to rental/housing allowances for active, retired, terminated, or disabled clergypersons of the Conference:

WHEREAS, the religious denomination known as The United Methodist Church (the "Church"), of which this Conference is a part, has in the past functioned and continues to function through ministers of the gospel (within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code section 107) who were or are duly ordained, commissioned, or licensed ministers of the Church ("Clergypersons");

WHEREAS, the practice of the Church and of this Conference was and is to provide active Clergypersons with a parsonage or a rental/housing allowance as part of their gross compensation;

WHEREAS, pensions or other amounts paid to active, retired, terminated, and disabled Clergypersons are considered to be deferred compensation and are paid to active, retired, terminated, and disabled Clergypersons in consideration of previous active service; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized the Conference (or its predecessors) as an appropriate organization to designate a rental/housing allowance for Clergypersons who are or were members of this Conference and are eligible to receive such deferred compensation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT an amount equal to 100% of the pension, severance, or disability payments received from plans authorized under *The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church* (the "Discipline"), which includes all such payments from Wespath during the period January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, by each active, retired, terminated, or disabled Clergyperson who is or was a member of the Conference, or its predecessors, be and hereby is designated as a rental/housing allowance for each such Clergyperson; and

THAT the pension, severance, or disability payments to which this rental/housing allowance designation applies will be any pension, severance, or disability payments from plans, annuities, or funds authorized under the Discipline, including such payments from Wespath and from a commercial annuity company that provides an annuity arising from benefits accrued under a Wespath plan, annuity, or fund authorized under the Discipline, that result from any service a Clergyperson of this Conference rendered to any local church, annual conference of the Church, general agency of the Church, other institution of the Church, former denomination that is now a part of the Church, or any other employer that employed the Clergyperson to perform services related to the ministry of the Church, or its predecessors, and that elected to make contributions to, or accrue a benefit under, such a plan, annuity, or fund for such an active, a retired, a terminated, or a disabled Clergyperson's pension, severance, or disability plan benefit as part of his or her gross compensation.

NOTE: The rental/housing allowance that may be excluded from a Clergyperson's gross income in any year for federal (and, in most cases, state) income tax purposes is limited under Internal Revenue Code section 107(2), and regulations thereunder, to the least of: (a) the amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the Clergyperson's employer or other appropriate body of the Church (such as this Conference in the foregoing resolutions) for such year; (b) the amount actually expended by the Clergyperson to rent or provide a home in such year; or (c) the fair rental value of the home, including furnishings and appurtenances (such as a garage), plus the cost of utilities in such year. Each clergyperson or former clergyperson is urged to consult with his or her own tax advisor to determine that deferred compensation is eligible to be claimed as a housing allowance exclusion.

PART E: Current Program/Budget Projection/Funding Request

The Memphis Conference Board of Pension and Health benefits 2021 budget request will be included in the Conference Finance and Administration Report.

PART F: Memphis Annual Conference Funding Plan for Supplement One to the Ministerial Pension Plan

The 2021 Past Service Rate (PSR) is \$646, which represents a 1.5% cost of living adjustment. The Board of Pension and Health Benefits has adopted the policy to update the PSR based on the rate of change in the Conference Average Compensation.

Wespath's actuarial valuation of the Pre-82 plan for the Memphis Conference shows more assets than benefit obligations. We anticipate no additional deposits into this account in the near future.

PART G: CRSP Eligibility and UMPIP Contributions for Part-Time Clergy

The Clergy Retirement Security Plan (CRSP) is for full time clergy under Episcopal appointment within the bounds of The Memphis Annual Conference. The United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) is for all clergy, including those serving less than full time, under Episcopal appointment within the bounds of The Memphis Conference.

Effective January 1, 2014, the Memphis Conference has elected to cover only clergy serving full time under the Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP). The Memphis Conference will contribute to the United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) on behalf of clergy who are no longer covered under CRSP. Clergy who are serving three-quarter, half-time or one-quarter time will receive a contribution in the amount of 9% of plan compensation to their UMPIP accounts.

PART H: Active Clergy Health Insurance

In 2021, Wespeth, through Healthflex Exchange, is opening six medical insurance plan options for clergy and their families, billing the annual conference a blended rate. For churches with clergy on the conference plan, premiums billed to the churches will reflect that blended rate in the form of a fixed premium credit. Each church will be billed the same amount of no more than \$15,100 annually.

The clergy then choose the insurance plan that best fits their needs and pay the premium appropriate to their selection through a pre-tax salary reduction.

Dental and Vision coverages remain optional, and those premiums may also be paid in full or in part through a pre-tax salary reduction. Through Healthflex Exchange, there are three dental and two vision plan options from which the clergy may choose.

The due date for submitting premium payments is the 25th of each month, and a 2% late fee will be added for payments received after the due date. Insurance may be subject to cancellation after 90 days of nonpayment.

The Board of Pension and Health Benefits will continue to pay 100% of premiums for those who are on CPP approved disability.

COUNCIL ON FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Policy Recommendations for Fiscal Year 2020

- I. The Council on Finance and Administration concurs with the Connectional Ministries Team regarding conference and general church special day observances. We also concur with the special day designated offerings.
- II. We recommend that only under emergency conditions, as determined by the CFA in consultation with the bishop and the cabinet, shall funds be borrowed from an outside lender for current expenses. The maximum such borrowing shall be \$250,000 (two hundred fifty thousand dollars).
- III. The CFA recommends that it be authorized to act on requests for funds in those situations in which budgeted funds, as approved by the conference, are inadequate to meet emerging missional needs for unforeseen circumstances. Those requests which are approved shall be funded from the Conference Reserve Fund, and the amounts of the funding shall be reported to the conference (2016 Discipline p. 612.7).
- IV. We advise all agencies that the conference treasurer will be instructed to issue funds only up to the amount of the projected income for each fund for the year. Salary items shall be paid at full budgeted amounts, but the amounts remaining in the budgets after salaries are funded will be expended only up to the projected percentage of apportioned amounts that will be collected. Each group is responsible for proper allocation of its funds for the year, and no funds will be issued when the projected income ceiling has been reached, without prior approval of the Council on Finance and Administration.
- V. We recommend approval of the Reserve Fund report of the Council on Finance and Administration. We further recommend acceptance of the audit report from the conference's certified public accountant for 2019, and that the audit for 2020 be submitted no later than September 30, 2021.
- VI. We recommend that all conference-authorized travel be reimbursed as follows;

- VII. Boards and agencies requesting funds must have their vouchers approved administratively as follows:

- VIII. All who are requesting funds of the conference of 2022 are asked to have their requests, in writing, to the conference treasurer by March 1, 2021. We request full disclosure of the income & expenses of the entities for 2020, along with a Statement of Financial Position (balance sheet) as of 12/31/20. Budget request for 2022 funds should also include detailed listing of reserve funds with & without donor restrictions and their application to current ministry needs.
- IX. We request that each district submit to the CFA by March 1st, 2021, the budget request for 2022 funding. We request full disclosure of the income & expenses of the districts for 2020, along with a Statement of Financial Position (balance sheet) as of 12/31/20. An audit of the funds handled during the year 2020 is also requested before annual conference. Budget request for 2022 funds should also include detailed listing of reserve funds with & without donor restrictions and their application to current ministry needs. In order to continue the practice of alignment between the Tennessee and Memphis conference particularly within the cabinet, we recommend the districts work with the Episcopal Office to develop the same reserve policy adopted within the Tennessee Conference districts.

- X. We would remind all conference entities of the provision in the 2016 Discipline, paragraph 614.5 a, which disallows special conference-wide funds appeals without prior approval of the Annual Conference upon CFA's recommendation.
- XI. All items added to the conference budget at the annual conference session will become a part of the year's budget under consideration, and will not be taken from the Conference Reserve Fund.
- XII. The Director of the Conference Connectional Ministries Team and/or the Annual Conference Treasurer or their assigns shall serve as an ex-officio member of all special study committees authorized by the annual conference session.
- XIII. The Conference Treasurer shall execute the policies established by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, and in consultation with the Conference Investment Coordinating Committee, regarding the investment of funds and the regulation of cash flow.
 - a. All funds shall be invested following the Guidelines of the General Council on Finance and Administration wherever they may be relevant or applicable.
 - b. The objectives for the investment of conference funds shall include:
 - 1. The preservation of the principal value of the investment
 - 2. The investment should provide a reasonable rate of return
 - 3. The investment should be invested, so far as is practical, with those agencies whose management policies are consistent with the Social Creed of the United Methodist Church.
 - c. The Treasurer shall report annually to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration the location and amounts of invested funds, and the earnings gained.
- XIV. Moving expenses for those hired or appointed as district superintendents, CMT staff members, campus ministers, or CFA staff members will be paid by the conference. These payments will not include amounts for storage, packing materials or labor to pack.
 - a. Local churches may not reimburse a minister's professional expenses more than two months ahead of the prorated budget amount at any given time
 - b. Expenses from January 1 to June 30 in any given year may not exceed ½ of the total annual budget amount for reimbursable expenses.

BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS

- I. We recommend that the 2021 salary of each district superintendent be \$91,530. We recommend that travel expenses for these positions be reported monthly by voucher for reimbursement. The Superintendent's housing allowance shall be \$30,000, an additional amount may be excluded from salary with CFA approval.
- II. We recommend that the budget as presented in the "CFA Recommendation" column on the budget summary page of this document be approved, and that the fiscal year be designated as 1/1/2021 through 12/31/2021.

CONNECTIONAL COMMITMENT/DIRECT BILL RECOMMENDATIONS

- I. We recommend the conference budget for 2021 be based on the anticipated collections of 10% plus 1% transition adjustment of Line 52t of the 2019 statistical report.
- II. The Conference Treasurer will provide each church their 2021 Connectional Commitment amount (10% plus 1% transition adjustment by line 52t as reported on the 2019 statistical report) following Annual Conference.
- III. The Transitional Adjustment will decline ¼ percent each year for the next four years at which time churches will be asked to remit a 10% Connectional Commitment.
- IV. Pension responsibility for those who are serving in a clergy appointment whether full time or part-time, shall be allocated to the church, board, institution, or agency for which he or she is serving. The Direct Bill amounts for 2020 are:
 - Full Time 15% of plan compensation (Salary plus Housing)
 - Part-time 9% of plan compensation
 - Unpaid balances will be carried over at the end of the year
- V. We remind all pastors that the 2016 Discipline (par. 340.2(c)(2)(f) requires that all finances of the local church are to be reported to the conference
- VI. In order to lower administrative and mailing cost, all churches are asked to remit their connectional commitment and direct bill payments online. Monthly statements and reports will also be available on the Memphis Conference Ministry Financial website. Statements may be mailed out on a case by case basis and training is available for online payments. Please contact **Treasurer's Office** for details and assistance.

VII. The Conference Treasurer will close the 2020 books by close of business on January 10th 2021.

Memphis Annual Conference Resolution Regarding Continued Progress toward the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference of The United Methodist Church

Whereas: The Nashville Episcopal Area is comprised of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences, and

Whereas: In 2014, the Memphis and Tennessee annual conference delegates adopted the same mission statement:
The mission of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences is to discover, equip, connect, and send lay and clergy leaders who shape congregations that offer Jesus Christ to a hurting world one neighborhood at a time, and

Whereas: We are committed to our mission more than to our geographic boundaries, and

Whereas: Over the past five years, numerous areas of ministry have been aligned between the two conferences, and

Whereas: After successful alignment efforts demonstrated increased focus, efficiency, and fruitfulness, an advisory team was identified to further pursue what benefits and challenges would be presented by formation of a new conference to include all geographic areas of the current Memphis and Tennessee conferences, and

Whereas: In 2018, the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions voted to endorse the intent to move forward with a plan to form a new conference, and

Whereas: In 2019, the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions affirmed sending a motion to the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference, for action at its 2020 session, requesting that the Tennessee and Memphis conferences be joined to form a new conference, and to meet as a fully unified annual conference in 2021, and

Whereas: The 2020 Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference session has been delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and therefore, action on formation of the new conference has likewise been delayed, and

Whereas: In 2019, the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions endorsed a set of goals and objectives for the newly formed conference, as well as a funding plan and guiding principle plan for benefits, and

Whereas: In accordance with the actions taken at the 2019 annual conference sessions of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences, a resolution has been submitted to the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference in which it will be asked to take the following action at its next session: that the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference approve realigning the boundaries of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences to form one new conference known as the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference of The United Methodist Church, with boundaries coextensive with the current Tennessee and Memphis conferences, and authorizing such new conference to conduct an organizational meeting consisting of the voting membership (lay and clergy) of the Tennessee and Memphis conferences prior to commencement of the new conference, and to begin operations as a fully unified conference thereafter, all in accordance with a Plan of Union to be adopted by both conferences during their 2021 annual conference sessions; and

Whereas: Despite the delay resulting from the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference postponement, the two conferences wish to continue to align their operations as much as possible to fulfill their jointly-held mission;

Now, therefore, be it resolved, in accordance with the actions taken at the 2019 annual conference sessions of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences, that the Connectional Table of the future Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference, as well as the committees on Finance and Administration of the Tennessee and Memphis Conferences, the trustees of both conferences, the newly-appointed Joint Distributing Committee, and other appropriate stakeholders continue working to develop the Plan of Union for the newly formed conference, to be considered by each annual conference at their 2021 annual conference sessions, with the goal that such Plan of Union shall govern the creation and structure of the new conference.

Be it further resolved, in accordance with the actions taken at the 2019 annual conference sessions of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences, that the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference be asked to take appropriate action at its next session in accordance with the resolution that has been submitted for its consideration, as described above.

Be it further resolved, that the Memphis Annual Conference takes the following actions in order to align the operations of the two conferences from the date of closure of annual conference 2020 until the conferences operate as one under the Plan of Union that will be presented at the 2021 annual conferences:

1. Approval of the new conference ministry structure, which is attached as an appendix to this resolution;
2. Selection of the teams required by the new conference ministry structure, as outlined in the report of the Nominations Committee;
3. Adoption of individual conference budgets, including some joint budgeting for the conferences, which shall be accomplished by separate vote;
4. Ratification of any other contracts necessary for organization and operation of the new conference;
5. Authorizing the execution of any necessary legal documents to finalize and complete the union of the two conferences;

Be it further resolved, that upon union of the two conferences after approval by the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference, the name of the corporation currently known as Tennessee Conference, United Methodist Church, Inc., be changed to Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference, United Methodist Church, Inc.; and

Be it further resolved, that the Memphis Annual Conference approves the merger of the corporate entity called “Memphis Conference of The United Methodist Church” into the corporate entity currently known as the “Tennessee Conference, United Methodist Church, Inc.”, but to be renamed Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference, United Methodist Church, Inc., such merger to take place after approval by the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference, and all other necessary prerequisites according to law.

Be it further resolved, that the Memphis Conference Board of Trustees shall be directed and empowered to take all necessary and appropriate steps to effectuate property transfers related to the creation of the new conference.

Whereas: The Nashville Episcopal Area is comprised of the Memphis and Tennessee conferences, and

Whereas: In 2018, the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions voted to endorse the intent to move forward with a plan to form a new conference, and

Whereas: In 2019, the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions affirmed sending a motion to the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference, for action at its 2020 session, requesting that the Tennessee and Memphis conferences be joined to form a new conference, and to meet as a fully unified annual conference in 2021, and

Whereas: In 2019, the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions endorsed a set of goals and objectives for the newly formed conference, as well as a funding plan and guiding principle plan for benefits, and

Whereas: It is anticipated that the Tennessee Annual Conference and Memphis Annual Conference sessions will request that the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference, at its next session, take action necessary to implement the vision for the newly formed conference, and

Whereas: The Book of Discipline, Para. 1509, provides that when two annual conferences are to be merged to form a new conference, there shall be elected by each conference affected a distributing committee of three members and three alternates, which shall act jointly with similar committees from the other conference or conferences. The joint distributing committee thus formed shall have power and authority: (a) to allocate the pension responsibility involved; (b) to distribute equitably the permanent funds and all other pension assets of the conference or conferences affected, taking into consideration the pension responsibility involved; and (c) to the extent not otherwise previously provided for by the conference or conferences involved, to apportion or distribute equitably any other assets or property and any other liabilities or obligations, and

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Whereas: It is necessary and appropriate for the Memphis Annual Conference to appoint members as prescribed by the Discipline for purposes of addressing the pension issues required by the Discipline, and for the purposes of providing for apportionment or distribution of assets, property, liabilities, and obligations not otherwise previously provided for by the two participating conferences;

Now therefore, be it resolved, that the Memphis Conference affirms the creation of a Joint Distributing Committee, together with the Tennessee Conference, to operate in a manner consistent with Para. 1509 of The Book of Discipline;

Be it further resolved, that the following three persons are nominated and approved to serve as members of the Joint Distributing Committee:

1. Deb Suddarth 2. Erv Walker 3. David Weatherly

Be it further resolved, that the following three persons are nominated and approved to serve as alternate members of the Joint Distributing Committee:

1. Wade Cox 2. Sharon Lewis-Karamoko 3. Ann Richards

Be it further resolved, that such persons, together with the individuals appointed to the Joint Distributing Committee by the Tennessee Conference, shall perform the functions outlined in Para. 1509 of the Discipline related to pensions; and

Be it further resolved, that such persons, together with the individuals appointed to the Joint Distributing Committee by the Tennessee Conference, shall be authorized to act upon and implement plans and recommendations from the Guide Team and joint task teams of the two conferences related to health benefits, incorporation, and legal structure, and any other actions related to apportionment or distribution of assets and liabilities not otherwise provided for by the conferences in their Plan of Union or otherwise, pending creation and commencement of the new conference entity.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Erv Walker, Chair

The Purpose of the Board of Trustees is to receive, hold in trust, buy and sell real and personal property and to invest funds, if

any, as prescribed in The Book of Discipline, 2016, Section IV. Annual Conference Property, ¶ 2512.1 - 8, in the name of and on behalf of the Memphis Annual Conference. Additionally, pursuant to ¶ 2517 *Responsibilities of Annual Conference Trustees Related to Health and Welfare Institutions*, the Conference Trustees have the responsibility of establishing and maintaining statements of relationship between the Conference and related health and welfare organizations within the bounds of the Conference.

The Board of Trustees has two regular meetings each year, spring and fall. The board also routinely conducts business via email

and phone conferences in order to minimize the impact of time and travel on the board members as well as to be effective and timely in its work.

The Board of Trustees oversees and/or contributes to the maintenance of four properties on behalf of the conference and provides assistance to the districts in completing property transactions approved by prior Annual Conference resolutions. It provides guidance and information as requested in matters pertaining to the full range of former and current property issues.

The Trustees hold the following campus ministry facilities: Murray State University Wesley Foundation, University of Memphis

Wesley Foundation and University of Tennessee-Martin Wesley Foundation.

The Trustees voted to approve a property management and brokerage program with A. Anthony Corporation to effectively manage discontinued and abandoned churches across the Conference.

The Trustees budget proposal of \$71,000 for 2021 was submitted to CF&A.

EQUITABLE COMPENSATION COMMISSION NARRATIVE

Martha Dell King, Chair

The purpose of the Equitable Compensation Commission (ECC) is to support full-time clergy serving as pastors in the charges of the annual conference by: (a) recommending conference standards for pastoral support; (b) administering funds to be used in base compensation supplementation, and (c) providing counsel and advisory material on pastoral support to district superintendents and committees on pastor-parish relations; and (d) submitting an arrearage policy to be adopted by the annual conference. This purpose is consistent with the provision of ¶ 625 of The Book of Discipline, 2016.

Given these primary efforts of the Equitable Compensation Commission, the use of conference tithes assists the Equitable Compensation Commission to achieve its purpose by having funds available to address and support issues of equitable compensation as related to full-time clergy serving as pastors in the Memphis Conference. Funds are disbursed to each pastor to provide sufficient compensation, in addition to supplemental aid/income, to ensure that the minimum base salary be met for all eligible clergy. In short, the conference tithes allotted to assist the Commission in addressing issues of equity and fairness without penalty to the pastor or pastoral charge. These actions directly link the basic concepts of the mission statement, "...to discover, equip, connect and send lay and clergy leaders..." to the approved and adopted practices of the Equitable Compensation Commission. Specifically, clergy are financially equipped to eliminate any related pressure that might distract from the primary focus of offering Christ to a hurting world.

An integral part of this process is to assure that our pastors and churches in the mission field are not forgotten or denied adequate support. **The ECC strives to financially support those churches and charges that are engaging the areas of the mission field that are not able to financially sustain them at this time.**

With all these elements being a critical part of what we believe, clergy who are supported through equitable compensation would serve as living proof of what God's grace looks like when there is respect for each individual's dignity and self-worth. The outcome could very well be fruitful and faithful churches. And, with this, we will be the recipients of pastoral, missional, and congregational excellence.

REPORT OF COMMISSION ON EQUITABLE COMPENSATION

Martha Dell King, Chair

The purpose of the Equitable Compensation Commission (ECC) is to support full-time clergy serving as pastors in the charges of the annual conference by: (a) recommending conference standards for pastoral support; (b) administering funds to be used in base compensation supplementation, and © providing counsel and advisory material on pastoral support to district superintendents and committees on pastor-parish relations; and (d) submitting an arrearage policy to be adopted by the annual conference. This purpose is consistent with the provision of ¶ 625 of The Book of Discipline, 2016.

1) Types of Equitable Compensation Support

a) Minimum Compensation Support

The Commission annually proposes to the Annual Conference a schedule of minimum compensation for ministers in the various categories of Conference relationship. In approving this schedule, the Conference guarantees each of its itinerant ministers a certain minimum compensation. Unless a minister voluntarily waives this right, s/he is entitled to an appointment where the compensation, including increments, will be at least the minimum of his/her category.

b) To prepare for the coming merger of conferences, we propose that The Memphis Annual Conference align the Minimum Compensation Levels for Full Conference, and Probationary Members to the levels used by the Tennessee Annual Conference during 2020, while retaining the levels used for our Associate and Full-time Local pastors in 2020.

c) Years of Service Program

In order to provide further incentives for pastors receiving Equitable Compensation support, the Commission will provide an increment for past years of full-time service within The United Methodist Church. (Years of service shall be the same as pension service credit. See pastoral records for approved years of service.)

Beginning after 5 years of service, the pastor will receive \$100 for each year of service; those having served 5 years will receive \$500; 6 years \$600; 7 years \$700; and so on.

2) Eligibility for Equitable Compensation Program

- d) Only those appointed to a pastoral charge within the Memphis Annual Conference, and meeting the requirements of *The Book of Discipline* shall be eligible for compensation support.
- e) A claimant must complete and submit in full, all application forms as necessitated by the Commission. The forms include 1) a signed application, 2) a financial reduction plan for the church/charge which indicates a lessening dependence upon ECC funding to support the pastor and a church audit or finance report. Additionally, the church must show compliance with their direct bill responsibilities.
- f) A claimant must live within the bounds of the pastoral charge to which he/she is appointed if no parsonage is provided, or in the parsonage (if provided). Clergy couples shall be an exception.

3) How Applications are Submitted

- a) All applications shall be submitted on forms provided by the Commission, signed by the applicant and the district superintendent.

- b) Signed applications should be submitted to the chairperson the Equitable Compensation Commission on or before the fifteenth day of December of each year or the fifteenth day of May for the conference year.
 - c) Applications shall not be taken at any other time unless approved by the bishop, cabinet, and the Chairperson of the Commission.
 - d) District superintendents shall furnish the Commission with requested data for determining eligibility for equitable compensation support.
- 4) Payments to Claimants

Each month, the Treasurer of the Memphis Annual Conference shall make payments to the Charge/Church Treasurer, upon request from the Commission on Equitable Compensation.
- 5) Financial Reports

At each session of the Annual Conference, financial statements shall be filled as follows:

 - a) Basic Compensation Program payments (including bonuses) made to the various charges of the Conference.
 - b) Supplemental Compensation Aid payments made to the various charges.
 - c) Grants from the Emergency Fund (to be shown by district.)
 - d) Administrative expenses of the Commission on Equitable Compensation.
- 6) Recommendations to the Memphis Annual Conference

Charges receiving support from the Equitable Compensation Commission are encouraged to take steps regularly toward becoming self-supporting and toward the increasing of the total level of support of their ministers. The following actions should encourage these steps:

 - a) The district superintendent will annually review each application for equitable compensation with the appropriate Charge Conference.
 - b) If after four consecutive years of receiving equitable compensation support, the church or charge shows little or no interest in becoming self-supporting, it is recommended that the cabinet look at the possibility of filling that appointment with a less than full-time person.
 - c) Exceptions to the phasing-out support must be approved after careful annual review by the bishop and cabinet, and must involve clear missional reasons for maintaining the United Methodist witness in the parish of such a charge.
 - d) The Commission encourages each church or charge in setting their minister's compensation to consider an annual cost of living increase, in addition to any appropriate merit increases.
 - e) It is expected that any church or charge that receives equitable compensation support shall pay their conference tithes in full.
 - f) The Commission encourages the bishop and district superintendents to be creative in the appointive process; however, it is recommended that no church or charge be allowed to become a station appointment unless that church or charge has the potential to become self-supporting within four years during this which time Equitable Compensation will be decreased by one-fourth each year.
- 7) Emergency Fund

This is administered by the Chairperson of the Commission, upon recommendation of the bishop and the cabinet, for the purpose of meeting emergency needs arising among the pastoral members of the Conference. The Secretary of the cabinet is to notify the Chairperson of the Commission by letter to requisition funds.
- 8) Funding Program

During this last year, ECC was unable to fulfill all the qualified requests submitted, and an emergency request was fulfilled as well. For the last 2 years, we have not requested a funding increase, and in both years, extreme circumstances forced us to exceed our budget. Considering our need to align minimum compensation amounts with the Tennessee Conference, and these unfortunate circumstances based on the prolonged difficulties encountered by our churches during the COVID-19 crisis we request funding from the Annual Conference for this year in the amount of **\$150,000, reflecting a \$65,000 funding increase** from the previous year.

UNITED METHODIST WOMEN

Each year, the United Methodist Women members prepare for faithful living and action by participating in MissionU studies. Mission Studies are offered each year - a geographic, topical, and spiritual growth study. These studies motivate, inform, and enrich our community and others to global ministry. Local leaders are trained to lead one of these three mission studies

through the organizational MissionU program offered around the conference and the country. Those leaders, in turn, are able to lead mission studies in their local and district groups or for anyone wanting to learn more about one of these mission studies. In addition to the three adult studies, the United Methodist Women has two specially prepared, one for children and one for youth. The youth children's study for 2019 was "Marked: on a Mission Journey with Jesus in the Gospel of Mark".

The 2019 children's study was "Meeting Jesus through the eyes of Mark". The adult studies were:

Spiritual Growth - "Practicing Resurrection: The Gospel of Mark and Radical Discipleship"

Topical - "What about our Money? A Faith Response"

Geographic - "Women United for Change: 150 Years in Mission"

The Social Principles of the United Methodist Church and the Book of Resolutions of the United Methodist Church speak to human issues confronting the world from a biblical and theological perspective. Each year the National office/board of directors of the United Methodist Women select several social issues for special focus. The 2019 issues were:

1. Just Energy for All (Climate Change)
2. Interrupting the School-Prison Pipeline
3. A Living Wage for All: Economic Inequality
4. End Maternal and Child Mortality: Maternal and Child Health United Methodist Women are encouraged to take action by doing the following:
 - A. Education of others: Share with other people the skills necessary to effect social change. This is one of the fundamental steps toward construction of a just society.
 - B. Political Action: This includes actions such as letters to elected officials, vigils, public prayers, acts of protest, voter registration and radio and television ads.
 - C. Social and Economic Action: This can take several forms, from boycotting or refusing to buy a product to participation in rallies, marches, and public demonstrations.
 - D. Issue Advocacy: advocate for changes in unjust laws and regulations that relate to specific social issues.
 - E. Advocate to end violence toward women in conflict zones and in their homes: work with local and state governments to protect survivors of human trafficking and bring their perpetrators to justice. Speak out in partner with homeless and those losing their homes due to foreclosure. Organize forums with elected officials.
 - F. Get Involved in media literacy in your community. Monitor media messages and images. Advocate for fairness in news coverage, equal representation of women and wholesome television entertainment. Work with local environmental groups to protect the earth, create green spaces and support sustainable development. Serve others by working in soup kitchens, food banks, community gardens, and meal delivery programs.
 - G. PRAY: Prayer is one of the most powerful sources of support and change in our lives. Let the power of prayer support each of us in our actions for justice.

UNITED METHODIST FOUNDATION FOR THE MEMPHIS AND TENNESSEE CONFERENCES

"Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. 'So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.'" (Matthew 6:31-34) What a difference six weeks can make!! 2019 brought the best market returns during my tenure with the Foundation and Development Fund. Based on all that, I had a number of plans of expanding our ministry. And so, now this...as I write, many of us are working from home due to our concerns regarding COVID-19. Social distancing seems to be the new "normal". We are also experiencing unprecedented volatility in the markets. One thousand point daily swings are not commonplace. These are truly anxious times. And yet...

Swiss theologian, Karl Barth has observed, "The Atonement takes precedence over all of human history." And what that means is simply this: COVID-19 and all the associated market volatility can really only be understood in the basic Gospel truth that God is for us and not against us! Every day that we have is an opportunity to remember and live in the light of our creedal affirmation that for us and our salvation Jesus Christ came down from heaven. These are difficult times, many of our local churches are struggling. Many of us are worried about the future of our denomination and our country. But still, we are invited again to recall: Jesus reveals the full truth of God: you are loved with a love which will never end.

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So then, how do we live in the truth of what Christ has accomplished? I'll offer this: let us be shaped by the cardinal Christian virtues (faith, hope and love). First, let us trust God. He has given us *faith* so that we might remember each day, that our Lord is sufficient for all our needs. Our Lord who has been faithful in the past will also be faithful today and in the days to come. Second, let us be mindful of a promised, good future. Back in February I was hoping to be able to crow about past performance, while anticipating an even brighter financial future. But today, I'm reminded of the words of the Apostle as he wrote to the Galatians: "May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." (Galatians 6:14) Have no doubt, regardless of good days or bad, our Lord is for you and not against you. And have no doubt, that as you trust him, all these things shall be added in the right time and in the right way to you, as well.

REELFOOT RURAL MINISTRIES, Inc.

Robert Craig, Executive Director

The mission statement of REelfoot Rural Ministries defines how the organization seeks to live out the command of Jesus Christ to, "Love our neighbor." The mission statement is: *"Following Christ in building relationships, we provide resources and offer hope to our Reelfoot Lake neighbors."*

The work of Reelfoot Rural Ministries is succinctly defined in this brief purpose statement: *"Restoring Hope, One Relationship at a Time."* This is how the staff and volunteers at RRM seek to offer Christ to a hurting world. While our "neighborhood" includes the counties in northwest Tennessee and southwest Kentucky around Reelfoot Lake, our primary focus is to love our neighbor one relationship at a time.

Over the past year, the staff and board of Reelfoot Rural Ministries have been prayerfully seeking God's guidance in how to best adjust ministries to meet needs and build relationships. In recent weeks, ministry has changed and will remain different in the near future. In the months to come, we will continue to discern needs and how best to match available resources with current needs to most effectively impact the communities we serve. We are also in a prayerful visioning period for how to best be in ministry with the asset of the former East Dyersburg UMC location, particularly with children and neighborhood outreach. While obedience to God may result in a different look and feel to some services at RRM, our supporters and clients can rest assured that RRM will continue the work of "Restoring Hope, One Relationship at a Time" on behalf of Christ and the Church. Large expansion of services in our dental ministry and ReelHOME rehab have taken place over the past year. This has resulted in a large increase of dental patients served, dentures delivered, and homes made safer and more accessible.

Reelfoot Rural Ministries serves in all four focus areas of ministry for the Memphis Conference.

Investing in Young People: Each ministry at RRM impacts children and young people in some way. However, we specifically seek to invest in young people through our day care, school supplies drive, backpack buddies, the annual toy store, and the home rehabilitation/community service ministry. The service projects help young people to gain skills for life as well as experience in serving the world in the name of Christ. The day care center in Tiptonville, Tennessee, serves some two-dozen children each day. This ministry provides love, education, encouragement, and three meals per day for children. The goal of the center is to prepare the children to succeed in primary school and to know that they are beloved children of God. Parents are assured that the children receive quality care by the three star rating provided by the state of Tennessee, but the children's personal growth and health are even better evidence of the quality of care. The families we serve are from various life stages, ranging from single parents in school or just starting employment, two parent households, and grandparents. Any family in our area can receive childcare, but preference is given to the working poor in the service area. In the days of social distancing, RRM has expanded feeding for students in Obion and Lake Counties. We will continue to feed over 500 students, five meals a week through the end of the school year.

Engaging in the Mission Field: We seek to engage our mission field daily through the variety of ministries in which we are involved. These ministries include: Tenne Butler Day Care, School Supplies, Christmas Toy Store, Lake County Imagination Library Sponsorship, Food Distribution Center, Emergency Services, Dental and Oral Hygiene Clinic, Vision

Clinic, Special Needs Home, Lake County Backpack Buddies, ReelHOME-Home Rehabilitation Work Camp Ministry, Emergency Financial assistance, and the RRM Thrift Store.

Creating and transforming lay and clergy leaders along with growing fruitful and faithful churches are both areas of focus that are enhanced through the multiple volunteer opportunities at Reelfoot Rural Ministries. When individuals and groups come to RRM to volunteer, whether for a few hours, for a few days, or for a weeklong work camp, they are changed by the work of the Holy Spirit. This experience allows the individual groups, or churches to grow closer in relationship with God, one another, and with the people they are serving. This causes transformation that strengthens personal relationships with Christ, thereby strengthening the local church in relationship with one another for ministry opportunities in that church's own neighborhood.

ANNUAL REPORT, UM NEIGHBORHOOD CENTERS

This year has been a time of major service and major challenges in the now-113-year history of United Methodist Neighborhood Centers of Memphis. Adapting to a severe economic crunch, we completed divestiture of ownership of properties and have Miriam Child Development Center and our administrative offices at Good Shepherd United Methodist Church.

Through our new "Star Ministries" approach, we have partnerships with four other UMC's and three additional missional locations. The churches are Longstreet, Asbury, St. Luke's and St. Matthew's. The other sites are Fishes and Loaves in Binghampton, Caregivers Center in Mason and Good Samaritan Outreach in downtown Memphis.

The current Covid-19 crisis has struck us very hard, but we are hopeful for new life and service out in the future, and are seeking to be helpful with emergency food aid even during the pandemic. We are in prayer for our Memphis Conference and all our churches as we persevere through this unprecedented time.

Very special THANKS are due to our two primary employees. They are Rev. Iletha Washington, serving as Program Director, and Ms. Mozell Starks, our Financial Officer. YOUR prayers and generous support are so very appreciated during this crisis. Let us never forget "the least and last" among us!

HANNAH'S HOPE

Dear Friends of the Memphis Annual Conference,

I bring you this report on behalf of the staff and Board of Trustees of Hannah's Hope as we are living in uncertain times caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. We are completing our 17th year of ministry with pregnant women in crisis and their vulnerable children and prospective adoptive families.

The past year was an unusual one during which greater than 90% of our pregnancy clients were able to make parenting plans for their babies. While we celebrated with each one as they began a new chapter of their life with a precious baby, we, as an organization, had to aggressively change our business model and increase our fundraising efforts. This was necessary because our pregnancy clients are never charged fees and when adoption plans are not made, agency revenue from adoption fees is severely impacted. This new reality coming on the heels of losing approximately 75% of our grant monies from the Memphis Annual Conference just as we were required to assume financial responsibility for clergy pension costs resulted in the agency using almost all of our reserve funds in 2019. Our Board of Trustees is diligently working to increase fundraising efforts to reduce the budget shortfall so that we do not have to cut client services.

In late February 2020, just before the pandemic began to impact us in West TN, the JOY Circle (a UMW group from Germantown UMC) hosted the most successful fundraiser in Hannah's Hope history! Leap With Hope (held on February 29!) was a wonderful evening of great food, entertainment and an exciting Silent and Live Auction with approximately 150 in attendance to sustain the ministry of Hannah's Hope.

I want to share with you some important facts about the ministry of Hannah's Hope:

- ❖ **HH provides 2000+ hours of counseling and/or case management to vulnerable mothers and their children per year**
- ❖ **HH has supported an average of 60 women/year over the past 10 years as they have made parenting plans and close to 100 women making parenting plans this year**
- ❖ **HH has provided extraordinary levels of support for 15 children with special needs and ensuring that they have ongoing services through the federal Adoption Assistance program**

❖ **HH has provided \$160,000 in fee assistance to adoptive families making adoption affordable for people all across the economic spectrum**

We are proud to be a growing, loving ministry dedicated to the healing of God's children (pregnant women, families seeking to adopt, and children who need to be adopted) through adoption and pregnancy counseling. Our ministry is focused on "Engaging the Mission Field" and we live out the mission statement of the Annual Conference as well by "offering Jesus Christ to a hurting world" on a daily basis.

We are so thankful for the individuals, UMW Circles, Sunday school classes, and congregations who support the ministry of Hannah's Hope through contributions to the Circle of Hope initiative and by filling Baby Bottles of Hope. It is only with this support that we are able to provide birth mother care bags for our clients after they give birth, provide free counseling to pregnant women in crisis situations, offer free consultations to couples seeking to discern whether God is calling them to adopt and stand in the gap for children in need of a new, forever home.

WESTERN KENTUCKY UNITED METHODIST FAMILY SERVICES

Western Kentucky United Methodist Family Services (WKUMFS) is a 501(c)(3) Foster Care Support Agency of The Memphis Conference of The United Methodist Church. Its ministry aligns perfectly with the Memphis Conference Mission; especially *offering Jesus Christ to the hurting world, one neighbor at a time*. The Holy Scriptures in **Proverbs 31:8-9** NLT says: *Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves; ensure justice for those being crushed. Yes, speak up for the poor and helpless, and see that they get justice.*

The oppression of children entering foster care comes primarily from neglect or drug abuse by their birth parents. There are nearly 9,900 children in foster care in the state of Kentucky. WKUMFS engages this mission field in The Purchase District by establishing connections with social workers and foster parents as it prays for and serves these hurting children.

WKUMFS Mission is threefold: 1) Provide for the care and maintenance, support and education of foster children and foster families. 2) Transform local churches by informing them of the ever present need for foster parents, respite parents, and adoptive parents. 3) Develop foster children into good citizens of the community through experiencing the love of Jesus Christ.

The WKUMFS Board of Trustees consists of volunteer laity and clergy from local area United Methodist Churches along with Purchase District and Memphis Conference Connectional Ministry leaders.

What Can Local United Methodist Churches Doing to Help?

When congregations are inspired and equipped to help foster and adoptive families: Every child is cared for, every family has hope, congregations are strengthened, and communities are healthier and safer.

Trinity UMC (Graves Co.) hosts a Fall Festival and an Easter Egg Hunt on their grounds for the foster children and foster parents. Lone Oak UMC hosts bi-monthly training meetings for the Paducah area foster children and foster parents. There are several ways congregations can get involved: begin a Prayer Initiative, start a Supportive Care Group, hold an Adoption/Foster Care Awareness Event, host a Local Child Placing Agency Training or Special Event, begin a Bags of Love ministry, or donate to WKUMFS.

Improving the life of foster children is the measure of success. The Kentucky Foster Care program measures success against its permanency goals. They are 1) return to birth parent, 2) permanent relative placement and 3) adoption. There are over 200 children awaiting adoption in Western Kentucky. Foster parents often adopt their foster children after bonding with them. Jesus described the final judgement in **Matthew 25:40** NLT *"And the King will say, 'I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these My brothers and sisters, you were doing it to Me!'"*

WESLEY LIVING/WESLEY SENIOR MINISTRIES/WESLEY MISSION

Wesley Housing Corporation of Memphis, Inc. d.b.a. Wesley Living, Wesley Senior Ministries, Inc. and Wesley at Graceland, Inc. d.b.a. Wesley Mission is essentially about people - elderly residents and at-home clients, staff, pastors, executives and boards of directors - all necessary to the mission of enhancing the lives of older generations. Please visit our website at www.wesleyliving.com.

Since last year's Annual Conference our organization's focus has not wavered from its service oriented areas with the goal of enhancing the quality of life for the elderly. These areas are Ministry, Preservation, Staff development and the Future. Ministry is at the heart of our purpose and Pastoral care is a key to the lives of those we serve. We are finding more and more residents wanting one-on-one care requiring more dedication to this and what is sometimes a very specialized service. Every community continues to be served by a United Methodist pastor located in close proximity. This would not be possible without the ongoing cooperation of every district superintendent, active clergy and several retired clergy who remain committed to serving.

Providing affordable housing and assisted living is the largest part of our ministry. The goal is to continually update the existing while expanding the services being provided. Beginning in 2020 and realizing Wesley Living's passion to serve, a separate management company engaged us to provide enhanced services to their residents. The Wellness Counselor added in 2019 has proven to be a valuable addition. And, as reported last year, the preservation and other construction efforts for St. Peter Manor in Memphis and St. Joseph Village in Dyersburg were completed. Additionally and unexpectedly, funding was secured to preserve a 26 unit community in Halls, TN named Wesley Park Meadows. The lives of every resident in these communities have been greatly enhanced.

No amount of ministry, preservation or genuine caring can be provided without compassion filled quality staff. Our efforts to provide a living wage and competitive benefits continues and great strides were achieved during the past year despite a very tight labor market. This has never been more evident or tested than during the Covid-19 crisis. Appropriate measures and social distancing were implemented and followed timely. Every day Wesley Living's **Cover Values of Service, Compassion and Integrity** were on display for the benefit of our residents, clients, families and staff. Careers are to be found at Wesley Living and encourage everyone to inquire if a faith based organization is of interest for their career path.

For the tenth year Wesley Home Services provides non-medical, in-home assistance services which range from companionship to housekeeping to personal assistance. It is proving to be an incredibly rewarding way to serve our seniors when served with an employee possessing the highest moral, ethical and compassionate character.

The number of elderly needing quality, affordable housing and services continues to grow. Wesley Living is a premier provider and remains committed to solving these social issues. Wesley Living also remains committed to expanding the number of elderly served when possible.

LAKESHORE CAMP & RETREAT CENTER

The last couple of years have been occasions for reflection for me. I celebrated 25 years of service in 2017. Lakeshore had its 70th anniversary in 2018, and in 2019, Vickie and I celebrated 25 years of being married and living the camp life. We have raised children and watched as Lakeshore alum have celebrated their weddings, raised their own children and brought them back here. We are well into our fourth generation of families who call this place their second home. It is a legacy I am proud to be a part of, and it doesn't show any sign of slowing down.

Last year was another great year at the 'Shore. 2019 brought a record number of both resident and DayShore campers during the summer and full Junior/Senior High retreats. Five (5) young persons were baptized and four others had life-changing, formal reaffirmation services during the season. By last August, all 18 of our DayShore spots for 2020 were

filled. We hadn't even wrapped up Summer 2019! We are not quite ready to expand to a third team, but we are actively thinking about the future of the program. This will be its fifth summer, and we have been thrilled to watch it grow to over 800 children and youth.

Many of our summer camps and retreats are so full, we have had to reevaluate how we use our space to make sure every one of our guests feels welcome and has a seat in the dining hall. Through your support of the last two fall campaigns, we were able to turn the conference center office into a hospitality area, providing additional small group space and a coffee station away from the combat zone of flying gator balls during indoor recreation periods. We added additional rocking chairs on the front porch and around camp to create more spaces for fun and serious conversations to take place. We are continuing to give the conference center a facelift inside and out, replaced the center walls on each floor with movable walls that open wide and many other fun and exciting things.

As the legacy of this holy ground continues, and we prepare for the fifth generation, we will continue to be conduits of the important work we do here, pivoting and adding opportunities as we go. We are able to do this life giving and life-changing work because of you - because you send your kids here, because you come here yourselves, and because you support this ministry with your time, talent and treasure. Many thanks to the Memphis Conference for all the years of support, for being part of the family business, and continued support as we move into a new covenant partnership with Cedar Crest Camp and Beersheba Springs Assembly offering service to the new Tennessee-Western Kentucky Annual Conference.

METHODIST LE BONHEUR HEALTHCARE

Michael Ugwueke, President and Chief Executive Officer

Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare (MLH), our mission is to collaborate with patients and their families to be the leader in providing high quality, cost-effective, patient and family-centered care. Services are provided in a manner which supports the health ministries and Social Principles of the United Methodist Church to benefit the communities we serve.

MLH continues to make a tremendous impact on the health of the Mid-South, both inside and outside of hospital walls. Leading MLH in that effort is our President and Chief Executive Officer, Michael Ugwueke, who is driving the organization to new heights, clinically, financially, and faithfully. In an open letter to the community published in early 2020, Dr. Ugwueke wrote, "Founded in 1918 and guided by faith-based roots, we have become a healthcare system of 13,000 dedicated Associates and 2,500 provider partners supporting six hospitals, surgery centers, physician practices, and outpatient facilities. We are privileged to serve our most economically and socially distressed communities." Highlights from 2019 include the opening of Shorb Tower at Methodist University Hospital, a state of the art, 450,000 square foot facility delivering advanced transplant, cardiology, and oncology care. MLH was named among Fortune Magazine's 100 Best Companies to Work For in America for the third year in a row, and MLH hospitals continue to be ranked number 1 in our area by US News & World Report. MLH erased millions of dollars of medical debt and changed policies so more than 50 percent of Memphians are now eligible for financial healthcare assistance. MLH also contributed more than 225 million dollars in community benefit in 2019.

The faith-based mission of MLH continues to be the foundation of all that we do. Leading us in that mission is Rev. Dr. Albert Mosley, Senior Vice President and Chief Mission Integration Officer for MLH. Dr. Mosley leads the Mission Integration Division, which includes all of our clinical chaplaincy services, volunteer services, the Employee Assistance Program and Dennis H. Jones Living Well Network, the MLH Foundation, clinical pastoral education, the Center of Excellence in Faith and Health Equity, the Humanitarian Fund, United Methodist annual conference connections, the Office of Community Outreach, and many other initiatives and projects. Mission Integration offers guidance and direction for the integration of MLH's mission, vision, values, and guiding behaviors, especially from the perspective of the Social Principles of the United Methodist Church. Additionally, Mission Integration ensures that the relationship with the United Methodist Church and relevant social, ethical, and pastoral teachings are understood and integrated appropriately and consistently across the entire system.

In 2019, Mission Integration saw the continued expansion of the My Sister's Keeper program, which is designed to equip and empower African-American women for healing and wholeness. Mission Integration is leading the BookNook program with a generous grant from the Urban Child Institute, using an innovative technology platform to improve literacy rates in children, and in its first full year in Memphis, BookNook reached nearly 800 children in our community, with further expansion of the program on the horizon. Our CHAMP(Changing High-risk Asthma in Memphis through Partnership) program through the Office of Community Outreach reduced pediatric asthma-related deaths and lowered Emergency

Department visits and hospitalizations. We also implemented the Prevent T 2 program, a year-long Type 2 diabetes prevention program, and as a result, the department is now recognized as a National Diabetes Prevention Program Provider by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The Dennis H. Jones Living Well Network provided free screening, referral, and navigation for mental health services, working with over 1,700 cases, over a 40% increase from 2018. Many other programs and services continue to thrive as well, all committed to our mission and to the health of our communities.

We are deeply appreciative of the support of the three annual conferences who founded our system and continue to be vital partners. The healing ministry of Christ continues to be at our center.

GOLDEN CROSS SENIOR MINISTRIES

Our name has legally changed from Wesley Senior Ministries Foundation of Memphis, Inc. to GOLDEN CROSS Senior Ministries, Inc. Our new name now has copyrighted protection as: GOLDEN CROSS Senior Ministries®.

GOLDEN CROSS Senior Ministries now serves the needs of approximately 2,200 seniors served by Wesley Living in 29 affordable housing retirement communities through West Tennessee, Murray, KY and Jonesboro, AR, 2 assisted living communities in Dyersburg and Milan, TN and seniors served by Homecare by Wesley, a personal support services agency.

100% of all monies donated to GOLDEN CROSS Senior Ministries goes directly to the benefit of the seniors served by Wesley Living. Why? Because no senior should ever have to travel life's journey alone!

GOLDEN CROSS is dependent on the donations made by members of churches in the Memphis Conference. We receive little funding outside the amazing generosity shown through offerings and responses to donation requests. Those donations then lead to senior's lives being transformed one need at a time.

There are four main initiatives undertaken by the mission of GOLDEN CROSS Senior Ministries: The Resident Support fund provides material individual support, The Homeless Initiative provides interventions for homeless seniors moving into a Wesley Living community, Personal Support Services Scholarship provides personal care support for the most "frail" residents and the Endowment Fund that represents a "permanent" lasting gift protecting the future.

St. Peter Manor in Memphis just completed a multi-million-dollar renovation. A grand re-opening was held to celebrate the remarkable improvements made to the community, one of Wesley Living's largest. As I was walking up to the community for the festivities, a somewhat frail gentleman walked in the same direction. It was not until we drew closer, that his red and white cane became apparent. The 2019-2020 year for UTM Wesley is marked as one that has been spent looking back so that we can move forward. During the summer of 2019 in response to goals on the strategic plan we passed last year, we hired Keaton Wilson as a Strategic Planning and PR Intern. His work was to help us write and record our history and guide us in moving forward with the goals in our strategic plan. In order to write our history, Keaton spent a great deal of time finding and interviewing alumni and former directors at Wesley/Interfaith. The fruit of that work was not only a well documented history, but he also helped us to reestablish relationships and connections that had been lost with the people who have come before us.

Another new position at UTM Wesley this year was our Stewardship Chair. Kari Beth Woods, the creator and first person to hold the position, knew that we needed someone to help us with fundraising work so that our ministry could continue to be funded at a level that could sustain the consistent growth we are experiencing. The beautiful thing about the work Kari Beth has done, though, is that rather than simply focus on fundraising she has rooted her work in establishing mutual relationships with churches and community members that go beyond money. Her work has taken the connection that Keaton helped us to reestablish and plugged people into mutual roles of service, ministry and support. We are grateful for both of them.

Meanwhile, in our day to day ministry we are so proud of all the ways our ministry equips and empowers student leadership. The current model of the student council is in its fourth year and we have seen a great leap in the maturity and wisdom of our student leadership. We have had more students preach this year than ever before. One student approached me this year and asked if she could offer a new model for the way we do our weekly Bible Study. As an education major she wanted to see a model that allowed more students the opportunity to learn how to lead small group discussions. As a result of her proposal and work we have begun the most impactful small group ministry we have seen in the four years I've been there. She recruited and trained 4 students who were not already in other leadership roles. Including the group she led, we went from having one small group meeting under my leadership once a week to 5 small groups each with student leaders once a week. We continued to support student interns this year who worked in leadership roles at Wesley and in local churches throughout our district. And, at the end of this school year we have two students who have been accepted to United Methodist seminaries where they hope to continue the ministry and leadership that was established in them through their leadership roles at UTM Wesley.

We cannot report on this year without mentioning the fact that we lost $\frac{1}{4}$ of our school year to the COVID-19 Pandemic that has radically changed life for all of us. In the days after the University of Tennessee Martin closed its doors on March 12 (thereby requiring that we close our doors as well), our students were full of confusion, grief, frustration and questions. In a matter of days, however, our student leaders were rallying with creative ways that we could continue to connect, worship and do meaningful ministry. The small group Bible studies we had started continued to meet online via zoom. The student preachers we had lined up for the remainder of Lent shifted their plan to deliver online. Students who were part of our praise team offered videos of them playing worship songs. Our council moved forward with meetings (doing them on zoom) and came up with creative ways to continue to check in on one another and build community. Despite the complete change in our plans, UTM Wesley kept going.

It is fortuitous for us that we have spent so much time looking back at the ways students have been engaged in ministry at UTM Wesley for almost 75 years, because now, perhaps more than ever, we know we are going to have to be creative as we move forward in the wake of this global pandemic. We know, though, that God has been faithful and God will continue to be faithful. The back of our shirts this year quoted Isaiah 43: "See I am doing a NEW THING, can you perceive it?" In August we didn't know just how true that quote would ring, but we are confident that in the midst of a lot of chaos and uncertainty God will continue to use our efforts to cultivate Holy community and empower student leaders in whatever new thing God is doing in the world, in the church and in our humble ministry. Thanks be to God who is faithful!

UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER CAMPUS MINISTRY

Rev. Jonathan C. Lewis, BBC, Chaplain and Campus Minister

At the University of Tennessee Health Science Center (UTHSC) in Memphis, the United Methodist campus ministry continues to grow and explore new opportunities. In March of 2011, Jonathan Lewis started as the campus minister there, and he continues to serve in that position. Jonathan is also Program Manager of UT and Conference Ministries with Methodist LeBonheur Healthcare (MLH).

UTHSC is composed entirely of graduate students, all of them specializing in some form of health science - from dentistry to medicine to nursing to laboratory science and much more. Jonathan relates well to UTHSC because of his own immersion in the hospital and healthcare setting, where he ministers to patients, families, and medical professionals of all kinds.

The campus ministry student group at UTHSC is called the Faith Health Collaborative (FHC). For more information and partnership opportunities, please visit the student group website at www.faithhealthcollaborative.com. FHC engages the entire UTHSC community - all colleges and programs, all students, faculty, and staff. FHC connects UTHSC to MLH, including its clinical work, its fruitful partnerships with community organizations and congregations, its local and international missions and service opportunities, and its unique educational initiatives through the Center of Excellence in Faith and Health Equity. Since being officially approved as a campus student group in 2016, FHC has recruited student vice presidents from all 6 of the colleges that make up UTHSC and also has an active membership of around 50 students.

Specific initiatives for FHC include:

Connection to United Methodist Congregations and Programs

Through FHC, students, faculty, and staff connect to Chaplain Lewis and the United Methodist Church. Relationships and partnerships with United Methodist congregations and programs are a significant goal of FHC. FHC aims to be an innovative vehicle that increases student exposure to the church and especially its health ministries.

Support and Service

Chaplain Lewis is a Board Certified Chaplain, experienced spiritual caregiver, and currently a candidate for a Doctor of Ministry degree in Pastoral Counseling at Memphis Theological Seminary. Jonathan's increased exposure to UTHSC enables him to offer more support and care to the entire UTHSC community, witnessing to the love of Christ that can work through the United Methodist Church and its people, reflecting the call of the Gospel to love God and love our neighbors.

Education

In partnership with Church Health, Chaplain Lewis continues to help design and facilitate the "Serving The Underserved" certificate course. Serving The Underserved seeks to create a space for productive dialogue among health science students on the components of healthcare among underserved populations and the ways in which poverty shapes the health lives of people and communities. Each class session focuses on a topic relevant to this overall goal, featuring speakers who are leaders in the Memphis healthcare community and elsewhere. Students have the opportunity to interact and dialogue with these leaders and with each other in the effort to raise awareness, competency, and action for these issues. FHC helps to expand and develop that educational experience, aligning itself with the Wesleyan emphasis on health, education, and personal formation. Serving The Underserved received about 150 applications from interested students and faculty persons in 2019. Since starting in 2010, Serving the Underserved has engaged nearly 800 students and faculty. Chaplain Lewis also implemented a Doctor of Ministry project with medical students from UTHSC, focusing on how pastoral care and counseling influence medical communication.

MEMPHIS WESLEY FOUNDATION

The mission of the Memphis Wesley Foundation is to be a diverse and inclusive faith community welcoming all students. Our vision is to be a student movement developing spiritual leaders in Memphis and beyond. Our five core values are diversity, generosity, inclusivity, integrity, and positivity. This report will briefly describe how the ministries of Memphis Wesley align with the four areas of focus of the Memphis Conference.

Wesley at Memphis is *investing in more college students and young adults*. 40 students are now engaged in the weekly ministries of Wesley. With the covenant discipleship framework as our guide, our students lead ministries in the areas of compassion, devotion, justice, and worship. Our student leadership team focused on growing wide, increasing the number of students in our ministries by nearly 50% while also growing deep, expanding opportunities for students to engage their faith. Relationships are at the center of our student-led ministry.

Our students *engage the mission field* in Memphis and beyond. Within the walls of our facility, Wesley partnered with Project Transformation and Refugee Empowerment Program. Our students served with outreach ministries of several local churches in the Metro District. We were proud to become the first campus ministry to become a partner organization with MICA, Memphis Interfaith Coalition for Action and Hope, a coalition working for social change in three focus areas of economic equity, education equity, and immigration equity.

Memphis Wesley is *creating transforming leaders* each day. Twelve students have participated in our student leadership intern program over the past two school years, particularly through our expanded student leadership team. We hired our first graduate intern, with plans to hire a second soon. In addition to leading our four ministry teams, our student leadership interns also serve in key roles with facilities, finance and administration.

As the Memphis Conference seeks to *grow fruitful and faithful churches*, Memphis Wesley continues to strengthen our partner church network. Our board of directors has more churches represented at the table. Through our Tuesday community nights this school year, 24 churches have partnered with Wesley to provide dinner and hospitality to our students along with guest speakers. Two of our student leaders preached their first sermons this year, and more students are now serving on staff in local churches. We intentionally partner with local churches and extension ministries at each level of our ministry.

Memphis Wesley celebrates continued growth in our ministries, and we look forward to expanding our impact with your support. This fall, we plan to expand our student leadership team and reach more students at Christian Brothers University, LeMoyne-Owen College, Rhodes College, and Southwest Community College in addition to our presence at the University of Memphis. Thank you for your support of Memphis Wesley!

AFRICA UNIVERSITY

James H. Salley, Associate Vice Chancellor for Institutional Advancement

In 2019, Africa University's story was one of resourcefulness, steadfast investment and ministry growth.

Thank you, Bishop William McLilly, the Cabinet and the committed lay and clergy leaders who nurture vitality in the local congregations of the Memphis Conference, for all that you do to affirm the United Methodist connection and global mission. The gracious support of the Memphis Conference resulted in an 80 percent investment of the asking to the Africa University Fund apportionment in 2019. Thank you for your ongoing prayers and gifts.

Your generosity helps Africa University to educate and equip leaders who think for themselves, are contextually relevant and have a passion to serve. Since opening in 1992, Africa University has trained more than 9,000 graduates who lead and serve across sub-Saharan Africa and beyond. These young people are responsible and responsive leaders who offer the best of themselves in serving the needs of their communities.

Institutional Update:

- Africa University has an annual student population of around 2,800 with 25-30 African nations represented in the student body each year.
- The university's three colleges operate as centers for teaching, research, innovation, community engagement and enterprise development. Africa University leads as the only university in Zimbabwe currently accredited to offer online degree programs.
- Students, faculty and alumni contribute ground-breaking solutions to Africa's current challenges. These include graduate programs in migrant and refugee protection, articulated by refugee students, as well as doctoral level training for military chaplains in Africa.
- The university is increasing its use of solar power with the support of the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church. A residence hall for women and a new wing of the student union building - gifted to the university by the Dallas, Texas-based Highland Park United Methodist Church - will be the first solar-powered facilities on the campus.

Dear Colleagues in Ministry:

I am grateful to have one last opportunity to thank you for your moral, prayerful, and material support of the Boston University School of Theology (BUSTH), and also to highlight the promising future of the School as a new Dean joins our stellar faculty, staff, and students in summer 2020 to carry on the mission of the School in partnership with all of you.

BREAKING NEWS:

- **Students:** We continue to increase and celebrate diversity in our student body, creating opportunities for in-depth exchanges and a rich community life.
- **Faculty:** We welcomed two faculty this year; Flípe Maia as Assistant Professor of Theology, and Luis Menendez-Antuna as Assistant Professor of New Testament. Both are extraordinary teachers who delight in working with students.
- **Scholarships:** We continue to offer free tuition to UMC registered candidates for ordained ministry, and to build student scholarships and housing as key priorities. BUSTH also offers leadership fellowships to support students in ethnic, gender, and sexuality studies: Raíces Latinas, Sacred Worth, Howard Thurman, Indigenous Studies, Korean Studies, Women in Leadership, and African Studies.
- **Two new Programs:** Faith and Ecological Justice (FEJ) and Raíces Latinas Program in Theology, Leadership, and Research (RL). FEJ leads programs to build ecological awareness, theological research, church collaborations, and community activism in ecological justice. RL sponsors programs to expand Latin American and Latinx theological study and research, and to enhance the leadership of students, young people, and leaders in Latino/Latina communities.
- **Online Lifelong Learning:** We have launched an exciting new program, offering online mini-courses, workshops, and reading groups for professional and spiritual enrichment.

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- Theology and the Arts Initiatives: Exhibits highlight sacred spaces in Boston; wilderness photography; a 1619 visual lament of 400+ years of slavery; voices and faces of Columbia; and paintings of a gay man struggling with the church.
- Campaign: Our BUSTH development campaign concluded with the raising of \$29.4 million to support students, faculty, and vital programs.
- Website and Viewbook: Check out our new BUSTH website (www.bu.edu/sth) and Viewbook.

PARTNERING FOR MINISTRY AND TRANSFORMATION:

- Creative Callings: In partnership with local churches, we seek to create “a culture of call.”
- Engagement with the UMC: Many of our students are delegates, volunteers, and singers in General Conference 2020.
- Continuing Scholar Program: BUSTH courses are open to alums and local clergy for small lifelong learning fees.
- Doctor of Ministry: The DMin in Transformational Leadership flourishes with lively student cohorts that are broadly ecumenical, culturally diverse, and global. The model includes intensives, online courses, and faculty mentoring.
- Religion and Conflict Transformation Clinic: The Clinic provides internships in local churches and organizations that foster just peacebuilding.
- Travel seminars: Immersion journeys open worlds to students in the borderlands of Arizona and Mexico, Cuba, Peru, Israel-Palestine, Civil Rights landmarks, and centers for ecological-spiritual renewal.
- Ecumenical partnerships: We now have four denominational Communities of Learning: Wesleyan/Methodist, Episcopal/Anglican, United Church of Christ, and Unitarian Universalist.
- Partnership with Hebrew College: Together we are able to enrich interreligious learning through joint courses and public events, and also co-sponsor The Journal of Interreligious Studies and the State of Formation for emerging leaders.

TAKING ACTION GLOBALLY AND LOCALLY:

- Campus action: Work to improve accessibility and sustainability. BUSTH is the first certified Green School in BU and is active in the Green Seminary Initiative. We have also been named as one of the “Seminaries that Change the World.”
- Internships in global service and peacemaking: Students participate in apprenticeship ministries across the world.

COMMITMENT TO JUSTICE:

- Faculty and students have been active in UMCOR efforts to support victims of hurricanes and fires, and in collaborative services to support people suffering the consequences of immigration practices, disability inequities, or racial violence.
- In Town Hall meetings, the community has deep conversations on issues that divide, seeking to develop capacities for relating across differences and to create a community based on the dignity of all.

BUSTH looks to the future. We celebrate transformational leaders of the United Methodist Church, who love with their whole hearts and follow Jesus Christ with their whole lives. Your legacy and witness give us hope and courage for the future.

CANDLER SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY - 2020 UMC Annual Conference Report

Since our founding in 1914, **Candler School of Theology at Emory University** has educated more than 10,000 students, shaping thoughtful, principled, and courageous leaders who are dedicated to transforming the world in the name of Jesus Christ.

This is especially important to note amid the current shifts in our denomination. It is an honor and a privilege for Candler to be one of 13 official seminaries of The United Methodist Church. Yet true to the Methodist tradition of ecumenical

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openness, Candler has enthusiastically welcomed the entire Wesleyan family to our community for generations. Faculty, staff, and students from the AME Church, the AMEZ Church, the CME Church, Free Methodists, and have been a vital part of shaping Candler and our mission. This diversity has been a wonderful gift and a rich blessing. As we move forward, we will continue to invite and welcome those from all expressions of the Wesleyan tradition. Indeed, we will continue to welcome all those who follow Jesus Christ.

This year, Candler has continued to strengthen our deep commitment to alleviating student debt and promoting financial literacy. In 2018-2019, we awarded \$6.3 million in financial aid, with 100 percent of master of divinity (MDiv) students receiving support and financial coaching. In fall 2019, we announced a major expansion of our financial aid program to include full-tuition scholarships for all MeDiv students who are certified candidates for ordained ministry in The United Methodist Church, and new merit scholarships covering 75% of tuition for qualifying MDiv students who identify as pan-Wesleyan, and those pursuing chaplaincy through Candler's new chaplaincy concentration. In addition, all incoming students in the master of divinity, master of theological studies, and master of religious leadership programs will receive awards covering at least 50% of tuition.

This year also saw the launch of two pilot "formation communities," off-campus student housing that focuses on intentional living and spiritual formation. Students from multiple degree programs applied to take part in these pilot groups. At the start of the year, the housemates created a "rule of life" to guide their days together, emphasizing prayer, fellowship, and celebration. A house chaplain - a Candler faculty member or church leader - supports them and shares in the journey. The ten students who took part this year describe feeling a richer sense of community and deeper connections to God and one another in the midst of their busy lives. It is clear that this fulfills a need for our seminarians, and we eagerly anticipate the program's growth in the coming years.

Candler's student body continues to reflect the diversity and breadth of the Christian faithful, with an enrollment of 470 from 12 countries and 38 states, with 40 percent people of color (U.S.) and a median age of 27 among MDivs. Students represent 42 denominations, with 45% of all students and 50% of MDivs coming from the Methodist family.

We offer six single degrees and ten dual degrees pairing theology with bioethics, business, international development, law, public health, and social work. Our Doctor of Ministry degree is 90 percent online students can remain in their places of ministry while completing their degrees.

Candler draws strength and inspiration from its relationship with The United Methodist Church. Our ability to fulfill our mission of educating faithful and creative leaders for the church's ministries throughout the world depends upon your prayers, partnership, and support. Thank you for the countless ways you advance this vital ministry in the life of our denomination. We invite you to visit us in person or online at candler.emory.edu.

DUKE UNIVERSITY DIVINITY SCHOOL

L. Gregory Jones, Dean

Dean L. Gregory Jones, Dean of the Divinity School and Ruth W. and A. Morris Williams Jr. Distinguished Professor of Theology and Christian Ministry, had his term as dean extended for a full five years through 2023.

The Duke Endowment awarded Duke Divinity School a \$12 million grant in support of DDS's three core priorities and traditions: THriving communities enlivened by healthy congregations and gifted pastors, embodied wisdom through rigorous intellectual vitality, and creative institutions that inspire imaginative and transformative leadership including the Thriving Communities Fellowship program, which will provide 52 new full-tuition scholarships over the next four years.

Duke Divinity School launched the Duke Divinity: Black Pastoral Leadership Collaboration which will draw on original research in Black church traditions and historical examples of effective Black church leadership to train and build networks of effective leaders for the Black church of today and the future. The collaboration will be led by the Rev. David Emmanuel Goatley, research professor of theology and Black church studies and director of the Office of Black Church Studies at Duke Divinity School.

In 2019, Duke Divinity School welcomed 215 new students from 33 different states and seven other countries, including Canada, Malaysia, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand and Zimbabwe. The Master of Theological Studies (M.T.S.) and Master of Arts in Christian Practice (M.A.C.P.) degree programs received record enrollments of 35 students and 22 students respectively. The Master of Theology (Th.M., 14 students), Doctor of Ministry (D.Min., 20 students), and Doctor of Theology (Th.D., 4 students) all had strong enrollment. The D.Min. program was named the top online program by

TheBestSchools.org. Duke Divinity's new Certificate in Theology and Health Care will enroll 8 students, all of whom are fellows with the Theology, Medicine, and Culture (T.M.C.) Initiative at the school. The M.T.S. program also includes 8 students who are T.M.C. fellows, for a record year of 16 total fellows. The M.Div. degree program gained 110 new students, with minority students comprising more than 32 percent of the incoming M.Div. class, and Black students comprising 18 percent of the incoming M. Div. class. Female students made up 44 percent of incoming M.Div. students, while males were 56 percent.

Two new faculty members, Brent Strawn and Brett McCarty, joined the DDS faculty in July 2019. Strawn, Professor of Old Testament, is an ordained elder in the North Georgia Conference. Strawn has a secondary appointment as a Professor of Law at Duke University School of Law. Prior to joining the Duke faculty, Strawn taught at Candler School of Theology at Emory University for eighteen years.

McCarty, Assistant Research Professor of Theological Ethics, is a theological ethicist whose work centers on questions of faithful action within health care. He is associate director of the Theology, Medicine, and Culture Initiative at Duke Divinity School, and he holds a joint appointment in the School of Medicine's Department of Population Health Sciences.

Randy Maddox, William Kellon Quick Professor of Wesleyan and Methodist Studies, general editor of the Wesley Works Editorial Project, and elder in the Dakotas Conference, retires at the end of the 2019-2020 academic year.

The Hispanic-Latino/a Preaching Initiative is currently in its fifth year of providing high quality theological education to current and aspiring Hispanic-Latino/a ministers. 21 students from multiple denominations are taking courses with us this year.

The Lilly Endowment has also awarded grants to Duke Divinity School to coordinate initiatives on "Thriving in Ministry" and "Thriving Congregations" across the United States.

Duke Divinity School has a partnership with Huntingdon College and Virginia Wesleyan University to create streamlined admissions process and private campus events in order to better equip students from those institutions with a calling to serve the church. In an effort to expand access for quality theological formation to students, pastors, and lay leaders in

the Nashville Episcopal Area, DDS is also partnering with the Turner Center at Martin Methodist College to offer theological training for innovative and entrepreneurial ministries.

RUST COLLEGE OF HOLLY SPRINGS, MISSISSIPPI

Established in 1866 by the Freedmen's Aid Society of the Methodist Church on a former slave auction site. Rust is the oldest one of 11 Historically Black Colleges and Universities established after the Civil War by the Methodist Church still in existence today serving more than 1,000 students annually from Mississippi, 22 states and 4 foreign countries. Rust's Mission continues to be in tune with the church's overall philosophy - *doing no harm, doing good and staying in love with Jesus Christ* as we serve the young people who look to Rust as their bridge to a better tomorrow through education.

Rust College Religious Life is a diverse community providing the administration, faculty, staff and students sacred space to be fellow travelers on a journey of faith that leads to transformation of the individual and the world. The Office of the Chaplain oversees religious life activities, coordinates training for student ministers, and provides counseling for administration, faculty, staff, and students.

Informed by Christian tradition, Rust College religious life strives to be an ambassador for Jesus Christ to a diverse higher education community. Grounded in the Wesleyan tradition, religious life is the place where *"Tomorrow's Leaders are Students Today."* Students who *will be and do "all the good they can, by all the means they can, in all the ways they can, in all the places they can, at all the times they can to all the people they can, for as long as they can."*

Highlights for 2018-2019 year include:

- The College ended the 2018-2019 fiscal year with a balanced budget for the 53rd consecutive year.
- Rust College received a \$141,000 Grant from the Lettie Pate Whitehead Foundation to support needy students seeking financial assistance.

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- Algernon Sydney Sullivan Foundation provided a grant of \$10,000 to the Rust College General Scholarship Fund.
- Rust College received a \$65,000 Grant from the Robert M. Hearin Support Foundation in support of the General Scholarship Fund.
- Rust College's Associate Professor of Education, Dr. Wonso White Hayes, was the recipient of the Higher Education Appreciation Day - Working for Academic Excellence (HEADWAE) Award.
- Rust College received a grant for \$80,000 from the Hearin Foundation to support needy students seeking financial aid.
- Mr. Mark Ridge, Instructor in Humanities, received the Humanities Teacher of the Year award.
- Kasim Burton, Rockford, Illinois native, sophomore majoring in Mathematics was the winning recipient of a \$10,000 scholarship from the Lockheed Martin Corporation.
- Makayela Boulden, Government Administration, major Columbus, Mississippi native was selected as 2019 White House HBCU Competitive Scholar.
- The Rust College Lady Bearcats Basketball team ranked 24 in the country and was invited to participate in the First National Championship in over 30 years but halted by the Coronavirus outbreak.
- Our frugal fiscal practices continue to keep us financially sound. For the last 50 plus years, Rust College has had a policy of only building "debt-free" non-income producing buildings. As a result of this policy, Rust has long term debts less than \$1.5 million related to residential hall construction and renovations in 1990. We actively recruit foundations, corporations, alumni and friends for scholarship grants to help underwrite the tuition cost of our students who must have financial support to get and stay in school. Our textbook-use-system assists us in keeping our tuition and fees to a minimum. For example, in 2013 tuition, room, board, books and fees totaled \$12,150 annually. In 2018 the total cost is \$14,200 which amounts to an increase of only \$2,050 over a five-year period.

As you, our friends of the United Methodist Church, continue to uphold your promise of educational opportunity established many years ago, we, the members of the Rust College family, will uphold the promise made by our founder, Rev. A.C. McDonald in 1866, "to do not house work" but will work to build men and women morally, spiritually and academically. We are thankful to you for your prayers and financial support. Your continued support is essential as we endeavor to build a stronger legacy for this generation and those in years to come who will look to Rust and our great church for higher educational opportunities. The College expresses thanks for the dedication and leadership of the following Trustees from the Memphis Annual Conference: Mr. Gary Shorb, Rev. Dr. Deborah B. Smith, Dr. Cora Norman, Dr. Cynthia Bond Hopson, and Bishop William T. McAllilly.

UNITED THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

For nearly 150 years, United Theological Seminary in Dayton, OH, has been preparing faithful, fruitful leaders to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

Students

In the Fall 2019 semester, United equipped **459** women and men for leadership in the Church, including **272 masters' students** and **187 doctoral students**. An ecumenical community of many denominations, races and nationalities, United welcomed students from **11 countries, 42 states, and 37 denominations**, with the student body comprised of **49% African American, 42% Caucasian, and 10% ethnic/racial minorities**. The Seminary prepared **165 Course of Study students** and served **36 students** through the Hispanic Christian Academy, a 3-year Spanish online course of ministry program for Hispanic/Latino lay pastors and leaders. Altogether, approximately 660 students followed God's call through United Theological Seminary.

Alumni/ae

United graduates are making an impact in their communities as they spread the Good News.

- **88%** of alumni/ae are currently employed in or retired from ministry
- **70%** serve in local parishes
- **Rev. Dr. Brad Kalajainen** (DMin '99) received the 2019 Effective Ministry Award for his transformative leadership of Cornerstone UMC in Grand Rapids, MI.
- **Rev. Dr. James Bushfield** (MDiv '79, DMin '92) received the 2019 Distinguished Alumnus Award for his leadership and ministry in the Indiana Conference of the UMC.

- **Rev. Dr. Sandra Coley** (DMin '14) received the Outstanding Doctor of Ministry Award for her advocacy of organ donation among African American communities.

New at United

United introduced a 36-hour **Master of Arts (MA)** degree, designed for those who wish to earn a degree while completing the requirements for **Advanced Course of Study** in pursuit of ordination in The United Methodist Church. The MA program is available fully online, on-campus or in a combination.

United continues to offer innovative learning through its **Live Interactive Virtual Education (LIVE) environment** introduced in 2018. In the first year, 59 students participated in LIVE courses, connecting with classmates on campus in Dayton, OH, and across the country by attending classes in real-time via simultaneous webcast.

Becoming Debt-Free

United remains committed to becoming debt-free by the seminary's 150th anniversary on October 11, 2021. Thanks to the support of generous donors, United has received more than \$2.5 million toward its goal of raising \$4 million to "burn the mortgage." Becoming debt-free as an institution will enable United to focus on generating income for scholarships that lighten the load of student debt for seminarians.

3. Native American Ministries Sunday - April 18, 2021

Reminds the church of the gifts and contributions made by Native Americans to our society. One-half of the offerings remain in the Annual Conference to be administered by the Committee on Missions with the remainder divided between the Board of Higher Education and Ministry for scholarships for Native Americans attending United Methodist Schools of Theology and the General Board of Global Ministries for the Native American Urban Initiative.

4. Peace with Justice Sunday - May 30, 2021

Through programs to enrich parenting skills and efforts to raise corporate consciousness to the need for "forever homes," many children will benefit and thrive.

Western Kentucky Family Services, Inc.

A Christian ministry committed to providing a safe haven to foster children until they reach permanency. Both basic and therapeutic (children who are either medically fragile or who have severe acting out behaviors due to abuse and/or neglect) foster care are provided within the Purchase Region. The agency facilitates foster care adoptions and conducts international home studies for persons wanting to adopt children from other countries.

18. Memphis United Methodist Neighborhood Centers - December 5, 2021

Supports the work of the Neighborhood Centers in Memphis - a ministry of presence and support among the poor and marginalized.

19. Lenten Hunger Offering - February 17 to April 4, 2021

Taken during the Lenten season or another time during the year chosen by each congregation. Supports lenten hunger ministries including Mexico feeding ministry, Project Peanut Butter and Our Father's House. His home church was Madison Heights Methodist where he was baptized as an infant, nurtured in the faith, professed Jesus Christ as his Savior and Lord, and was recommended for ordination.

Al graduated from Central High School (Memphis) and attended Rice University majoring in petroleum engineering before surrendering to a dramatic call to preach. He was a graduate of Millsaps College (BA), Emory University (BDiv/MDiv), Columbia Theological Seminary (MTh), and Emory University (DMin).

While at Millsaps, Al did student preaching in Methodist churches across Mississippi. One Sunday night he was napping on a Greyhound bus, returning to Jackson from south Mississippi. There were only two open seats when a young woman, named Betty, decided to sit down in the one next to Al because he was wearing a nice black suit and had a Bible on his lap. When he awoke there began a romance that became a loving marriage of 45 years.

While at Emory, Al was in Charles Gerkin's first class of Clinical Pastoral Training at Grady Hospital (He went on to complete four full terms while also doing graduate study towards a Ph.D.). Al also served during that busy time as an associate pastor, first at St. Paul Methodist, and then at the fast-growing Mary Branan Methodist, both in Atlanta. In 1962 he was led by God to discontinue his Ph.D. studies and ministry in Atlanta to return to preach in the Memphis Conference. He earned a Doctor of Ministry degree in 1985 with a thesis-project in innovative pastoral care.

For 44 years Al lovingly served churches in a wide variety of contexts for the Memphis Conference of the United Methodist Church. He was known as a gifted: pulpit preacher, pastor, counselor, administrator, community worker, storyteller, and family man. Al was loved by his parishioners and held longer-than-normal pastorates as a result. His appointments included: Lebanon (Paducah), Epworth (Memphis), Underwood (Memphis), Martin-First, Forest Heights (Jackson), Lexington-First, Mullins (Memphis), Mayfield-First.

When Al retired, he and Betty built a house in Mt. Juliet, Tenn. in order to be near Sally and her family. During retirement Al was called on three times to bring steady, healing, and forward-looking ministry to unusual interim situations in the Tennessee Conference. He served a total of 50 years in appointed ministry.

Al also mentored numerous persons into the ordained ministry and was a confidant and counselor to many clergy over the years.

Al embodied a Methodist Christian. He held in creative tension: head and heart; personal and social; grace and holy living; traditional faith and experimental discipleship. He was a pragmatic-visionary with egalitarian values, all centered in the Living Christ.

He was widely known for his easy going personality, his empathic pastoral skills, and his calm presence in a crisis. However, he was not afraid to speak truth to power, when needed, whether that was in ecclesial or secular contexts. Al was a respecter of, and champion for, all persons.

Throughout the years Al's renaissance talents helped him lead in diverse ways beyond his local appointments: winner of multiple honors from the YMCA; coordinator of missions with migrant workers, Kentucky Council of Churches; president of a local Lions Club; Gray-Y football coach; chairperson of conference Social Concerns during the turbulent late 1960s and early 1970s; first director of the North Memphis Action Committee; conference Statistician (2 quadrennium); chairperson of conference Stewardship; chairperson of conference Worship (2 quadrennium); director of several summer camps at Lakeshore; community activist; and board member of numerous organizations.

While he was pastoring the flock and serving the community, Al was also a devoted and loving husband and father. He would do anything for his family, and he did! There are not enough words to adequately describe the amazing love he gave us.

In his spare time, Al liked playing softball and golf, boating, traveling, and tinkering. His amazing skills allowed him to fix, design, and make all kinds of things.

How Al was able to do all that he did is a mystery involving a compassionate heart, a keen mind, dedication, integrity, stamina of both spirit and body, a powerful sense of humor, and a drive for living that was second to none.

Al was preceded in death by his beloved wife, the brilliant and gracious Betty Barksdale Doyle. They were inseparable in life and their abiding love still unites them as they rest in Christ awaiting resurrection.

Survivors include a son, Lloyd A. Doyle, III (Clare), pastor at White House UMC; a daughter, Sally D. Sharpe (Neil), Senior Editor of Ministry Resources and Abingdon Women at Abingdon Press; son [in-law], Neil Sharpe, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, Mt. To "What happens when we die?" he answered: "God will accommodate us appropriately, according to God's gracious will. That's good enough for me." Al Doyle trusted in God's grace in all things. He lived and died sharing that faith with others through Christ-like discipleship. May God find us faithful.

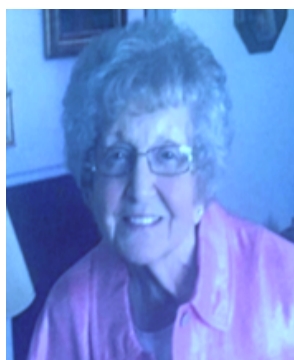

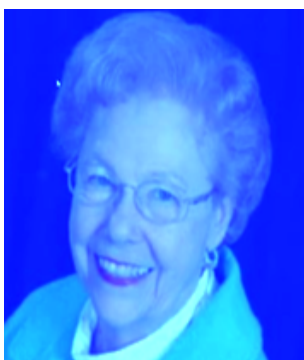
James R Mulroy

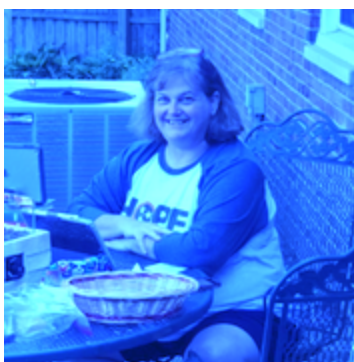

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Memphis Conference Treasurer's Office (a nonprofit organization) (the Conference), which comprise the statements of financial position as of December 31, 2019 and 2018, and the related statements of activities, cash flows, and functional expenses for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Memphis Conference Treasurer's Office as of December 31, 2019 and 2018,

and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Change in Accounting Principle

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, in 2018 the Conference adopted Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-14, *Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958), Presentation of Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Entities*. As a result, the unrestricted net assets as of January 1, 2018 in the amount of \$14,039,736 (after a restatement of \$(316,190) and a prior period restatement of \$514,840 – see note 9) is now classified on the financial statements as net assets without donor restrictions. And the restricted net assets as of January 1, 2018 in the amount of \$17,920,492 (after a reclassification of \$316,190 and a prior period restatement of \$15,002,165 – see note 9) is now classified on the financial statements as net assets with donor restrictions. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Note 1 Nature of Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

A. Nature of Operations

The Memphis Conference (the Conference) is a regional body of The United Methodist Church comprised of the lay members, clergy, and 400+ churches in West Tennessee and West Kentucky. The Conference is primarily responsible for all the ministries that are jointly provided by and for United Methodists in its geographic area. The Conference administers Conference operating and program funds that are received from churches, boards and agencies, and individuals of the Conference in accordance with the budget and other directives of the Conference, the respective board and agencies and donors.

B. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

C. Financial Statement Presentation

The Conference follows the recommendations contained in the *Presentation of Financial Statements, Not-For-Profit Entities* topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification. Under those provisions, net assets and revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the absence or existence and nature of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:

Net Assets Without Donor Restriction: Net assets that are not subject to or are no longer subject to donor imposed stipulations.

Net Assets With Donor Restriction: Net assets whose use is limited by donor-imposed time and/or purpose restrictions.

D. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

E. Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Conference defines its cash and cash equivalents to include cash on hand, demand deposits, and commercial paper and other investments with initial maturities of three months or less whether those amounts are unrestricted or restricted.

F. Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in changes in net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized. However, if a donor contributes an investment required to be held in perpetuity, gains and losses on the investment are subject to the same permanent restriction unless the donor explicitly states otherwise (currently the Conference has no such investment).

G. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of financial assets and liabilities is measured according to the *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification. Fair value is required to be evaluated and adjusted according to the following valuation techniques.

Level 1 - Fair value is determined using quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2 - Fair value is determined using quoted market prices in active markets for similar assets and liabilities.

Level 3 - Fair value is determined using unobservable market prices in a market that is typically inactive.

H. Income Taxes

The Conference is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

I. Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable include apportionments received after year-end for the budget years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018. No allowance for doubtful collections has been recorded.

J. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are carried at cost if purchased and fair market value if donated. Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, excluding land, which are 3 to 40 years. Depreciation expenses for the years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018 were \$18,062 and \$18,061, respectively. Property includes land, building and improvements at the Conference headquarters in Jackson TN, as well as closed churches whose ownership was transferred to the Conference at the time of the churches' closing.

K. Donated Services

Contributed services are reflected in the financial statements at the fair value of the services received only when those services either (1) create or enhance nonfinancial assets, or (b) require specialized skills that are provided by individuals possessing those skills and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. Unpaid volunteers make contributions of time in various administrative and program functions. The Conference has not valued these donations.

L. Revenue and Support

Contributions are received and recorded as contributions with or without donor restrictions depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, net assets with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as support without donor restrictions.

The primary source of support is tithings received from local churches in the Conference. Tithings expire at the end of each calendar year and, therefore, have been recorded as unrestricted support. Contributions and Other Revenue are primarily receipts by programs that have external sources of revenue such as registration fees or reimbursements.

M. Functional Allocation of Expenses

Expenses are charged directly to program, management and general, or fundraising based on a combination of specific identification and allocation by management.

N. Prepaid Items

Certain payments to vendors reflect costs applicable to future accounting periods and are recorded as prepaid items.

O. Recently Adopted Accounting Standard

Effective January 1, 2019, the Conference changed its accounting methods for revenue recognition as a result of implementing the requirements in the Financial Accounting Standard Board's Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 606, Revenue from Contracts with Customers. The new revenue recognition guidance requires the recognition of revenue when promised goods or services are transferred to customers in an amount that reflects the consideration to which the Conference expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services. The Conference adopted the requirements of the new revenue recognition guidance as of January 1, 2019, utilizing the cumulative effect transition method. The adoption of the new

revenue recognition guidance did not have any material effect on the Conference's financial statement.

In August 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-14, *Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958), Presentation of Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Entities*. This Update addresses the complexity and understandability of net asset classification, deficiencies in information about liquidity and availability of resources, the lack of consistency in the type of information provided about expenses and investment return between not-for-profit entities, and misunderstandings about and opportunities to enhance the utility of the statement of cash flows. ASU 2016-14 is effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2017 and, therefore, is adopted by the Conference during the fiscal year ending December 31, 2018. A key change required by ASU 2016-14 is the net asset classes used in these financial statements. Amounts previously reported as unrestricted net assets are now reported as net assets without donor restrictions and amounts previously reported as temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets are now reported as net assets with donor restrictions. A footnote on liquidity and availability of financial resources has also been added (Note 5).

As a result of the adoption of ASU 2016-14, the unrestricted net assets as of December 31, 2017 in the amount of \$14,039,736 (after a restatement of \$(316,190) and a prior period adjustment of \$514,840— see note 9) is now classified on the financial statements as net assets without donor restrictions. And the restricted net assets as of December 31, 2017 in the amount of \$17,920,492 (after a restatement of \$316,190 and a prior period adjustment of \$15,002,165— see note 9) is now classified on the financial statements as net assets with donor restrictions.

For financial instrument valued using level 3 inputs (PACT investment), there is no change to the balance of the investment during the fiscal years 2019 and 2018. The PACT investment is valued based on the Surplus Note and Cash Payment Calculations provided by United Methodist Property and Casual Trust as of December 31, 2012, which is the most recent information available. There is no change in the valuation technique for PACT investment during the fiscal years 2019 and 2018.

Note 4 Concentration of Risk

At December 31, 2019 and 2018, all of the Conference's bank accounts were fully insured by Federal Depository Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and by the financial institution's pledged collateral.

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Note 5 Liquidity and Availability of Financial Assets

As of December 31, 2019 and 2018, \$16,859,244 and \$10,280,933 (respectively) of the financial assets are subject to donor or other contractual restrictions that make them unavailable for general expenditure within one year of the balance sheet date. The Conference has a goal to maintain financial assets, which consist of cash and cash equivalents, on hand to meet 60 days of normal operating expenses, which are, on average, approximately \$1,665,460 and \$1,481,216 for the years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018, respectively. As part of the Conference's liquidity management, it has a policy to structure its financial assets to be available as its general expenditures, liabilities, and other obligations come due.

Note 6 Pension Plans

The Conference provides pension benefits for clergy serving churches in the Memphis Conference under Episcopal appointment, and full-time permanent staff of the Conference through various retirement plans. All plans are multi-employer plans administered by Wespath. Wespath operates under the authority of the church's General Conference and implements the plans in accordance with plan documents. Pension benefits for clergy are a combination of defined benefit and defined contribution plans. Pension benefits for Conference lay staff are all defined contribution plans. The various retirement plans are listed below:

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Defined Benefit Pension Plans:

Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP-DB):

CRSP is a multi-employer 403(b) retirement plan that provides pension coverage to eligible clergy. CRSP is both a defined benefit plan, which provides benefits based on years of credited service and a defined contribution plan, which provides a retirement account balance established and funded by the Conference. Effective January 1, 2014, contributions to the defined benefit plan are actuarially determined.

Supplement One to CRSP (Pre-1982):

Pre-1982 is a multi-employer 403(b) defined benefit plan for Conference clergy entering service prior to 1982. General Conference 2000 required each annual conference to adopt a formal funding plan to retire the Conference pre-1982 pension obligations. The Conference's Pre-1982 plan has been fully funded. The Conference approves a minimum distribution (past service rate) each year for participants in the Pre-1982 plan, based on a recommendation by the Conference Board of Pensions. The PSR for the year ended December 31, 2019 was \$624 for pre-1982 service years, which is .90% of the Conference average compensation respectively.

Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP)

MPP covers clergy who served from 1982 through 2006. It is a multi-employer defined contribution plan, but differs from a true defined contribution plan in that upon retirement, participants must annuitize at least 65% of their account balances, and the Conference is responsible for funding the annuities should the need arise. Upon annuitization, the monthly benefit becomes a defined benefit.

The expected rate of return on Pension Plans' assets is based on a long-term estimate for the fund from Wespath's Investment department.

Asset Allocation

As of January 1, 2020, Pre-1982 Plan account (Non-DBSM) assets were invested with a target mix of assets: 28.5% US Equity Fund, 24.5% International Equity Fund, 33.6% Fixed Income Fund and 13.4% Inflation Protection Fund (actual allocation may vary slightly). The targeted allocation for plan assets as of December 31, 2020 is a new mix of assets: 26.4% US Equity Fund, 22.6% International Equity Fund, 36.4% Fixed Income Fund and 14.6% Inflation Protection Fund (actual allocation may vary slightly), as decided by the Fiduciary Committee in 2020.

Wespath invests CRSP-DB assets in the Multiple Asset Fund (MAF). The MAF is market-to-market fund with a target mix of asset classes of 10% Inflation Protection Fund, 25% Fixed Income Fund, 35% U.S. Equity Fund and 30% International Fund (actual allocation may vary slightly).

Assets supporting MPP Annuities are invested at Wespath with an overall target of 56% fixed income, 33% equity, and 11% alternative investments (actual allocation may vary slightly). The specific funds employed are the Fixed Income Fund, the Inflation Protection Fund, the Positive Social Purpose Lending Fund, the U.S. Equity Fund, the International Equity Fund and the Special Opportunities Fund.

Defined Contribution Pension Plans:

United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP):

The UMPIP is a multi-employer 403(b) defined contribution plan providing eligible clergy and employees of the Conference with retirement savings. Conference employees and clergy may contribute up to the dollar limits set by current Internal Revenue Service regulations under both pre-tax and after-tax elections. The Conference makes a 6% contribution to the plan for part-time clergy. The Conference contributes an amount equal to 9% of its eligible lay employee's compensation to the plan. If the employee contributes 3% to the plan, then the Conference will match with an additional 3% for a total contribution of 12%. During the fiscal year ended December 31, 2019, the Conference contributed \$113,299 to the UMPIP and there was no forfeiture during the year.

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Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP-DB)- Defined Contribution:

Effective 1/1/2014, contributions to the defined contribution part of the CRSP-DB plan equal 2% of the clergy's monthly compensation, plus a matching contribution of up to 1% of the clergy's compensation, for a maximum of 3%. During the fiscal year ended December 31, 2019, the Conference contributed \$290,046 into the defined contribution part of the CRSP-DB plan and there was no forfeiture during the year.

Note 7 Health Care Plans

Group Insurance Program (GIP)

Starting on January 1, 2017, the Conference contracted with Healthflex and sponsored a fully-insured group insurance program.

A liability (Accumulated Postretirement Benefit Obligation) has been recognized representing the underfunded status of the Conference's GIP in the amount of \$10,035,961 and \$9,530,054 as of December 31, 2019 and 2018, respectively.

Note 9 Beginning Net Assets

During the fiscal year ended December 31, 2018, there were restatements made to net assets as of January 1, 2018 due to the following:

Reclassification

In the financial statements for fiscal year ended December 31, 2017, \$316,190 was erroneously classified as unrestricted net assets. This amount should have been classified as restricted net assets. Therefore, a reclassification of the 2017 net assets was made in the 2018 financial statements.

Prior Period Restatement

As of December 31, 2017, actuarial studies show that the Conference's defined benefit pension plans have a total overfunded pension projected benefit obligation of \$15,002,165. This amount is determined as the excess of the fair value of plan assets over the projected pension benefit obligations. The overfunded pension projected benefit obligation of \$15,002,165 was omitted on the financial statements for fiscal year ended December 31, 2017. Therefore, a prior period

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adjustment was made in the 2018 financial statements to increase the restricted net assets as of January 1, 2018 by \$15,002,165.

In addition, the accumulated postretirement benefit obligation was recorded in the 2017 financial statements as \$10,667,299 which is the value determined by an actuarial study for the measurement date of December 31, 2016. A prior period adjustment of \$514,840 was made in current year to restate the 2017 accumulated postretirement benefit obligation as \$10,152,459, which is the value determined by an actuarial study for the measurement date of December 31, 2017.

Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-14, Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958), Presentation of Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Entities

The adoption of ASU 2016-14 resulted in the unrestricted net assets at January 1, 2018 of \$14,039,736 being reclassified on the financial statements as net assets without donor restrictions, and the restricted net assets at January 1, 2018 of \$17,920,492 being reclassified on the financial statements as net assets with donor restrictions.
