This year we followed the lead of our sisters at Key Stewart in Gallatin and held a "Purses with Purpose" project. The project goal focused on serving women in domestic violence shelters throughout our district. Ten units

donated over 120 purses that we then filled with items a woman fleeing a violent situation may need. Most times when a woman can get away, she isn't thinking about packing a suitcase or purse. She just needs to immediately leave when she has a chance.



Women from our district's churches also donated over \$1700 toward purchasing items to fill the purses. Over 55 of our sisters joined together at Key Stewart to fill and bless the purses. The love was palatable!

Prior to our work, we worshiped with our speaker, Rev. Heather Harriss, Associate Pastor at Belmont UMC in Nashville. Her message touched our souls and motivated our action. After our work we fellowshiped together over lunch. It was great to get to know women better in our district.

Some Things You Might Not Know About the Reading Program

- Reports are due by August 15, but you actually have until the end of December to complete your reading. The report is more a report of what members expect to read by year's end rather than what they have read by the middle of August.
- Because of the pandemic, books you read in 2021 and 2022 count toward completion of any of the reading plans.
- Any of the books from the 2015-2022 reading list that you have read in 2021 or 2022 count.
- Some books including the Mission Study books are marked in the Reading Program Catalog as Bonus Books. That means they each count as two books toward any reading plan.
- Faith Talk Podcasts count in the Reading Program too. Listening to two of these podcasts counts as one book. Listening to three podcasts counts as a Bonus Book in the Spiritual Growth Category. If you missed the live Faith Talk podcasts, you can find all of them at <https://uwfaith.org/resources/podcasts/>.
- Children and Youth books counts for adults as well.
- There are three movies that count as books, Just Mercy and The Hate You Give count under the Nurturing for Community category and Pushout counts under the Social Action category.

Ukrainian War Hardships Presentation Held by the Belmont UFW

On May 19, Belmont's United Women in Faith presented a live-streamed presentation from the church featuring three Ukrainian women in conversation with Jane Dubose, ESL teacher and Belmont member.

Sasha Gorkovenko and her friends Oksana and Olesia shared information about how the war in Ukraine is affecting them and their families in Ukraine. Sasha and Olesia have been in Nashville for some time; Oksana arrived, along with her two young children, only recently. Oksana's husband remains in Ukraine, fighting for his country.

The women shared stories about the struggles Ukrainians are facing – constant fear, constant bombing and noise, shortage of every-day needed supplies such as medicines, diapers, feminine hygiene products as well as food.

Belmont UFW has helped Oksana raise funds to purchase needed shoes and clothing for her husband. Oksana's children were with her during the presentation and would not leave their mother's lap or her side – a reminder of the trauma children experience, as well as adults, during separation from family and home.

Financial assistance may be given through our denomination's relief organization – UMCOR.

Hendersonville United Women in Faith Learn about Crazy Crayons

At the June meeting of the Hendersonville First UMC United Women in Faith, circle member Sue Groves presented a program about Crazy Crayons, a project she is promoting locally to recycle used crayons.

Crayons are made from paraffin, a petroleum-based product, thus are not biodegradable. More than 500,000 pounds of crayons are discarded every year, most ending up in our landfills.

The National Crayon Recycle Program recycles unwanted, rejected, broken crayon into new crayons through partnership with Crazy Crayons. This keeps thousands of pounds of waxy sludge out of the landfill and puts fun, uniquely shaped crayons back into the creative hands of children.
